I. Course Goals

- 1. To develop the student's ability to understand, appreciate, and employ the application of music theory, history, and performance styles and techniques as they relate to playing the piano.
- 2. To enhance the student's communication skills through performing and listening to music.
- 3. To help the student develop good practice habits.
- 4. To challenge the student to excel at and surpass his/her pianistic level.
- 5. To encourage the student to see music as a lifelong pursuit, one filled with enthusiasm, self-discipline, and inspiration.

III. Course Requirements

- 1. **PRIVATE APPLIED LESSONS:** Students signed up for one hour of credit will receive a 45-minute lesson each week and will be expected to practice a MINIMUM of one hour per day, five days per week. Students signed up for two credit hours will receive a 60-minute lesson weekly and will be expected to practice a MINIMUM of 10 hours per week. If the student knows he/she is going to miss a lesson, the student should call one of the above phone numbers. Lessons will be made up only in the event of illness, family emergency, or absence because of a college-sponsored event. Absences should be cleared at least 24 hours in advance when possible. Lessons missed by me will be made up.
- 2. **TERM FEE:** The term fee is \$300, waived only for declared majors. The fee is non-refundable after the first lesson is completed. Once the first lesson is taken, the student is liable for the entire fee, whether or not the course is dropped.
- **3. MUSIC:** Students will purchase published copies of all music to be used in this studio.

- **4. PIANO CLASS:** Students will attend a minimum of two group performance classes during the term. They will perform memorized works they are studying and will learn stage performance etiquette.
- **5. RECITALS:** Students will play on a student recital at least once during the term. All music majors will be required to perform on Thursday afternoon departmental recitals a minimum of twice. All minors will be required to perform a minimum of one time. Students will also ATTEND a minimum of three concerts during the term.
- 6. FINAL EXAM: Final exam consists of a memorized performance before a faculty committee. APPLIED MUSIC EXAMS ARE SCHEDULED FOR READING DAY, THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9, 2004. The student will sign up for a specific exam appointment with his/her committee. Majors will perform two selections, and non-majors will perform one. Any student who fails to take the final exam without making other arrangements well in advance with the examination coordinator, Professor David Ramsey, will be given a grade of I (Incomplete) in the course. The examination must be taken early in the next semester, the appropriate fee must be paid, and the term grade will be lowered one
