Director's Note

Opening night of this production, November 11, 1993, is by coincidence the 75th Anniversary of the Armistice of World War I. Nearly one million British soldiers died in the "Great War," and no one was exempt from its effects. The war shadows the story of Jean Brodie, who, like so many women of her generation, lost the man she expected to marry. Women whose lives would have followed predictable paths (in a day when that was viewed as advantageous) were left to find their own way. Denied marriage and motherhood by the war, they were offered emancipation and independence instead. Unprepared for her new life, Jean Brodie created a fascinating individualistic curriculum based on her own personality and prejudices and politics - a "born teacher" who is careless about what she teaches, but is an inspiration nonetheless.

Who's Who

Anna Hoffman (Miss Mackay) is originally from Scotland where she performed in *The King and I* and *Kiss Me Kate*. Anna toured the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico with the Singers and Dancers of Scotland. In Memphis she has been seen in Theatre Memphis' *Brigadoon, Night Must Fall*, and *Anastasia*.

Milton Johnson (Mr. Perry), a freshman from Dallas, TX, is making his McCoy debut. While in high school, Milton appeared in *Romeo and Juliet, Grapes of Wrath, The Taming of the Shrew*, and *Rumors*.

Alison Kamhi (school girl) is in the seventh grade at White Station Junior High and is a familiar face at the McCoy where she has appeared in *A Midsummer Night's Dream, Six Characters in Search of an Author,* and *Cabaret.* Alison has also had numerous roles at Children's Theatre.

Joanne Malin (director) has directed numerous productions at Theatre Memphis and was the founding director of ShoWagon, a professional educational outreach theatre troupe. She has also played twenty-five leading/supporting roles in Memphis in the last thirty years and presently, is a freelance voice and speech teacher and commercial performer.

Carrie O'Dell (Mrs. Campbell/assistant director), a sophomore theatre major from Greeneville, TN, has appeared in the McCoy's *As You Like It* and *Cabaret*. Carrie is a member of the Rhodes Women's Forum.

Cheri Prough (Scenery & Lighting Designer/Technical Director) is a new faculty member at Rhodes. She received her M.F.A. in Design from the University of Texas at Austin and has been a member of the Texas Shakespeare Festival Production Team for the past two years. Most recently, Cheri was the Scenery & Lighting Designer and Technical Director for *Company*.
