Jim Burwinkel (set designer) is a professor of theatre at St. Louis University. He is a scenic and lighting designer whose work has been seen at the Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, The St. Louis Black Repertory Company, and The New Theatre among others, as well as at theatres in Ohio, Massachusetts and Minnesota.

Laura Canon (lighting designer, technical director) is a theatre professor and has designed the lighting for most of the McCoy productions and recently received a Memphis Theatre Award for her outstanding lighting design of J. B.

He worked for several years as an artistic associate with the legendary Vinnette Carroll at her repertory theatre in Fort Lauderdale, FL. As director, choreographer, poet and performer, Mr. Bryce has worked with legendary African American talents such as Al Green, Isaac Hayes, Margaret Danner, Bernice Johnson Reagon, Debbie Allen, Charles Dutton, Nikki Giovanni and Ellen Stewart. He is a native of Richmond, VA, and holds a bachelors degree from LeMoyne-Owen College.
