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Text: *Federal Taxation Individuals*, Pope et al, Prentice Hall, 2012

Course Description: This course deals with the rules and regulations for the taxation of individuals. Emphasis is placed on acquiring a foundational understanding of these rules and the underlying theory of taxation as it exists in the United States. Situational problems, tax return preparation, case research study and tax rulings will be used to meet the course objectives.

Preparation for class meetings: The probability of successful completion of this course will be significantly influenced by the level of your preparation prior to classroom discussion of the chapter material. The instructor expects you to read the text material and attempt to complete the assigned exercises and problems **before coming to class**.

Attendance: Attendance is **mandatory**. Two absences will be allowed. Two additional absences will be allowed for participation in college-sponsored events. Each additional absence will cause a five-point reduction of the final average for the course.

Calculator/Pencil: You are **required** to bring a calculator to class. Also, **ALL WORK** which is turned in for credit must be prepared in pencil.
