



Revitalize Attend a presentation Your Mind: Filmmaker Lewis Klahr

The English department hosted Lewis Klahr and his excellent films. Called the "reigning proponent of cut and paste" by critic J. Hoberman of the Village Voice, master collagist Lewis Klahr has been making films since 1977. He is known for his uniquely idiosyncratic experimental films and cutout animations which have been screened extensively in the United States and Europe. New York's Museum of Modern Art has purchased four of Klahr's films for their permanent collection and curated 3 one person shows with him since 1989. Klahr has also been included in the Biennial Exhibition of the Whitney Museum of American Art (1991 & 1995). His epic cutout animation The Pharaoh's Belt received a special citation for experimental work from the National Society of Film Critics in 1994. From 1995 to 1997 Klahr's shorts (Altair, Lulu & Pony Glass) were included in the New York Film Festival. Lulu was commissioned by Copenhagen's Gronnegards Theater for their critically acclaimed production of Alban Berg's opera that ran in August 1996. Today he is still making films and showing them to those who are lucky enough to see them.

The women's basketball team capped a fine season with a 82-74 quarterfinal win in SCAC Tournament play against Hendrix College Friday, February 25, in Mallory Gymnasium. Junior guard Rachel Hettinger poured in a career high 26 points, and junior forward Taylor Cook added 22, as the Lynx recorded their 16th win of the season, the third most wins in a season in the history of women's basketball at Rhodes.

However, in the semifinal game Rhodes fell to nationally ranked DePauw 82-56. First year guard Ashley Farrell led all Lynx scorers with 14 points, and Rhodes finished the season at 16-10. Cook and Farrell were named second team All-SCAC and Hettinger was voted Honorable Mention. Farrell was also recognized as SCAC Newcomer-of-the-Year.

Next season the Lynx do not lose anyone to graduation, so Head Coach Matt Dean is optimistic about their chances. "If we can continue to grow as a basketball team, I feel like this group is ready to take the next step and win the SCAC," said Dean

Rhodes received huge contributions from sophomores Crystal Jessee, Rene Orth and Amie Cahill. Junior captain Gretchen Bufe also was one of the team's best perimeter shooters. Junior Tracey George, and freshmen Anne Bradshaw, Megan Flatt and Haynes Kleimeyer also return to form a solid nucleus for 2005-06.



Coached by David Norton and assisted by Jane Wells, 2004 was undoubtedly the most successful season in Rhodes Field Hockey history.


Rhodes Field Hockey has always been a member of the Great Lakes Region, but 2004 marked the inaugural season of Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference competition. Throughout the nine week season, Rhodes accumulated fifty percent of the SCAC field hockey Player-of-the-Week Awards, outshining every other school.

Finishing their season with an 11-4 (7-1 SCAC) record, Rhodes earned the No. 1 seed at the SCAC Field Hockey tournament. After defeating host Centre H College in overtime, the Lynx Cats went on to play the University of the South (Sewanee) in the finals of the tournament. Another hard fought overtime battle, Rhodes triumphed over the Tigers to become the first SCAC Champions in Field Hockey history. C

David Norton coached Rhodes Field Hockey for four solid years, transforming a young, timid team K into a Field Hockey powerhouse, now the team to beat in both the SCAC and the Great Lakes Region. E Though his last year as Head Coach, Norton departed from his last game with an SCAC Championship Y Trophy, a number 2 ranking in the Great Lakes Region, the best win-loss record in Rhodes history and SCAC Coach-of-the-Year recognition. Rhodes dominated SCAC all-conference awards, winning Offensive Playerof-the-Year, Newcomer-of-the-year and Coach-ofthe-Year, also naming five players to the 2004 All-SCAC Field Hockey Team. Three other players also earned All-American Recognition.
