speakers karl rove

clarke wise '10



1. What year are you and what is your major?

I am a senior, majoring in Political Science

2. How did you come to be involved with bringing Karl Rove to Rhodes and monitoring his presentation?

Karl Rove has been my political and personal mentor for many years. As a teenager growing up in Central Ohio, I was very involved with the 2000 and 2004 Bush campaigns for President, and I was especially inspired by the genius of Karl Rove as he showed me why politics is important in providing the arena where voters choose whose ideas will shape the country. In the years since those elections, I have been inspired by Karl's unapologetic contributions to the "political battles that are the lifeblood of a democracy", and I made it my goal to bring him to Rhodes College. As I reviewed the list of former speakers at Rhodes,

there seemed to be a definite preference toward more liberal speakers, but I never gave up on my goal, and I wanted to see if Rhodes would really embrace a conservative and sometimes controversial figure. When I presented the idea to the Rhodes Lecture Board, it was obvious that I would need to find a co-sponsor to help underwrite the engagement fee. At that point, I contacted someone I had met at the College Republican National Convention, a representative from the Young America's Foundation. When I told him about my success in launching the College Republican chapter at Rhodes and that there are several politically conservative students here, their organization committed to co-sponsor the event.

3. What was the best part about the experience?

For me, bringing Karl Rove here and having the event be such an enormous success has been the highlight of my time at Rhodes. It was a privilege for me to personally host Karl during his two days in Memphis-serving as his driver and host, but mostly just spending time with him. Karl agreed to attend my Senior Seminar class, taught by Professor Nelson, and he spent that entire time with our small class-sharing personal stories and taking questions. I was inspired by his intellect, his warmth, and his humor. The timing of his visit couldn't have been better as Republican Scott Brown had just been elected the new Senator from Massachusetts the previous night, so there was much to talk about and celebrate for us conservatives!

Another highlight was seeing the auditorium completely filled with attendees, standing room only! I was pleased at the respectful nature of the Rhodes community, and I was so happy that this man who had a front row seat to history was speaking candidly and unapologetically to us about "the joy of a life committed to the conservative cause."

Lastly, I can't thank Karl enough for staying after the speech to attend a small reception for the Rhodes College Republicans. As a former Chair of the National College Republicans, he understood our mission and our challenge in being relevant on a liberal arts campus. He encouraged us to remain vigilant in our efforts and to remember the importance of advancing democracy with honor, integrity, and skill-even in arenas where conservative principles are under assault. Karl posed for photos with everyone in attendance, and when I mailed the pictures to him later, he personalized and autographed each photo. After leaving Rhodes, Karl wrote handwritten notes to many people who played a role during his time at Rhodes. I am proud and honored to know Karl Rove.

4. Why do you think it is important to have speakers such as Karl Rove come to Rhodes?

I think it is important for Rhodes to host speakers such as Karl Rove because our community has an obligation to present conservative viewpoints as often as we present liberal viewpoints. As I said in my introduction, "fostering a sense of diversity means presenting all sides" and not always the traditional left agenda. I truly believe Rhodes College has an obligation to honor the Liberal Arts tradition of freedom of expression, and allowing speakers such as Karl Rove represent an excellent way to support those traditions. Based on the attendance, positive feedback, and questions about who the next conservative speaker will be to come to Rhodes, I am confident that the Karl Rove event has set a very positive precedent for conservative speakers at Rhodes College.

Soon after, I learned that she would be coming to visit Rhodes later in the Fall, and I was offered the opportunity to do a follow-up interview with her as part of the program that day.

3. What was the best part about the experience?

The best part of the experience for me was just participating in the event. I want to be a professional journalist, and I felt truly encouraged by the administration to let me be involved. I also loved seeing how much everybody enjoyed the evening.

4. Why do you think it is important to have speakers such as Charlaine Harris come to Rhodes?

I think it's great for the students to hear from someone who started out in the same place as them and has gone on to be so successful.

Halley Johnson – Lipstick on Your Collar

1. How did you get involved in Lipstick?

CASA



I am a Junior Psychology major from Charlotte, North Carolina. My interest (albeit the area that is most difficult for me, go figure) is psychophysiology and the biological basis of behavior, (in addition to neuropharmacology, or the effect of drugs on the brain and the nervous system). I suppose I enjoy taking classes that are difficult for me because I simply find the material fascinating and I would rather take classes that I love and may be difficult, rather than sitting around bored day after day! The plan right now is to take the LSAT in February and go to law school for bioethics and health care administration law.

As for CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)- CASA of Memphis is a member of the National Court Appointed Special Advocates Association and an active member of the Tennessee CASA Association. We have been in operation since 1986. We are a 501(c)3 non-profit social service agency and are governed by a board of directors. There are 7 full-time CASA employees who support more than 150 volunteers and about 4 full time interns- one being myself. I was trained for 32 hours on child development, child abuse law, the juvenile court, and how to advocate for abused and neglected children; and was sworn in as an official "Friend of the Court" by a magistrate of Juvenile Court this summer. CASA volunteers are appointed to cases by judges of the court. Once assigned a case, I begin to get to know the child and investigate everything to do with the child's life. I interview and gather information from teachers, social workers, mental health providers, extended family, and any others who might hold valuable information to the child's background and needs. Upon completion of the investigation, I compile all the facts in a report and write an official recommendation, in the child's best interest, for that child's future. When the case is heard in court, I present my analysis and recommendation to the judge and speak for the best interests of the child in the courtroom for the duration of the hearing. I then stay with that child's case until a safe, permanent home for the child is secured and the case is officially closed. I have not had many cases yet- but I am currently working on a case, although I cannot give out much information out about that, as I am sworn to confidentiality by law. In general though, a case holds about 20-25 hours per month of work; sometimes more, sometimes less.

I really love my job and I can guarantee that very few students in this country have opportunities to make such a HUGE difference in an individual's life like this at my age. As a Bonner scholar, I am required to complete service hours and I was looking for an organization to serve with. I found CASA, applied and interviewed for the position about a year ago and was fortunate enough to be accepted as an intern. I have been working there ever since. I love my coworkers. I spend a bunch of time in the office, as I am not only a volunteer, but also an intern- so I participate in grant-writing, fund raising, etc. I also taught a class this semester on diversity for the new class of volunteers. I feel so fortunate to be able to be such an influential member of my community, not only in Rhodes but also outside the gates. This experience is truly life-changing. I really have the best time because the people I work with are some of the kindest people I know. There is such a need in our community to help the abused children- children are the future- I mean, haha, who is going to take care of our generation when we get old and decrepit? :) I really think that as a CASA, I have been able to open my eyes to so much more than most people my age do. This is not to sound conceited of course, but I really just love my job and I feel like it really has made me grow up. I see the effects of my work on the community I love the community and the people in it and feel that I will continue this well into my adult life.

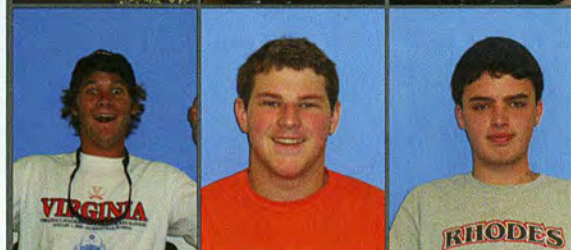

GlobeMed

I'm a junior English Creative Writing major. I've been working with GlobeMed for the past two years. To be honest, I basically fell into GlobeMed. During the winter of freshman year, I went to India with my family. While I was there I saw villages made completely of aluminum siding and heavy-duty tarp. Seeing the human beings who inhabited these villages, almost like seeing skeletons shrink-wrapped in human skin, paralyzed me. I'm not sure what caused the pervasive and persistent feeling of discomfort. Looking back on it now, I think it was simply the act of bearing witness to the arbitrariness of poverty.

Coming back to the States, I made up my mind that I had to do something. I had no notion of where to start or who to talk to. That's when, in 2008, Shannon Fuller and Allison Dove started GlobeMed at Rhodes. GlobeMed at Rhodes is a chapter of national, student-led movement fighting the complicated issue of global health inequity. The national GlobeMed network battles the injustice of inaccessible basic health care by collaborating with grassroots organizations abroad and raising awareness on campus. During their info session, Shannon and Allison showed me GlobeMed's powerful message: every student can be a powerful catalyst for social change.

Once Globemed at Rhodes established a partnership with AMOS in Nicaragua, I was immediately excited by the prospect of travelling once again to confront the arbitrariness of poverty. It was a chance at redemption, at turning my discomfort into action.

The trip did just that. It energized me. In fact, I still look at the journal I kept. I look at it every day. It's fuel for an already-burning fire. And now, as a globalhealthU coordinator for GlobeMed at Rhodes, I use my experience to spread inspiration to the campus. It's an opportunity to foster involvement in an evolving discussion about fighting injustice.

Clearly GlobeMed means a lot to me. It's changed how I see myself. I used to be someone who simply observed, but being a part of GlobeMed and visiting impoverished communities in Nicaragua, has converted my observations into actions. And now, because of my work with GlobeMed, I've realized that making the world a better place is a job that everyone can do, even a creative writer.

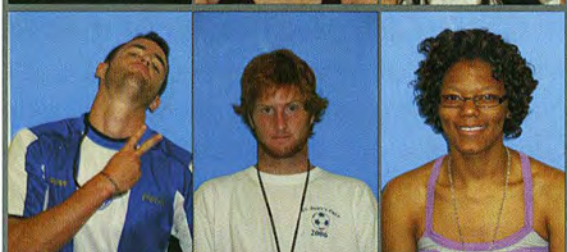

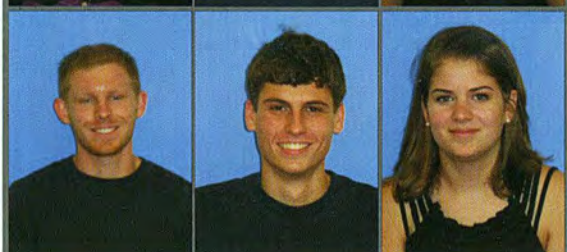

What type of music/programming do you play? why?

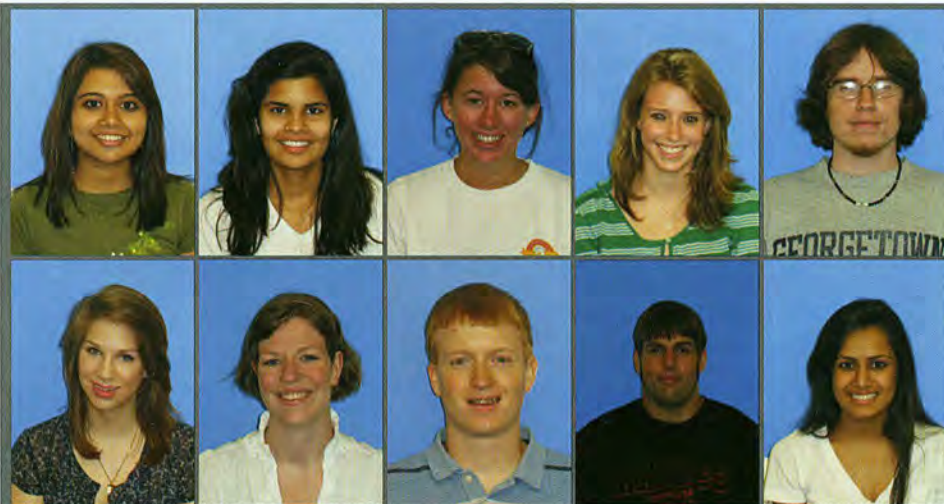
