Rhodes at a Glance



Founded in 1848, Rhodes is a private, residential, coeducational college of liberal arts and sciences. Its 1,700 students choose among 32 majors leading to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. The college also awards a Master of Science degree in accounting.

One of the few selective U.S. liberal arts colleges located in an urban setting, Rhodes occupies 100 wooded acres in midtown Memphis. The campus has been nationally recognized for its adherence to the standards of collegiate Gothic architecture and has been frequently cited as one of the most beautiful in the nation. The college has a strong tradition of service, with 80 percent of all students involved in community service activities. Widely recognized as a top-tier liberal arts college, Rhodes is governed by a student-administered honor code.

Hallmarks of a Rhodes education are the strong mentoring relationships between students and faculty and the emphasis on the synergistic relationship between classroom learning and experiential activities such as research, internships, service and study abroad.

- The College's 1,700 students are a diverse group, representing 43 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 foreign countries.
- The student/faculty ratio is 10.5:1, and the average class size is 13.
- 95% of faculty members have a doctoral degree or the highest degree in their discipline.
- There are 24 academic departments with 8 interdisciplinary majors. The most popular majors: Business Administration, Biology, Political Science, and English.
- 74% of students live on campus in one of the 15 residence halls.
- Active students: 83% participate in community service; 75% participate in academic internships at 100 local, national, and international employers; 65% participate in intramural and club sports (27% varsity).
- Rhodes and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital have formed a partnership to create a formal research program for students. This program, launched in the summer of 2003, provides stipends and mentoring for 12 Rhodes students who participate in cutting-edge research.
- Very successful graduates: twice national average acceptance rate to medical school (AMCAS data); over 95% admissions to business, divinity and law schools (Career Services surveys); top employers: Ernst & Young, Morgan Keegan, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Teach for America and Youth Villages.

2007 Season Preview

The 2006 volleyball season was one for the record books at Rhodes College. After a 0-7 start to the season, the Lynx finished strong, going 29-5 the rest of the way. To go with their 29-12 overall record, the team finished 15-3 in SCAC play—good enough for a second place finish. This allowed the team to qualify for its first ever NCAA tournament. The team made it all the way to the Sweet 16 before bowing out to eventual National Runner-Up Washington University in St. Louis. Rhodes finished the year ranked 16th in the nation.

Heading into the 2007 season, the Lynx return 10 letter winners and will have 5 new faces on this year's squad. The team however will be without Middle Blocker Crystal Jessee, who graduated this past May. Jessee, an Honorable Mention All American, All South Region and First Team All SCAC player in 2006, was the only senior on last year's team.



Leading the way for the Lynx this fall will be Senior Captains Whitney Palla, Laura Reilly and Emily Sadtler. Laura Reilly (Louisville, KY), who became the team's Libero in 2006, was named the SCAC Back Row Player of the Year and was named Honorable Mention All South Region for her play in the back row. She will be called upon again to anchor the Lynx defense. Emily Sadtler,

an outside hitter from Tampa, FL was named All SCAC for the second year in a row in 2006. Sadtler is a force to be reckoned with both in the front row and the back row as she brings the complete game to the outside position. Finally, Whitney Palla (Birmingham, AL) will be an important part of the Lynx's back row defense. Last season, Palla found her niche, becoming a defensive specialist on the right side of the floor, while averaging 3.04 digs per game for the Lynx.

Middle Blocker Allison Squires (Dallas, TX) is the lone junior on this year's squad. Squires will be called upon to step up both offensively and defensively for the Lynx due to the graduation of Jessee. In 2006, Squires was second on the team in total kills and kills per game.

Six sophomores will make their return to the Lynx this fall. Leading the way will be outside hitter Katherine Delavan. Delavan, who hails from San Antonio, TX, led the team in total kills and kills per game last year. For her performance on the court last season, she was named All SCAC, SCAC Freshman of the Year, AVCA All South Region and AVCA Honorable Mention All American. Joining her in the front row will be Kelsea Everett, who hails from Dallas, TX. Last season, Everett was a starter on the right side for the Lynx. This season, look for Everett to see some playing time in all three positions along the net for the Lynx. Finally, Maura Mohler (Buffalo, NY) is geared to make her presence known on the court for the Lynx this fall. Mohler's ability to play in the middle and on the right side will factor into the team's plan offensively this fall.

Laura Jensen (Daphne, AL) and Alex Nobel (Tarpon Springs, FL) will return this fall as the team's setters. Nobel missed most of the 2006 campaign with a knee injury suffered early in preseason. However, she has worked very hard to make a run at the setting position this fall. Jensen became the team's full time setter during the 2006 season and led the team in assists with 10 per game.

Andrea Hassink, who hails from Tulsa, OK, will see time as a defensive specialist during the 2007 campaign. Hassink will be called upon to lead the left side of the Lynx back row defense and to push some major runs with her tough serve.

The 2007 season will see the addition of 5 new players to the squad: Phylicia Douglas (Memphis, TN), Alana Fritsche (Garland, TX), Kayla McCrury (Cedar Park, TX), Stephanie Parazak (Littleton, CO) and Sarah Sickler (Houston, TX). All five players competed at the Junior Olympic level in 2007.



Phylicia Douglas will look to add depth at the outside position. Douglas played her high school volleyball at Overton High School in Memphis and played club ball for Memphis Juniors Volleyball Association.

Alana Fritsche and Kayla McCrury look to add depth to an already strong back row defense for the Lynx. Fritsche will look to be a role player as a defensive specialist for the Lynx while McCrury will compete for time in the back row as both a defensive specialist and Libero.

Finally, Stephanie Parazak and Sarah Sickler will look to bring some additional height and offense to the front row for the Lynx. Parazak, whose club team qualified for nationals this summer in Minneapolis, will look to compete for a starting role as the team's other middle this fall. Sickler will look to bring an imposing block on the

right side.

The 2007 schedule will have the team embarking on an extremely tough regional and national level schedule. The team will travel to Pacific University, located outside of Portland, Oregon to open up the 2007 season. While at Pacific, the team will face off against Lewis and Clark, California State East Bay, Pacific Lutheran and Pacific University. The following weekend the team will travel to Atlanta, GA to compete in the Emory Classic. Here the Lynx will face off against South Region foes Averett University, UT Dallas and host Emory. During the month of October the team will travel again to Maryville, TN to face off against Washington and Lee and Maryville College. The Lynx will finish up the month of October with a match against cross-town rival Christian Brothers University.

With the addition of Birmingham Southern and Colorado College to the SCAC, conference play will have a new look in the 2007 season. Each team will play 16 conference matches followed by a conference tournament hosted by Austin College, to decide the automatic qualifier from the SCAC into the NCAA tournament. On October 6-7, Rhodes will host the SCAC Central/East weekend in Mallory Gymnasium. Last season three other teams from the SCAC (Austin, Southwestern, and Trinity) besides Rhodes made the NCAA tournament.

The Lynx will kick off the season on Friday August 31, 2007 in Forest Grove, Oregon at Pacific University's Boxer Invitational.

Samantha Lambert

Head Volleyball Coach

Samantha Lambert begins her 9th year as Rhodes' head women's volleyball coach in 2007. Lambert (formerly Wolinski) arrived at Rhodes in the spring of 1999 after spending a year as an assistant coach at Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana. Since that time, she has 168 coaching victories to her credit.



High School for 2 years. In May of 1999, Lambert received her Masters Degree in Sport Administration from Canisius College in Buffalo, New York.

Lambert is married to Scott Lambert, the Head Athletic Trainer at Christian Brothers University. They currently reside in Cordova, TN.

The 2006 volleyball season was one for the record books. The Lynx finished the year with a 29-12 overall record and appeared in their first ever NCAA tournament. The Lynx were a regional finalist and finished the year ranked 16th in the nation. Lambert was chosen by her peers as the SCAC Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2006.

Lambert has also been actively involved in coaching Memphis area youth volleyball since her arrival. She is currently the director for the Memphis Juniors Volleyball Association (MJVA), and has helped coach two of the club's teams (13s and 18s) to berths in the Junior Olympic Volleyball Championships in 2001. In 2006, Lambert's own 18 Elite team qualified for the Junior Olympic Volleyball Championships held in Atlanta, GA. She also serves on the board of directors for the Delta Region of USA Volleyball.

A native of Lancaster, New York, Lambert attended Earlham College, where she received her BA in Economics and Management. She was a 3-sport athlete, lettering in basketball, softball, and volleyball.

After graduation from Earlham in 1996, she returned home to Buffalo, New York and worked for an Americorps program called Athletes in Service to America. While there, she was also the varsity volleyball coach at Holy Angels Academy for 2 years, and an assistant varsity basketball coach at Seneca Vocational

Ken Scarleski begins his fourth year as an assistant coach for the Lynx volleyball team in 2007. Prior to this stint with the Lynx, Scarleski coached for more than 13 years in the Memphis area at the junior high and high school levels at both Holy Rosary and St. Agnes Academy. He has also been actively involved in coaching on the Junior Olympic level for the past 4 years, first with the Memphis Starlings and also for the past 3 years with Memphis Xtreme.



Scarleski is also the founder and 11-year organizer of the annual Italian Festival Adult Volleyball Outdoor Tournament in Memphis, prior to his involvement with Junior Olympic Volleyball.

A native of Chicago, Scarleski attended the University of Memphis. He and his wife, Renee, reside in Memphis with their youngest son. He is also the father of four daughters.

Assistant Volleyball Coach

Ammar Rizvi is back with the Lynx as an assistant coach in 2007. Rizvi played for 3 years on the Varsity Boys Volleyball Team at Lafayette High School in Brooklyn, NY and continued his volleyball career at Polytechnic University, a NCAA Division III Men's Program in New York City. Ammar has coached for the Memphis Juniors Volleyball Association (MJVA) for 3 years. In addition to MJVA, he has coached at Lausanne Collegiate School as the assistant



varsity coach and at Houston High School as the head freshman coach.

Rizvi and his wife Tracey reside in Memphis with his two daughters Jayla and Tia. He holds a B.S. in Computer Science and a MBA. Ammar currently works at Federal Express as a Business Systems Analyst.

Drew Gibson

Head Trainer

Drew Gibson enters his first year as the head Athletic Trainer for the Lynx in 2007. Gibson graduated from the University of Memphis in 2001 with a degree in Exercise Science. He worked with the football and baseball teams as a student trainer. Drew also served as a training camp intern with the Miami Dolphins in 1999.



Gibson recently completed his Masters degree in Sports Psychology at Murray State, where he worked with the women's basketball and varsity baseball programs. Twenty-six years of age, Drew is a Certified Athletic Trainer and resides in Memphis, Tennessee.

SCAC Profile

The Southern collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) was formed to provide an association through which the member institutions may encourage organized competition in intercollegiate sports among teams representative of their respective student bodies. Members of the conference share a commitment to prioritize the overall quality of academic standards and educational experiences.

The conference was founded and began operating on September 1, 1962, as the College Athletic Conference (CAC). Centre College, Southwestern at Memphis (now known as Rhodes College), The University of the South (Sewanee), and Washington and Lee University were the four charter members of the conference. Later in 1962, Washington University of St. Louis became the fifth member and the CAC remained unchanged until 1972.

Following membership changes throughout the 1970s and 1980s, the conference went through restructuring and renaming. With the addition of Millsaps College and Trinity University in 1988 and Hendrix College and Oglethorpe University in 1991, membership reached a then all-time high of eight. In 1991, the conference renamed itself the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference, its first full-time commissioner Steve Argo was hired, and a conference office was established in Atlanta, Georgia. The SCAC added Southwestern University in 1993 with participation beginning in the 1994-95 academic year. In 1997-98, the SCAC added DePauw University with participation beginning in 1998-99.

Austin College and Colorado College were confirmed as members of the league in 2005 with participation beginning in the 2006-07 academic year. Birmingham-Southern College has been approved as the 12th member of the SCAC with play in 2007-08, though as a provisional member of NCAA Division-II, its games will not count toward conference standings.

The conference and its member institutions are committed to maintaining high academic standards. The member institutions are committed to the principle that a quality college athletics program is beneficial to the well-being of an institution in that it benefits the entire campus community as well as the student-athletes.

With nine member institutions maintaining Phi Beta Kappa chapters on their campuses, the SCAC boasts some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the nation. SCAC schools are consistently ranked among the top 50 colleges and universities in the nation in such respected publications as Barron's, Peterson's, Princeton Review and National Review College Guide.

SCAC member institutions maintain consistent enrollments through very selective admissions standards and continuing quality education.

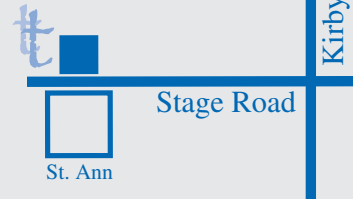

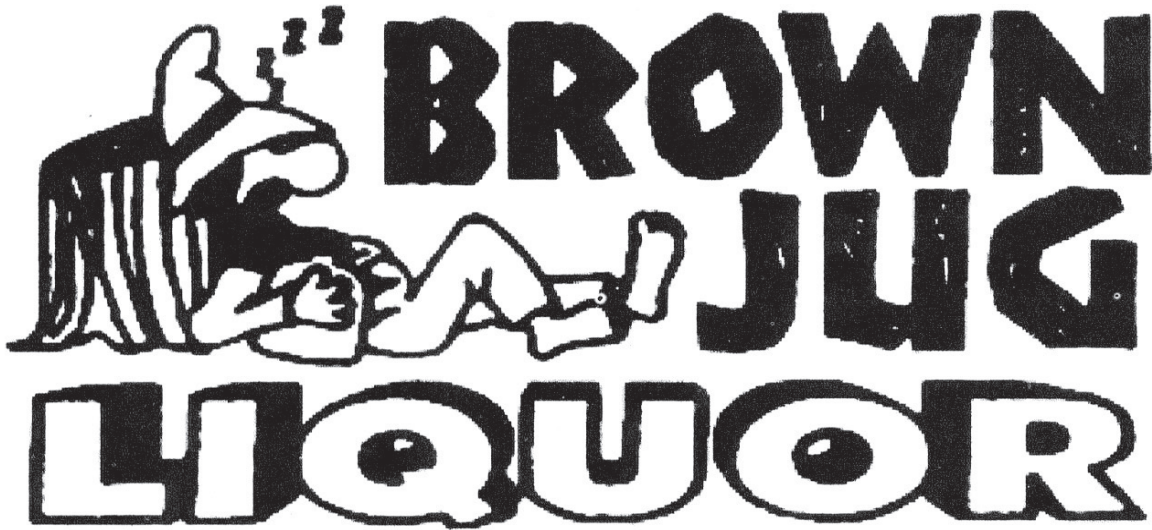

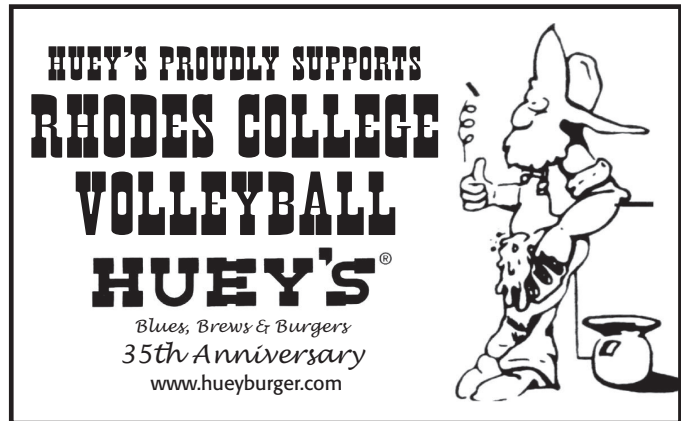
