## The Student Body

- 1,699 enrolled students from 43 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 foreign countries
- Minority students make up approximately 15% of the entering class
- 48% admissions acceptance rate
- 74% from outside of Tennessee
- 74% live on campus
- 83% participate in community service
- 27% participate in NCAA Division III sports; 10 women's, 9 men's teams; member of the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC)

### The Academic Program

- Student/faculty ratio: 10.5:1
- Average class size: 13
- 24 departmental and 9 interdisciplinary majors;
  33 minors
- Degrees: B.A. or B.S.; M.S. in Accounting
- 75% participation in internships or other field experiences at 100 local, national and international employers
- Most popular majors: Biology, Business Administration, English, and Political Science
- Graduate school acceptance rates: Nearly twice the national average acceptance rate to medical school; over 95% admissions to business, divinity and law schools
