Hitchcock & De Palma: Blood Lines



How do you top the Master when making your own suspense thrillers? This talk will discuss the art of Brian De Palma, Hitchcock's greatest modern re-interpreter. De Palma's own distinctive style and unique cinematic techniques create an altogether new kind of postmodern suspense from the Hitchcock template. Movies discussed include Sisters, Obsession, Carrie, The Fury, Dressed to Kill, Blow Out and Raising Cain.

DAVID GREVEN is Associate Professor of English and Chair of the Department of Literatures in English at Connecticut College. His areas of specialization are cinema, television and popular culture; psychoanalytic theory, queer theory and gender studies; nineteenth-century American literature; and the history of American literary and film criticism. His next book, *Psycho-Sexual: Hitchcock and the New Hollywood*, is forthcoming with the University of Texas Press.
