BIOGRAPHIES



James Cornfoot, conductor

An alumnus of the Rhodes College Department of Music, James Cornfoot returns to his alma mater as the director of the Rhodes Chamber Singers. In addition to leading the Chamber Singers, James serves as Assistant Director for the Rhodes MasterSingers Chorale and teaches courses in Music Appreciation and Latin American Music. Professor Cornfoot completed a Master of Music in Choral Conducting at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, where he studied conducting with Dr. Carole Ott and Dr. Welborn Young. While at UNCG, he served as assistant conductor for the UNCG Women's Choir and the

UNCG Men's Glee Club, and he was an active singer in the University Chorale and the Chamber Singers.

James also serves as the Director of Music Ministries at First Presbyterian Church in Hernando, MS, where he oversees the Kirk Choir and children's music ministry programs. James hails from San Antonio, TX.



William Skoog, conductor

William Skoog joined the Rhodes faculty in 2009 as Professor of Music, Elizabeth Daughdrill Fine Arts Chair, Music Department Chair, and Director of Choral Studies. He most recently served as Associate Professor and Director of Choral Activities at Bowling Green State University, directing the University Men's Chorus, University Choral Society and Collegiate Chorale, and taught courses in undergraduate and graduate conducting and choral literature. Dr. Skoog has conducted various university choirs with the Tuscan Chamber Orchestra (Italy), Santa Maria Orchestra in Switzerland, the Memphis Symphony Orchestra, Eroica

Symphony, Toledo Symphony, Fort Wayne Philharmonic Orchestra, Elkhart Symphony (IN), Prague Radio Symphony Orchestra and the Moravian Symphony Orchestra, Czech Republic. In 2010 he served as artistic director and conductor for the esteemed Rome International Choral Festival, and in 2008 he served as artistic director/conductor of the Lucerne Choral Festival, Switzerland. His choirs have performed at numerous state, regional and national conferences, and he is sought after as a guest conductor and clinician.



Debbie Smith, piano/organ

Debbie Smith, Adjunct Professor of piano and organ at Rhodes, has been active as a teacher, recitalist, accompanist, singer and choral director in the Mid-south since 1980. In addition to teaching at Rhodes, Ms. Smith is the Director of Music Ministry at Evergreen Presbyterian Church. Ms. Smith received her B.M. in Organ Performance from Mississippi College and her M.M. in Organ Performance from The University of Memphis.

Rhodes Singers originated in 1937 under the direction of Professor Louis Nicholas ('34), who organized the first choral ensemble at Rhodes College in 1934. Burnet C. Tuthill, co-founder of the National Association of the Schools of Music (NSAM), formalized choral music performance with the establishment of the Rhodes Singers as the concert choir for the college. Today, Rhodes Singers performs many concerts annually, tour throughout the United States, and tour internationally every three years. Two years ago, they performed in the Rome International Choral Festival, and performed concert tours in Italy and France. This year, they tour through Texas and Arkansas; then members will perform at the Salzburg International Choral Festival, singing also in Prague and Vienna.
