Apt. 1. before he passed our around 7 a.m. He died on his way to John Gaston Hospital lance. <br> A preliminary finding into the death showed it was caused by pulmonary edema. an accumulation of fluid on the lungs. <br> The hearings were first scheduled to begin last week, but were postponed at the request of the defense. A 20 day delay was granted in the courts-martial. <br> Philip E. Kuhn. scheduled to represent three of the accused Marines, said he will contend they were attacked contend they were attacked | Marines. <br> "We are very concerned," he sald, "why the Navy is pressing charges only aga inst black Marines involved in this matter." <br> The incident occurred July 30 of this year. <br> The other four Marines are: <br> Lance Corporal Perry Backstrom, 21, of Lauderdale, Miss.; Private First Class Arthur McCall, 20 , Blrmingham. Ala.; Private First Class Charles L. Nickson. 19. Memphis. Tenn. and Private Oscar W.Terry, Jr. 19. Paducah. Ky. All are at tached to the Casual Company, an administrative unit of the Marine Aviation $1 r-$ aining Support Group in Millington. <br> Those assigned to the Casual Company are Marine personnel awaiting orders transfers. separation from the service or decisions of medical and physical evaluation boards. <br> Backstrom, Talton and | Nickson received wounds in Vietnam. Terry and McCall have not. They were, however, evacuated from Vietnam for medical reasons other than wounds reçeived in combat. <br> According to witness, several Marines went into the Casual Company barracks and the Rachskellar Restaurant (a Navy Exchange operated snack bar) and assaulted persons in those buildings about 10 p.m. that evening. Several persons were treated for injuries immediately thereafter, but no one is hospitalized now as a result of the incident. Boch the Casual Company and the Rachskellar are located on the Memphis Naval Hospital grounds at the Naval Air Station.
