Hatred prevailed high in the sanitation workers with the first day of the march for the sanitation workers with the brokers aimed at giving the sanitation workers and the recognition of their union.

march to show the city that they would worry them if the workers didn't get their raise. The teenagers and the black power advocates, however, picked this day to demonstrate to the white power structur, that "either we get or we will destroy" attitude.

The Police Department itself started the trouble when the tried to keep kids from leaving school to go to the march. This alone a red many of the students who really was for non-violence and a peace. Many march. Then after a few policemen beated other teenagers in the restraint, non-viol nce easily shifted to violent attitudes.

As the march beganned, Dr. King had control only the people whose only intention was to march. Others we angred because the Mayor Henry Loeb would not grant anything in favor of the striking workers; some because hated white for slavery of their grandfathers; then some was just retaliation to the police force. From the beginning the marchers were divided, non-violence and violence.

The black power advocates was also organized in that there would be a signal of the first window breaking as the start of it all. Orders for the marchers were "let us march in Peace". While orders for the roiters we were "got to city hall— hear Dr. King— on our way back down Main street, it starts."

combustion windows were broken, looting started, and a few policemen

ranned.

masks and helmets on. These stupid cops stateed firing tear gas at the marchers. The roiters and looters, however, stayed behind the marchers using the marchers as a diversionary mactic to cover up for them. A group of swing happy policemen started beating everyone in sight. This really begun these lash. Store supplies began to vanishe windows were crashed, merchadise was looted or annihilated, and more policemen were beated. One looter was quoted saying, "for every Negro they beat, we got three of them".

Dr. King called a halt in the march as the trouble reached its intensity. With the policemen ready to shoot anyone who even spit to hard, Dr. King's aides rushed him unoticed to a car, which took him back to his hotel.

The marchers and the roiters later felt nothing was accomplished that day. One marcher said, "we didn't want that to happen", while at the same times a roiter said "we didn't do enough". And do you know...

we didn't.
