

Ratification of Geo. A. McCall  
of acts of Robertson Topp.

"Whereas Robertson Topp for himself  
and as attorney in fact for  
myself, and in connection with  
one Thomas B. Haralson and  
one W. L. B. Vance, with the design  
of bringing said lots advantageously  
in market, in connection with  
the surrounding lots  
owned by said Haralson & Vance  
& others, did on the 29<sup>th</sup> day  
of May 1841, by sealed instrument  
of that date, agree to divide  
Country lots 487, 488, 489,  
490 & 491 by the extension  
of streets, and dedication of the  
same to public use, for a  
more particular description  
reference is made - to the recorded  
instrument of that date, and  
whereas also on the 6<sup>th</sup> day



of June 1841, said Robertson  
Topp, in his own right and  
as attorney in fact for myself  
and in connection with said  
W. L. Vance, issued a ~~prospectus~~  
to the public containing proposals  
to the public to take a certain  
amount of stock for the purpose  
of erecting an hotel, and donating  
a certain parcel of land for the  
purpose, and whereas said stock  
having been taken, and said  
lot having been conveyed to  
the stockholders as proposed, by  
deed bearing date 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1841  
and whereas said Robertson Topp  
for himself, and as attorney  
in fact for myself, on the 8<sup>th</sup>  
day of July
