



# Support for Teaching and Learning at Rhodes

aculty dedicated to undergraduate teaching is one of Rhodes' greatest strengths. Alumni from the 1940s to the class of 2008 attest that their Rhodes experience is shaped by our outstanding faculty. Teaching, not limited to the classroom, permeates the campus through regular one-on-one exchanges between faculty and students. The frequent interaction enables faculty to engage students in all aspects of their particular discipline, including their research, and results in lifelong friendships. A primary goal of the Campaign for Rhodes is to ensure that our faculty and staff have the talent, time and resources to inspire and involve our students in meaningful study, research and service. Alumni, parents, foundations and friends clearly recognize the value of faculty contributions, and they have expressed their appreciation through gifts to support specific endeavors.

Most visible is the Paul Barret Jr. Library which has transformed the center of campus and provides a place for faculty and students to plan their collaborations and share news of progress along the way. The renovations and addition to the McCoy Theatre made possible by the Harry B. McCoy Foundation has reinvigorated all of the arts on campus by providing space for theatre faculty to be housed under one roof as well as additional rehearsal space for upcoming performances. In addition to these gifts, alumni,

foundations, parents and trustees have provided generous support of the academic program at Rhodes. The gifts and bequests, all aimed at attaining the Rhodes Vision, benefit a wide variety of departments along with an eclectic array of innovations and programs.

The Virginia Ballou McGehee Chair in Muslim-Christian Relations honors an alumna of Rhodes College and aims to enable a student to work closely with an outstanding member of the Rhodes faculty. The funds support a distinguished faculty member's research and course development as well as the work of a student research associate who can contribute to and benefit from working closely with the faculty member. The current occupant is Professor John Kaltner who says, "In addition to the funding for my research which is, of course, very welcome, the best thing about the chair is that it allows me to work with talented students as a mentor and collaborator. Lars Nelson, a Religious Studies and History double major, is my research assistant this year, and I have thoroughly enjoyed working with him."

The Jameson M. Jones Outstanding Faculty Service Award, also in support of the Rhodes Vision's Student Learning Imperative, has been endowed by Dr. John Gladney '74 to continue the tradition of honoring faculty service at Rhodes at Opening Convocation each year.

"Members of the faculty serve Rhodes in many ways that go beyond formal teaching duties and scholarship," notes Gladney, mentioning in particular academic advising and oversight of the academic program. All members of the Rhodes faculty are eligible to receive the award. Nominations are considered by a committee comprising primarily faculty members and members of the Office of Academic Affairs. Recipients have included Professors John Katlner, Tim Huebner and, most recently, Gail Streete.

The Martin-Kragh Faculty Development Fund for Biology and Chemistry was established by parents Steve and Nancy Martin in hope of perpetuating the close learning and working relationship their son Stuart '08 had working in the laboratory of chemistry professor Loretta Jackson-Hayes.

"When we came for Parents' Weekend, my son Stuart wanted us to meet one his professors, Dr. Loretta Jackson-Hayes," Steve Martin recalls. "We were expecting a quick

handshake, but we stayed in her lab for nearly an hour listening to her and Stuart describe their research project. I'm sure it is every parent's dream to see a son or daughter so excited to work on a fascinating project under the direction of a great mentor."

The fund provides support for a chemistry or biology student to conduct research in the laboratory of a faculty mentor.

**The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation** established two programs that benefit the Rhodes academic program.

The first provides support for faculty in all stages of their careers to grow professionally. Beneficiaries have included professors Tim Huebner and Lynn Zastoupil of the History Department; Jennifer Brady, English; and David Jeter, Chemistry.

The most recent Mellon program provides funding to expand the Environmental Sciences program to a much more broadly defined Environmental Studies program (see story on page 8). The Environmental Sciences program, which appeals to students in Mathematics, Chemistry,

Biology and Economics, is broadening its focus to include environmental policy and will be attractive to students interested in areas such as Political Science, International Studies, Business or Economics with career interests in environmental law, ethics, politics or economics.

"Emerging from this program, our students can position themselves to be leaders in addressing some of the world's most pressing issues," says Professor David Kesler, who is chairing the effort.

The program has hired three new postdoctoral fellows, Robert Lustech, Tait Keller and Jennifer Sciubba, who are working with Kesler to implement a variety of interdisciplinary aspects of the program. Lustech also teaches courses in the Anthropology/Sociology Department, Keller in History and Sciubba in International Studies.

The Dr. Iris Annette Pearce Shakespeare Endowment was established through a generous bequest from Dr. Pearce '42 to support the Student Learning and Engagement Imperatives of the Rhodes Vision. Dr. Pearce had a history of giving to her country and community. She served as a WAVE during World War II, was a fifth-generation physician and a pioneer for women in the field of medicine. She was the first woman resident in internal medicine and the first woman chief resident at John Gaston Hospital in Memphis. She also served as director of the City of Memphis Hospitals. Dr. Pearce had a unique compassion for the poor and underserved. In 1981, she received the prestigious L.M. Graves Memorial Health Award for outstanding contributions to community health care.

Income from her endowed fund will be used to enhance and enrich courses in the Shakespeare Studies program through lectures by visiting scholars, classes offered by actors and directors in residence, conferences, workshops and performances. A portion of the funding will support research by the faculty member holding the position in Shakespeare Studies in the English Department.

Plans for the program are highly interdisciplinary in nature. Collaboration with the Theatre Department will be ongoing, and more innovative partnerships are also planned. Work is under way for a program on Shakespeare and the Environment, in celebration of the new Environmental Studies program, and Shakespeare and Politics is slated for next year.

**The Plough Foundation** has endowed a chair in Urban Studies to strengthen public education, early childhood development, crime protection, health care and economic development in Shelby County. The chair is held by Professor Mike Kirby, chair of the Urban Studies program.

"This support is gratifying recognition of the important work our students do in the community," Kirby says. "It also encourages us to document Rhodes' success stories and disseminate the information to other programs and community members. We have begun publication of a Community Journal to accomplish that goal. The first one deals with community policing and has been very well received."

The James T. and Valeria B. Robertson Chair in Biological Science was established by Dr. James Robertson '53 to support faculty teaching and research in the sciences. The current occupant, Professor Terry Hill, says, "Being the occupant of this chair is a great honor. It's also much more than that. The funds allow me to travel to international conferences which is quite as important in the sciences as in modern languages and international studies. There are three collaborations that [Chemistry] Professor Darlene Loprete and I are involved in that arose from associations I made at such meetings. There are great things happening in our research that would not be happening without this support."

The Spence Wilson Faculty International Travel Fund was established by the Kemmons Wilson Family Foundation in honor of Spence Wilson to enable faculty to conduct research outside the U.S., collaborate with colleagues from throughout the world, travel to retool or expand the curriculum, present papers at international conferences and take students abroad.


"The Rhodes Vision clearly states the college's goal is to inspire its graduates to be effective leaders not only in their local communities and professions but in the world," Wilson says. "To achieve that goal of enriching our students' global perspectives, it is imperative that our faculty have access to international resources and opportunities."

In the first two years since its inception, the fund has provided international experiences to seven faculty members including: Professors Mauricio Cafiero (Chemistry), Eddie Mallot (English), Jeffrey Jackson (History), Gary Lindquester (Biology), Michelle Mattson (Modern Languages), Marsha Walton (Psychology) and Tom McGowan (Anthropology/Sociology).

"I am very grateful to the alumni/ae, foundations, parents and trustees who have underwritten these important programs," says Rhodes president William E. Troutt. "It is a strong affirmation that they understand and appreciate the vital nature of what happens here every day. The Rhodes faculty is second to none and I am delighted that friends of the college are supporting their work."

# Respected Scholar Is New Academic Leader By Daney D. Kepple

ichael R. Drompp, Rhodes' new academic leader, steps into his two-year appointment as Dean of the Faculty and Vice President for Academic Affairs with three points in his favor:

- He was the unanimous choice of President Troutt and the Faculty Governance Committee.
- He is a distinguished scholar and teacher as well as an able administrator.
- He has a solid record of leading the campus community through waters that have not always been smooth.

Drompp, a Phi Beta Kappa at Indiana University, came to Rhodes in 1989 as an assistant professor of history after teaching at Illinois State University and serving as the director of the Pacific Rim/Asia Study-Travel Program at the University of Puget Sound. He was promoted to associate professor in 1993 and full professor in 2003, and chaired both the Department of History and the Asian Studies Program for several years. Drompp has also served as Dean of Academic Affairs for Postgraduate Fellowships. He received the Clarence Day Award for Outstanding Teaching in 1999.

Drompp's classroom skills rest on a firm foundation. A lifelong musician who was encouraged by his parents to look for a more "practical" major, Drompp discovered the Department of Uralic and Altaic Studies at Indiana University and was captivated. His first experience was a course called "Inner Asia before the Mongol Conquest," taught by a master teacher who later became one of his mentors.

"I have stayed there ever since. I am fascinated by the relationship between the Chinese people and the nomadic peoples to China's north. I stayed at

Indiana for all three of my degrees because that was the only place in the world that could offer me that concentration," he says.

Drompp lived in Taiwan for two and a half years while writing his dissertation and studied, among other things, gourmet cooking. A few years ago he set off for Mongolia on his own and rented a Jeep, driver and translator to examine and photograph archaeological sites that had not yet been excavated. Perhaps most formative was the year he spent leading University of Puget Sound students on a year-long academic experience in Asia.

"We went to Japan, Korea, China, Thailand, India, Nepal and Pakistan, and the students studied a different course in each country," he recalls. "In Thailand we lived

in a monastery and studied Theravada Buddhism, In Nepal, on a 20-day trek of the Himalayas we studied the flora and fauna of the area. I taught art history in China and still include art in many of my classes. The capstone course was on the history and cultures of the Silk Road, taught while we traveled a good portion of that ancient route. The net effect was that I truly came to value international education and its impact on students."

Soon after President Troutt arrived at Rhodes he asked Drompp to chair the Diversity Initiative, a task force charged with looking at obstacles to attaining a more diverse campus and how those obstacles could be overcome. The fact that 21 percent of the class of 2012 are students of color is an eloquent testimony to the often challenging work of that task force.

Later, Drompp led the steering committee established to oversee the faculty/trustee teams that tackled the 10 "steps forward" highlighted in President Troutt's inaugural address. The 10 initiatives, which have since been consolidated into the Rhodes Vision and its four strategic imperatives, set such goals as recruiting and retaining the best faculty and promoting increased opportunities for students to do research, engage with the Memphis community and study abroad. They also

called for curricular revision and a new library. Major progress has been achieved in all those areas.

Michael Drompp has earned the faculty's and the administration's trust many times over, yet he begins his new assignment with humility.

"The Diversity Initiative was a very good learning experience for me," he says. "Through it I came to see that process is important as well as outcome, and progress is often slow. As part of that work other members of the task force and I met with many groups with the goal of engaging as many constituencies as possible. It reinforced for me the tremendous importance of listening."

Drompp enters his new role with that realization. "I have great respect for the work of everyone here and

for the level of trust we share. I hope to promote improved communication and strive for greater transparency. I want to honor and celebrate the work of the faculty in all its diversity. There is a marvelous variety of teaching and research and creative activity here, and I am very glad of that."

Drompp admits to some sadness at the thought of leaving the classroom.

"I love teaching," he says.

"I was reminded of that recently when I got a postcard from a student who is now studying in China. It is very gratifying to me that she thought of the class in which we studied the emperor who is pictured on the card. We really do have great students at Rhodes."

On the other hand, "I won't miss grading! Over the years I've learned that I enjoy working with the faculty as well as with the students, and this job gives me a new way to do that." I

# **Examining the Environment**

ow did Columbus' arrival in the New World impact the native population? What happens to the environment of an area when you start building parking lots? In what ways can population, disease and technology impact war, power and sovereignty? What does "national security" mean from an environmental standpoint?

Students at Rhodes are getting the opportunity to tackle these complex issues and many more through a newly expanded Environmental Studies

program—all made possible by a major grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.

With the Mellon Grant providing more than \$500,000 over the next three years, Rhodes has created an interdisciplinary course of study that crosses humanities, natural and social sciences and greatly enhances what began as an Environmental Science minor in the natural sciences just a few years ago. Students are now exploring aspects of ecological anthropology, environmental archaeology and the politics of pathogens, to name just a few new topics of study, under the guidance of three faculty fellows whose appointments were funded by the Mellon Grant award. The new

Environmental Studies program helps position Rhodes as a leader in the national higher education conversation on the environment, and is another area of study in which the college can take full advantage of its urban location.

"Our faculty has created three postdoctoral positions emphasizing environmental policy, which adds both depth and breadth to our program, along with teaching experience in a liberal arts environment for humanities Ph.D.s," says Rhodes President William E. Troutt. "The program plays to our strengths in interdisciplinary learning that crosses traditional departmental boundaries. The timing is ideal for Rhodes as we implement several

new initiatives that continue to integrate academic and experiential learning, and we are very grateful to the Mellon Foundation for this support."

According to Michael Drompp, vice president for Academic Affairs and dean of the faculty, the Rhodes faculty is due the credit for successfully winning the prestigious grant, and the newly expanded Environmental Studies program is already building bridges in terms of uniting different disciplines.

"For years, before the [Environmental Science] minor was created, we sputtered along trying to put together some sort of an environmental program," he says. "I was quite pleased when we adopted the philosophy of first building on our strength in sciences with the Environmental Science minor. I believe that successful program was an important component in our proposal to the Mellon Foundation."

While the new Environmental Studies courses

"Our History, International Studies and Anthropology/Sociology departments are hosting the new postdocs at Rhodes," explains Drompp, "but the program has the potential to impact students across an even wider variety of disciplines and courses of study. It is really exciting because it's such a broad-based initiative. The new courses are intended to appeal to a great number of students, not just those who want to minor in Environmental Science."

Biology Department professor David Kesler, who helped develop the original Environmental Science minor and who will direct the expanded interdisciplinary program, agrees that it is an ambitious effort. have interest for students in a wide variety of disciplines at Rhodes, the History, Anthropology/ Sociology and International Studies departments are particularly happy about welcoming new faculty fellows in their specific disciplines.

With a Ph.D. in history from Georgetown, faculty fellow Tait Keller is guiding students in the exploration of the development of human society and the ways in which human experience is lived in an ecological context. Jennifer Sciubba, who has her Ph.D. in international studies from the University of Maryland, is sharing the most compelling aspects of her work at the Pentagon and helping students explore what she describes as her

broad, nontraditional view of international relations. And with a Ph.D. in anthropology and minor in paleoecology from the University of Minnesota, Rob Lusteck brings a distinctly archaeological perspective to students examining ecological and anthropological aspects of environmental issues.

"When we were offered the chance to apply to host one of these postdoctoral fellows, it made perfect sense to me try to bring in someone with an interest

in environmental archaeology," explains Anthropology/ Sociology chair Susan Kus. "Rob is teaching students about ecological anthropology, which examines how other cultures particularly those we'd consider indigenous to their particular area—understand their environment and their place in the larger ecological scheme. He's also an archaeologist, so he brings an understanding of how people through time lived

history and politics of consumption and the relationship of science and technology to society at large. They examine urban planning and suburban sprawl, and the interaction between cultural values and the setting in which we live. The histories of these pertinent areas are often absent from current debates, but to understand where we are environmentally, we need to know what political, social and ethical decisions got us here."

Like his colleagues in the History and Anthropology/ Sociology departments, International Studies chair Steve Ceccoli is excited about the opportunity Rhodes has to continue offering an innovative interdisciplinary curriculum for students.

"Recruiting new faculty members in our departments has allowed us to bring together scholars from diverse fields and enable them to share their insights,"

he says. "I expect that this opportunity will create several excellent synergies, many of which we have not yet anticipated."

All three postdoctoral fellows point to the opportunity to teach in an intimate liberal arts environment as one of the deciding factors in accepting their appointments at Rhodes. The chance to shape a new course of study was also part of the appeal.

"Carol Ekstrom, David Kesler and others have certainly laid a solid foundation for the new Environmental Studies program, and seem to have successfully drummed up a lot of interest and support for it," says Jennifer Sciubba. "Now it's

in this area in North America—and a historical and prehistorical perspective to how humans and the environment interacted with one another here."

For History Department chair Gail Murray, the fact that the Environmental Studies courses are bridging natural sciences, social sciences and humanities fits well with Rhodes' emphasis on a liberal arts experience that produces articulate, well-read, engaged citizens.

"Environmental historians are asking some of the most cutting-edge questions in the field of environmental studies," Murray says. "These scholars confront questions about the development of industry, the use of natural resources, the

up to us to bring our own unique perspectives and talents and see their vision through."

Sciubba plans to do just that through her ecological politics course, which challenges the notion that international relations is all about states, bombs and money. Her Pentagon research on population and nontraditional security will be equally interesting for students wishing to explore feminist and environmental perspectives on national security.

"I hope to show students that there are multiple ways of looking at the world and that there are other issues just as important as war and power," she says. "I also think it is important to connect to the local community so that students can feel that what they are learning is tangible. There are international issues in Memphis, such as refugee communities of people who were forced away from home by environmental and political issues, and there are local connections between pollution and poverty that mirror what's going on in less industrialized countries. There are many commonalities, and by looking at what is happening right here, students can better understand what is happening abroad."

The opportunities to connect to the local community will undoubtedly have great appeal for Rhodes students, who are already well-known for putting theory into practice and testing classroom concepts in real-world settings.

"If you're going to study the environment, you have to be out in it!" Keller says with a laugh. "I think these new courses are not only an excellent addition to the curriculum, but also a great opportunity to do work beyond the Rhodes College campus. One example is sustainable development on the Memphis riverfront and all along the Mississippi River. I think our work in Environmental Studies will have a part to play in that. There are also some pretty serious environmental justice issues here in Memphis that we can examine. One of the ways Rhodes can really set itself apart compared to similar programs is by capitalizing on our urban environment in exploring such issues. I think that will really appeal to the kinds of students who come to Rhodes."

Sciubba agrees. "Having a strong environmental program here, situated in Memphis, allows us to

plug into the community and demonstrate that there are people in the area interested in green issues," she says. "That makes us a part of the movement, not a city left behind."

Lusteck echoes these sentiments in describing how Environmental Studies will make a difference at Rhodes and beyond.

"One of the reasons this program was funded was that people are becoming more aware of environmental problems," he says. "For example, in Tennessee, there are several EPA-designated Superfund sites (an uncontrolled or abandoned place where hazardous waste is located, which can possibly affect local ecosystems or people). There are all sorts of environmental changes that can happen with everything humans do, and sometimes they can be fairly catastrophic. Often you will see people in some degree of power who have stepped on little people and caused areas of environmental degradation that have negatively impacted the lifestyle of the less powerful segment.

"With society's increased awareness of certain environmental issues, it's a good time to examine other cultures and the ways they approach the environment," he continues. "We teach 20 students, and we hope they go out and teach 20 more. I'd like to help create a strong Environmental Studies program here by teaching young people to be aware of these issues, so they can use that knowledge in their future and try to fix these problems."

Kesler says it is critical to pull out all the stops in tackling today's environmental problems.

"Why is this program important?" he asks. "Because it's critical that we expose tomorrow's business, civic and academic leaders to these issues. Solutions to today's environmental problems demand a diverse background of experience and study, and the heart of our liberal arts and sciences tradition is the examination of questions from multiple perspectives. My long-term, blue-sky hope for this program is an Environmental Studies major that allows students to explore environmental issues from the perspectives of the natural sciences, humanities, social sciences and the fine arts. I hope that a large proportion of Rhodes courses will fold discussion and study of environmental issues into their content, and that study of the environment will become one of our mission statements."

# **OPEN RHODES**

eady, set, go! That's how most alums and current students over the age of 20 would sum up the first days they spent at Rhodes. In one week's time, they would move in, meet their classmates and a host of peer assistants, attend orientation sessions, register and begin classes. Depending on one's class year, Parent/Family Weekend would be a long two or three months off.

That's the way it was—until two summers ago, when Open Rhodes was born. It's an aptly-named two-day residential summer orientation program for incoming students, parents invited. The concept was designed by a committee of faculty, staff and students who knew exactly what was needed and worked quickly during the 2007 spring semester to bring it about that summer. Why the change? Incoming students and their parents wanted—and needed— more time to assimilate, and they let the college know about it, says Marcus Langford, director of New Student Programs.

"In their evaluations of the old system, students said they felt a high level of anxiety because there was a lot to accomplish over a relatively short period of time," Langford explains. "In just a few days, they had to think about what they were going to major in, register for classes, meet their academic adviser and other new students and orient themselves to the campus. Plus, students didn't have regular communication with the college between the time they'd paid their deposit in the spring until they arrived in August. There was a huge gap that wasn't allowing them to develop a connection with Rhodes. All this, coupled with our desire to help students make that connection earlier rather than later, led us to Open Rhodes."

In June and July, students and their parents attend one of four two-day sessions. Each is geared to accommodate up to 125 students. Students are mailed an Open Rhodes Resource Book beforehand, a 32-page booklet filled with valuable information on how the college works. When they arrive for the session, students stay on campus, parents in hotels.

On campus, the entire Rhodes community is involved. Some 30 faculty participated this year, along with countless administrators and 45 current students, including 20 Open Rhodes Assistants, or ORAs, who met the incoming students, led panels and acted as tour guides.

At each Open Rhodes session, there are common informational panels, meals and receptions. There are also separate events for students or parents only. Everyone meets with faculty, current students and administrators in formal and informal settings.

There are faculty presentations on the Foundations Curriculum, humanities, fine arts, natural sciences and social sciences. Participants also hear from the dean of students and director of Campus Safety. There are sessions on academic transitions, Search/Life, community and diversity, community service, health and wellness and computer services. A panel of current students—a particular favorite—reveals what life is really like at 2000 North Parkway. Most important, each incoming student meets with a faculty member to plan his/her first semester schedule.

In addition, they leave with their ID cards and a sense of what their fall semester course schedule will be. At the end of Day 2, they and their parents know Rhodes backward and forward. In August, despite the temperature, move-in is a relative breeze.

Tom and Jacie Kuchan from Chicago attended Open Rhodes 2008 with their daughter Regan.

"I have a much better feel for the college, its environment, what its values are," Tom said on Day 2. "I know what to expect, the environment Regan will be living in, the opportunities and resources that are available to her."

Jacie enjoyed speaking with current students: "It was very informative and made me feel it's a good fit for Regan."

Jeff Tucker from Franklin, TN, who participated with wife Allison and son Sam, said, "As a parent, I feel

more acclimated to the campus. I have a much better idea of what the expectations are. Hearing from the administration, faculty and students helped me gain confidence that Sam's going to be able to come here and be successful and independent on his own, and that there's a good support system for all of that here."

Sam agreed, adding, "It's also a good way to get to know people."

Jessica Cowan '11, an ORA who went through the first Open Rhodes in summer 2007, concurs with Sam.

"It is a good way to meet people. I know that when the students arrive in August, they'll see a familiar face and have someone to talk to. It's good for parents, too. Last year, my mom remembered everything she heard from the panels and would remind me of things throughout both semesters."

Langford says Jessica speaks for other sophomores who went through the first Open Rhodes.

"It meant so much to them and their parents. But on the flip side, there were a number of juniors and seniors who hadn't had the Open Rhodes experience and wanted to be involved—they wish they'd had that."

This year, 452 incoming students, more than 90%, attended Open Rhodes. (Other colleges and universities with summer orientation programs average 80%


attendance, Langford says.) Of the 41 students who didn't come, most live or were traveling abroad, and a few had conflicting plans. The \$110 it costs for a student to attend (included in the fall tuition bill) covers meals, materials and lodging in a residence hall (women in Robinson, men in Blount).

"Rhodes is unique. Most small, private colleges operate under a 'fall model,' the way Rhodes used to, whereas larger institutions, those with 7,000 students in the incoming class, conduct several two- to three-day summer orientation programs," explains Langford.

"Open Rhodes makes a difference," he continues. "It allows students to make a connection with the college earlier and gives them more time to think about some of the many transitions they're going to have to make, whether it's related to academics or meeting new people and encountering new things. It gives parents an understanding that there are people here who have their sons' and daughters' best interests at heart and who will go out of their way to help them succeed."

Attending Open Rhodes is Step 1. In August, now-confident first-years arrive for an action-packed five-day academic, social and cultural orientation before classes begin. And these days, Parent/Family Weekend is only one month away.

hodes people are very well-connected. In fact, alumni, students, parents, trustees, faculty, staff, friends over time become linked for life in myriad ways.

It all starts in high school, when students who attend college fairs can meet Rhodes Admissions Office staff and perhaps representatives from RAVE (Rhodes Alumni Volunteer Effort). In some cities, Rhodes Chapters—groups of alumni and parents—invite accepted students for get-togethers to learn more about Rhodes.

The next step can involve a campus visit, when prospectives stay with students, meet faculty, attend classes and interview with Admissions.

When students enroll, alums and parents in some of their hometowns throw a send-off party.

Choosing Rhodes is one thing, getting here is another. Around 85 percent of Rhodes students receive some form of financial aid—federal, state, institutional or outside assistance or a combination of any of these. Add to that a history of Rhodes people looking after Rhodes people—more than 50 percent of students attend Rhodes with the help of scholarships or fellowships provided by people who love the college. Students who receive named scholarships sometimes have an opportunity to meet the donors. But there are thousands of others they won't meet—all the alumni and friends whose regular Annual Fund gifts go straight to financial aid and faculty salaries. Students also take courses from some faculty who hold endowed chairs named for people who love Rhodes, and they attend classes, and live, in buildings often named for the donors who provided them.

Relationships deepen throughout their Rhodes years. Thanks to faculty, staff, alumni, trustees, parents and friends, students' intellectual and personal growth flourish inside the classroom and beyond:

- Faculty mentors, whom their students will remember forever, guide them through rigorous courses, projects and research. They suggest and help them secure off-campus internships and counsel them on postgraduate work and careers.
- The Center for Outreach in the Development of the Arts (CODA) connects students with arts organizations in Memphis and around the country, thanks in large part to a grant from friends and the help of alumni and parents.
- The Buckman Center for International Education

connects students with study and internships abroad. Several of the internships are provided by Rhodes trustees, alumni, parents and friends.

- Service scholarships and other programs administered by Rhodes CARES (Center for Academic Research and Education through Service) and the Chaplain's Office offer opportunities for service learning and community service. Several programs are provided by alumni and friends.
- Career Services and Alumni Relations put them on the trail of stateside and international internships and jobs, again, often through trustees, alumni, parents and friends.
- A highlight for Economics and Business Administration students is the annual New York City Career Tour in January, where they meet and network with Rhodes trustees, alumni, parents and friends, learning what it takes to work in the financial markets there.
- Rhodes chapters host career networking events for undergraduates in several cities throughout the year.
- At Homecoming, the Alumni Office sponsors panels of young alumni who live in New York and Washington, DC, to speak to current students about living and working in those cities. Homecoming 2008 added a similar health sciences symposium and a reception with Dan Cullen, Political Science professor who led discussions at several Rhodes Chapters around the country this fall.

The saga continues.

After commencement, some Rhodes Chapters welcome new alums with jobs in their city with, yes, a party, making sure they meet everyone across generations and widening their circle of acquaintances.

There's an old saying that your best friends are your college friends. A quick read of Class Notes reveals who and how many alumni make a point of getting together for mini-reunions on a regular basis. And nowadays, many alums stay in touch through either Rhodes' or their own Facebook and LinkedIn accounts.

Homecoming weekend is prime time for reestablishing old ties with classmates and faculty, yet throughout the year, some alums reconnect in different ways. Alumni authors are encouraged to send two of their books to the Barret Library—one for the Alumni Collection, the other for general circulation. Other alums who are tops in their field are invited to speak to classes in economics, natural sciences, English.

Whatever our relationship is to Rhodes, one could say we are linked (lynxed?)—for life.

#### **Fashioning a Career**

Art History major La'Sandria Ward '09 knows what it means to be well-connected. The Memphis native who attends Rhodes with a Dean's Fellowship and a Rhodes Grant, both provided by Annual Fund gifts to the college, also works on campus part time through the Federal Work-Study Program.

She's also academically well-connected. Last semester, Ward took a class in theater design "to fulfill a requirement."

But her talent for costume design led her professor, David Jilq '79, to suggest she apply for the section he would lead in the summer 2008 Rhodes Institute for Regional Studies. Three students would design the costumes for the January 2009 Opera Memphis production of "Scott Joplin and Treemonisha," a work that tells the story of composer Scott Joplin's struggle to have his opera "Treemonisha" produced during his lifetime.

Ward didn't need

convincing. Nor did Katie Grills '10 and Natalija Kokoreva '10, who also signed on. The three participated in the program as fellows of Rhodes' Mike Curb Institute for Music, created in 2006 through a \$5 million donation from the Mike Curb Family Foundation. Mike Curb is founder and chairman of Nashville-based Curb Records and the family foundation. The institute aims to foster awareness and understanding of the distinct musical traditions of the South and the impact of music on its culture, history and economy.

During the summer the trio thoroughly researched the opera "Treemonisha" and locales in which the Opera Memphis production are set, late 19th-century Texarkana, AR, and early 20th-century New York. They studied history, clothing styles, Joplin's life and a film production of the opera before finally "being turned loose" in

Hancock Fabrics where the project began to come to life.

"We wanted the costumes to be historically correct," explains Ward.

The trio agreed on colors, color schemes, which character should wear what, how the costumes would move, but Treemonisha's wardrobe is still "under consideration." Ward graciously

says she and her colleagues will resolve the dilemma well before opening night.

The group met over the summer with Opera Memphis artistic director Michael Ching, showing him a PowerPoint presentation of their plans.

"Mr. Ching was happy about our color scheme. He said it looked like the one for an Opera Memphis 'Porgy and Bess' production, so

> they could pull some of those costumes and mix and match with ours, which is good because 'Treemonisha' has a 40-member chorus," says Ward.

Ching also liked several of the students' ideas, such as dressing both the chorus of dancing bears in Texarkana and the New York producers in the same suits.

Noting Ward's enthusiasm and work ethic, Prof. Jilg invited her to design the costumes for McCoy Theatre's February 2009 production of Neil Labute's play "Fat Pig," a request she readily accepted.

Earlier in the 2007-08 academic year, Ward took an art history

course from her adviser, Prof. David McCarthy: Topics in Art History—Photographs from the Memphis World, 1949-1964. The Memphis World was an African-American newspaper published from 1931-73 whose photographers included such luminaries as Ernest Withers and the Hooks brothers. The class culminated in a joint project with

the Memphis Brooks Museum of Art, which is mounting an exhibition of the photos through Jan. 5, 2009. Nineteen additional photographs were on view at Rhodes' Clough-Hanson Gallery earlier this fall. The students' assignment: to write the catalogue entries. All semester, they scrolled through microfilm at the public library and scoured the phone book for names of the subjects' relatives in hope of

recording oral histories. Ward has three entries in the catalogue, all won at the microfilm reader; her subjects had no survivors.

Ward's academic connections have taken her into several realms in the community; now she's looking beyond.

"I once told Prof. McCarthy that I wanted to go into costume or fashion design. One day during the Institute this summer, Prof. Jilg told me he and Prof. McCarthy had been talking about me, and they decided it would probably be in my best interest to study abroad. Since then, I've been looking at schools in Paris, along with New York and Los Angeles."

#### **Channeling the Renaissance**

History major Chris Williams is studying to go to medical school. He's also minoring in French. His adviser is French professor Shira Malkin. Next year, with Malkin's help, he plans to study abroad in Aixen-Provence. This year, with physics professor Ann Viano's help, he holds a prestigious physics fellowship. This happens at Rhodes sometimes. It also happens that there exists a peaceful coalition among Williams and the history, French and natural sciences faculty. They work it out. Biology professor Alan Jaslow, director of health

professions advising, gives Williams plenty of help, too.

The sophomore from Baton Rouge, who attends Rhodes with the help of a Cambridge Fellowship (provided through Annual Fund giving), holds the Rhodes InMotion Musculoskeletal Research

Fellowship. InMotion, a Memphisbased musculoskeletal institute, is a nonprofit orthopedic laboratory whose mission is to "reduce disability and to improve mobility for the musculoskeletal patient through translational research." Its research fellowship provides a Rhodes undergraduate research opportunities in both clinic and laboratory for two summers and one academic year. Williams is involved in "determining the different rates of 'wear' among various hip implant-bearing materials in a patient population."

"My main area of focus is RSA—radio stereometric analysis," Williams says. "It's a process that was developed in Sweden where you basically take two X rays and fire them simultaneously at a target point—the hip, arm, leg. In surgery, when the hip implant is put into the body the surgeon shoots tantalum markers—tantalum is a

heavy metal that shows up on X rays—in both the implant and the top of the femur. By doing this you can create a three-dimensional model of the hip, the implant, everything. Based on the position of the beads, you can figure out if the implant is moving, how much

creep there is, how much wear.

Normal X ray techniques allow us
to look at this in millimeters; now
we can see it in micrometers. It's
really good for predicting whether
or not a hip or knee implant is
going to be successful in the long
term. In the past, we haven't been
able to predict that; you'd have
to take it out of people after 20
years and see how the implant has
performed."

Williams' fellowship allows him to work with people from the entire Memphis community. This summer, he worked with Dr. Robert Heck '91, an orthopedic oncologist at Campbell Clinic.

"In that project I looked at different ways to repair a humerus (the long bone of the upper arm that extends from shoulder to elbow) to prevent it from fracturing when it's been attacked by a tumor. In the late stages of cancer, patients develop bone metastases. It weakens the bone, makes it very fragile and likely to break. You remove the tumor and repair the bone in a way that stabilizes it and allows the patient to regain the use of that limb. The goal is to reduce pain and make the quality of life better for that person."

The summer project called for working with cadaver bones, a unique opportunity for a college sophomore, says Williams. At the end of the fellowship, he'll get to work on his own project, form his own questions, experiments, conclusions—"all before I'm a junior."

Back on campus, Williams the realist pursues his love of the liberal arts.

"If the med school thing doesn't work out, or if I decide that being a doctor isn't for me, I might be a teacher," he says. "I'm trying to keep my options open. I'm majoring in history because it's my interest—it's always been my favorite subject,

and I figure if not now, when?"

Having these options, plus getting to know Rhodes people helped Williams choose Rhodes over four other colleges.

"I attended two gatherings for accepted students in New Orleans—one for Rhodes and one for another college," he says. "That's where I decided Rhodes would be the place for me. I looked at the difference between the two kinds of people who went to these schools and realized I fit in a lot better with Rhodes people.

"Rhodes really does have your best interests at heart. That's one thing I've found about this place. My mom and dad are on the Parent Council. Every time they come home from a meeting, they say, 'They're really looking out for you here. They really want you all to succeed.'

"I know that for a fact—the opportunities I'm getting here are unparalleled."









#### **Teaching Across the Board**

Judith Haas, who teaches and serves the Rhodes community across the board, is connected to the college in many ways. An assistant professor of English who also teaches second-year Search and Feminist Theory, she also serves as:

- Chair of Women's Studies, which is undergoing a name change to the Gender and Sexuality Studies Program
- Co-director of postgraduate fellowships with Mike LaRosa, associate professor of history and director of the Latin American Studies Program

• Secretary-treasurer of the Rhodes chapter of Phi Beta Kappa

"In addition to teaching courses such as Chaucer, medieval lit, Dante and first-year writing seminar, I've taught the English Department's contribution to Search since I came to Rhodes six years ago—two to three courses a year in addition to one English course and Feminist Theory in the Women's Studies Program," says Haas. "I've always taught second-year Search, which covers the 1600s to the late 1980s. We begin with Machiavelli and end with a Don DeLillo novel, White Noise. I

like teaching sophomores—I think they can be somewhat overwhelmed in the first year of the course, and by the second, they're starting to have opinions. I enjoy that."

Haas particularly enjoys teaching Feminist Theory.

"It's sort of been my baby, re-working and re-thinking it every year, trying to figure out what students minoring in the program really need," she says. "I guess I teach in the two most interdisciplinary programs in the college—Search and Women's Studies. There are many ways in which they're antagonistic to each

other—for example, much of Search involves great books great men have written, and the Feminist Theory class is critical of that tradition. But you have to know that tradition in order to see the critique. It's very useful to me to say in Feminist Theory class, 'Do you remember what John Locke wrote about equality in the 17th century? Well, here's what he was missing.' I like to have those two traditions to speak to each other, and students need that Search education to understand the Feminist Theory class."

The Women's Studies Program is for all students, Haas emphasizes.

"We've changed the name to attract more students. We've definitely had some wonderful male students, but it's been difficult to draw them in. It's the study of gender, although the topic of women is still a major part of what we do. Some students come in very skeptical, then find themselves challenged. We want to show students that this is a legitimate area of knowledge—that

challenging norms is legitimate."

The program offers a minor, and internships are available at a variety of local and national agencies.

Haas' concern for students is evident outside the classroom. As co-director of postgraduate fellowships, she and Prof. LaRosa counsel students on academic life after Rhodes. Because these are new positions which they began coordinating well before classes

began this fall, there is more to be written on the subject in the future.

Well cast in another leadership role, Haas has worked with the Rhodes chapter of Phi Beta Kappa since coming to the college. A Phi Beta Kappa herself, she holds her Ph.D. from the University of California, Santa Cruz, and B.A. from Wesleyan University in Connecticut.

"As a member of the PBK executive committee, I helped choose memberships and interview students for the Peyton Nalle Rhodes Award. Four years ago, I took over as secretarytreasurer from [biology

professor] Terry Hill. I plan events, the induction, luncheon and visiting speaker every year. It's a nice way to be involved.

"The thing I like best about it is the many second-year students I meet in Search who, two years later, become members of Phi Beta Kappa.

"Doing what I do, you reach so many students. I really enjoy that."









# Fanning the Flame

Rhodes trustee Jamie Augustine '89 has been connected with Rhodes ever since he was a student. The senior vice president of the Memphis office of international investment services company Raymond James firmly believes that "Rhodes is a lifelong commitment if you'll allow it to be."

Augustine, who majored

in economics and business administration, "had a job right out of college working for Doug Southard '75, owner/principal of Southard Financial in Memphis. My

second job was in New York working for Bill Michaelcheck '69 and John Sites '74 at Bear Stearns.

"That made a huge impact on my career," he continues. "In turn, when I came home in 1994 and worked at Morgan Keegan, a lot of people there had interns, but my group didn't. So I immediately started bringing in Rhodes students. It wasn't long before I started getting calls from people in other divisions asking me to introduce them to someone from Rhodes.

"Our students are always well prepared, and I'm seeing it all over again. Doug Lensing '08, who was a student trustee and president

of Rhodes Student Government last year, was interested in the bond market and would talk to me about it. When an opening in my firm came up this summer, Doug came to work for us. He now works directly with me in our strategies group. From the beginning, everyone at Raymond James has been most impressed with him."

Augustine is thankful to this day for the opportunities he had at Rhodes.

"Because of the size of the school you learn to communicate what you know. In my business, it's not just what you know, it's how effectively you can communicate what you know, both in writing and orally," he says.

"For example, Dr. John Planchon, one of my economics professors, dropped an entire letter grade from one of my papers for one grammatical error. I went into his

office and said, 'You've got to be kidding—you're giving me a B on this?' He said, 'If you turn in a grammatical error like that when you're in the real world, they're going to can the project and they're probably going to can you.' Now, when people send me things for review, yes, I mark it up.

"When I was at Bear Stearns I called professor Planchon and professors Chuck Orvis and Mark McMahon and said, 'I have to thank you for the attention I got at Rhodes. I'm coming into a rookie class with Ivy League MBAs. I am so intimidated, but I know I can do it thanks to the quality of my education.' I tell people all the time I can't imagine that I could have received a better education anywhere else."

Augustine, who played football for the Lynx, values lifelong friends and lessons gained at Rhodes.

"My closest friends are a group from childhood and the group from college," he says. "The opportunity I had to play football taught some life lessons. You learn about teamwork and that life isn't always fair, but you have to hang in there for your teammates. And in the classroom, you know you're going to be successful at Rhodes because you have to learn."

Both Augustine and his wife, Tanya, who have three young children, are active in the life of the college.

"My wife didn't go to Rhodes, but she feels she did," he laughs. "I'm not going to force our children to go to Rhodes,

but I will insist they take a long, hard look at it.

"It's never too late to re-engage in Rhodes and stay engaged. It's a central part of my life. So many people have such fond memories of the time they were here. When you get re-connected, you feel like you're still here."

Ken Berryhill writes. "During the 2008 Nashville Film Festival, the paths of movie actress Patricia Neal and me crossed again after 51 years. "When we are gone, Rhodes can use the remaining trust assets for whatever needs they identify," says Larry.




Tricia and Larry now live in Sedona, Az, where they plan to spend their retirement years.
