WHO'S WHO

ANNE-MARIE AKIN returns to the McCoy stage having recently appeared in several roles in NICHOLAS NICKLEBY, most particularly as Nicholas' bride, Madeline Bray. A member of the McCoy Company, she also appeared as Tessa in THE GONDOLIERS and Maria in LOVE'S LABOUR'S LOST last season. Anne-Marie is a sophomore whose primary interests are acting and singing.

MARK CHAMBERS, a long-time artist-in-residence at Playhouse on the Square, is a favorite actor and singer with Memphis audiences. His long list of credits include John Merrick in THE ELEPHANT MAN, the Pirate King in THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE, Jonathan Brewster in ARSENIC AND OLD LACE, Ensign Pulver in MR. ROBERTS, and the Mikado in THE MIKADO.

CHERYL CLARK is a sophomore here at Rhodes and an editorial assistant at the Commercial Appeal. Most recently, she played several roles in NICHOLAS NICKLEBY, and last season appeared in THE GONDLIERS and in SUMMER AND SMOKE as the sultry Rosa. Cheryl is a member of the McCoy Company and the Rhodes College Singers.

DESIRÉE EARL, a sophomore music major and a member of the National Thespian Society, is a singer with the Rhodes College Singers and First Generation. She is making her McCoy Theatre debut in COWARDY CUSTARD, but her high school credits include Nancy in OLIVER and roles in THE WOMEN and THE KING AND I.

BRYAN FORD made an impressive bow on the McCoy stage recently as Frank Cheeryble and in numerous other roles in NICHOLAS NICKLEBY. A native of Rome, Georgia, Bryan is a sophomore business major and advertising director for the Sou'wester.

SARAH JONES is a member of the McCoy Company and the Rhodes College Singers who made her McCoy debut in last season's THE GONDLIERS. A sophomore theatre/music major and a native of Houston, Texas, Sarah likes to spend her free time working with children.

JULIE OWENS, a veteran of the McCoy stage and a member of the McCoy Company, appeared as Bianca in THE TAMING OF THE SHREW, Casilda in THE GONDOLIERS, and Charlotte in BEYOND THERAPY. Julie is a music/theatre major, a vocal student of Diane Clark, and an active member of the Rhodes College Singers.

RANDY SERMONS, a senior philosophy major with an interest in photography and psychology, has appeared on the McCoy stage in LOVE'S LABOUR'S LOST and YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU. Randy is the McCoy Company photographer and can be heard on WLYX's "Faith County" as Luther.

MARK-LANDON SMITH, a member of the McCoy Company, has appeared in NICHOLAS NICKLEBY, THE GONDOLIERS, THE TAMING OF THE SHREW, YOU CAN'T TAKE IT WITH YOU, THE APOLLO OF BELLAC, and THE TEMPEST. Mark is the main script writer for WLYX's "Faith County" and can be heard in the role of Harry. A senior theatre major from Jonesboro, Arkansas, Mark is a member of the Rhodes College Singers and First Generation.
