## THE CASTS

**C. SHANE BEESON**, a freshman English major, appears for the first time on the Mc Coy stage. Hailing all the way from Dallas, Texas, he is interested in both sports and the guitar and was a member of Teenage Communication Theatre (T.A.C.T.) in Texas.

**DAVID BRANDON, JR.** serves many capacities around the McCoy as a junior theatre major. He has appeared on stage in our productions of THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM and THE CHILDREN'S HOUR, operated backstage as Stage Manager for ON THE RAZZLE and is a member of the McCoy Company. He is also a member of the Rhodes College Singers.

**R. BERKELEY BUSH, III**, a native of Yazoo City, MS., has worked in and around the McCoy on crews and in the box office for three years and now makes his debut on our stage. Last fall he appeared as a soldier the Theatre Memphis' production of BILOXI BLUES. Berkeley is a member of Rhodes College Singers and a Political Science major.

KEVIN COLLIER, a junior theatre/ fiction writing major and a member of Company appears in his first McCoy production. However, he has been theatrically involved with a consciousness raising project entitled EMPTY CHAIRS for the past year. Kevin acts as a tutor in the Writing Center, is a member of Pi Kappa Apha fraternity, and is also a partner in "Snake Night Graphics" which designs and produces T-Shirts for the campus.

CHRISTOPHER DAVIS is a familiar face on the McCoy stage, appearing most recently as Little Harp in THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM and George in ALL MY SONS. His off-campus roles include Macheath in THE THREEPENNY OPERA, Lysander in A MIDSUMMERS NIGHT'S DREAM, both at the Roxy in Clarksville, Tn. and Bel Affris in CEASAR AND CLEOPATRA at Theatre Memphis. Chris is a senior media major and a member of the McCoy Company. He will be directing a play entitled HER (by Terry Scott) later this term.

STACY LEE DeZUTTER, a native Floridian, is a junior theatre major with a wide range of involvement at the Mc Coy. She has been a member of the set and lighting crew for three seasons, worked as Stage Manager for several shows, appeared on stage in THE CHILDREN'S HOUR, ON THE RAZZLE, and THE ROBBER BRIDE-GROOM, and is co-editor and source of inspiration for the McCoy Newsletter. Stacy is a member of Alpha Omicron Pi sorority, Rhodes Singers, McCoy Company and involved in the EMPTY CHAIRS project. **CATHERINE ECKMAN** comes to us from Houston, Texas, where she was involved in productions of THE SOUND OF MUSIC, as the Baroness, FATHER KNOWS BEST, as Jeanette, and OLIVER, as Mrs. Sowerberry. She is a freshman and a member of the International Thespian Society.

LEIGH ANN EVANS brings her talents to all aspects of theatre at the McCoy. A senior theatre major, she has been on crew with every show since THE CHILDREN'S HOUR in which she appeared as Catherine. A veritable mainstay in the theatre, she also makes time for her work with the EMPTY CHAIRS project, playing the difficult role of the suicide victim. Leigh Ann also enjoys writing and is a member of the McCoy Company.

**PAJA FAUDREE** is a senior philosophy major with abilities in theatre and writing as well as academics. Last season she appeared in the award-winning THE MISS FIRECRACKER CONTEST and was nominated as Best Actress in a college comedy for her role of Popeye. In addition to her numerous on-stage appearances, she has also worked behind the scenes with several shows. Paja is a member of Mortar Board and won the Jane Donaldson Kepple Award for Poetry, Fiction, and Drama last year.

MARY MARGARET GUTH makes a return to the McCoy stage this season. She is a member of the McCoy Company and Chi Omega Sorority. KRISTEN MURRAY is a junior psychology major, specializing in child psychology but with a strong penchant for theatre. LORI OLCOTT was last seen flying over the stage as the Raven in last fall's THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM. A junior theatre major, Lori has previously worked behind the scenes as assistant stage manager and sound personnel at McCoy and this past summer was member of the Beale Street Ensemble Theatre performing the roles of Stepmother in HANSEL AND GRETEL and The Lenini in A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE FORUM. Lori is a member of the Society for Creative Anachronism and the McCoy Company.

AUGUSTA PALMER is a sophomore theatre major, who recently transferred from Sarah Lawrence College where she appeared as Helen in BABY IN THE BATHWA-TER and made her Mc Coy debut last fall in ALL MY SONS as Sue Bayliss. Augusta is a member of McCoy Company with interests in painting and writing.

**DANA PETERSON** makes her McCoy stage debut as a freshman this year. A native of Huntsville, Alabama, she brings a list of credits from high school including Emily in OUR TOWN, Roxanne in CYRANO DE BERGERAC and Laura in THE GLASS MENAGERIE.

MARTIN RUSSELL, a freshman biology major, was involved last fall behind the scenes as stage manager for ALL MY SONS. Now he makes his first McCoy stage appearance. His high school credits include both on and off stage roles. Martin, however, is a regular performer on the campus lawns as a juggler.

**BRAD SHELTON** last appeared on stage as Goat in THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM and Frank in ALL MY SONS this past fall. Other McCoy appearances include ON THE RAZZLE and LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE. **MISTY K. WAKELAND**, a junior theatre major, is a recipient of the Special Achievement Award in Theatre and appeared last fall in THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM. #### **THE DESIGNERS & DIRECTORS**

**BUCK CLARK** (Director of TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA) is a familiar face in the theatre community. He was director of the Playhouse on the Square's production of GLENGARY GLEN ROSS last year, and he also directed SCRAPBOOKS at Circuit. Onstage, he was seen as The King in HAMLET at Playhouse, and most recently as the Scottish Doctor in MACBETH at Theatre Memphis.

**TERRY SCOTT** (Director of LADIES AT THE ALAMO) wears many hats. He was seen on the stage last fall as Duncan in MACBETT at Circuit and has been in the director's chair for PLATYPUS at Theatre Works, THE SERPENT at MSU, and MU-SICAL COMEDY MURDERS OF 1940 in Florida. Also a playwright, Scott's play, HER, is being directed by senior Chris Davis this term. Terry works here in the Theatre Department as a part-time instructor and is also an employee of Stage Lighting South.

KATHY HAAGA (Scenic Designer) designed the performance space for McCoy's first repertory season, which was so successful we are utilizing it again this year. She has also designed sets for our productions of ALL MY SONS, THE ROBBER BRIDE-GROOM, THE THREEPENNY OPERA, HOUSE OF BLUE LEAVES, and THE CHILDREN'S HOUR and designed lighting for LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE. Among her credits in the community is scenic designer for the Memphis Concert Ballet's NUTCRACKER.

**RENEE WEISS** (Costume Designer) worked on costumes for McCoy productions of THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM, ALL MY SONS, and THE THREEPENNY OPERA. Previously, she has designed costumes for Playhouse on the Square and for Circuit Playhouse. Renee also appeared on stage as Florence in THE ODD COUPLE (Female Version) at Gaslight last year.

**BILL BUSTER** (Costume Designer) was also involved as costumer for McCoy productions of THE ROBBER BRIDEGROOM, ALL MY SONS, and THE THREEPENNY OPERA. Onstage he has appeared in A MIDSUMMERS NIGHT'S DREAM, as Lysander, at Playhouse on the Square, and in MACBETH, as Malcolm, at Theatre Memphis.

LAURA CANON (Light Designer and Technical Director) is a Theatre and Media Arts faculty member as well as our resident designer. She has designed the lighting for all but five productions in McCoy's seven year history. Other credits include set designs for McCoy productions of CARNIVAL, WONDERFUL TOWN, and BRECHT ON BRECHT, and the unforgettable Salome in THE ROBBER BRIDE-GROOM last fall.
