


The Conductor

Tim Sharp conducts the Rhodes Singers, MasterSingers, and teaches Conducting and African American Music at Rhodes College, where he is Associate Dean of Academic Affairs/Fine Arts. He is

also the newly named Director for the Center of Outreach for the Develoment of the Arts.



Sharp has conducted the Rhodes Singers and MasterSingers Chrale at Carnegie Hall, in a tour of Europe, and in several performances locally including events with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra and Opera Memphis.

Sharp is author of the books *Precision Conducting, Achieving Choral Balance and Blend, Precision Conducting Anthology* (Roger Dean), and contributing author to *Up Front! Becoming the Complete Choral Conductor* (E.C. Schirmer) and *Collaborative Creativity* (Free Association). Extended choral works include "An Early American

Service of Lessons and Carols" (Church Street), "Salvation is Created" (Lorenz), "Vivaldi's Gloria for Young Voices," "Christmas Messiah for Young Voices" (Integra), and numerous sacred choral anthems. His extended children's choral work "Mendelssohn's Elijah for Young Voices" (Integra) was awarded the American Library Association's Booklist Award.

Sharp writes the Hallelujah! column for *Choral Journal*, and has served on the editorial board since 1991. He is on the Research and Publications Committee for the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). His research is published in the *Moravian Music Journal*, *Choral Journal*, *The International Musicological Society*, and *The Society for Education*, *Music, and Psychology Research*. Recent professional presentations include ACDA conventions, SEMPRE, the International Musicological Society, Moravian Music Foundation, the Blues Foundation, and College Music Society.

The Organist

Ted Gibboney is Director of Music and Organist of Idlewild Presbyterian Church. With academic degrees from DePauw, Yale, and Indiana Universities and experience in both the practice and teaching of church music, he now organizes worship music and supervises an active music program at Idlewild with both professional and lay participants.
