



If you're coming by public transportation, we can arrange for a Rhodes student to pick you up at the airport (at the designated baggage claim area) or bus terminal between 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., Monday through Friday and between 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. And if you're coming by car...

From the North (Chicago, Kansas City and St. Louis)

Take I-55 South to West Memphis, AR. Make connections with I-40 East going toward Memphis. Exit at Danny Thomas Blvd-North (Exit 1-B) and take first right onto North Parkway. Continue on

From the South (New Orleans, Mobile, Jackson and Birmingham)

Take I-55 North to Memphis and merge with I-240 North. Exit Union Avenue East. Continue on Union Avenue to East Phillips Lane Entrance. Parkway. Turn left onto East Parkway and continue to North Parkway. Turn left at North Parkway and continue to University From the West (Dallas, Denver, Oklahoma Street. Turn right at University to Phillips Lane Entrance. City and Little Rock)

From Birmingham, take Hwy. 78 to Memphis. Hwy. 78 becomes Lamar Avenue. Turn right onto Airways Blvd. (which becomes East Parkway) and continue to North Parkway. Turn left at North Parkway and continue to University Street. Turn right at University Street to Phillips Lane Entrance.
