Hollis Freeman Price, President Emeritus of LeMoyne-Owen College, is a graduate of Amherst College. He holds the Master's degree in Economics from Columbia University and honorary degrees from Brandeis University and Amherst College.

As a churchman he has led, serving as national moderator of the United Church of Christ. As a humanitarian he has led, serving as chairman of the Board of the Memphis Urban League and as a life member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. As an educator he has led, serving as an Economics Instructor at Tuskegee Institute, as Dean and later as President of LeMoyne-Owen College. As a citizen he has led, as evidenced by his receiving the Citizenship Award of the Memphis Newspaper Guild.

The average person would need two lifetimes to achieve what Dr. Hollis Price has accomplished. For in addition to all else, he has served also the Boys' Clubs, the Memphis Board of Education, the United Negro College Fund, the Boy Scouts of America, and the World Council of Churches—and all in one lifetime.

Therefore, it is my honor to tell you that the Board of Trustees of Southwestern at Memphis has admitted you to the degree of DOCTOR OF HUMANITIES with all the privileges and responsibilities thereunto appertaining, in token whereof this diploma and the appropriate hood are presented to you.
