




February 25

Britain's Prince Andrew, presently fourth in line to the throne, married Sarah Ferguson.














































































































Wien, Wien, Nur Du Allein . . .

SRC

Rhodes strives to be a college community where students can develop to their fullest potential, not only as scholars, but also as caring members of the community. Thus, they must have freedom of choice in as many areas as possible so that through experience they may acquire a mature attitude of responsibility toward their community. 

"You are listening to WLYX Memphis: a broadcast service of Rhodes College, FM 89.3"

I usually begin with Bach or Albinoni. Acid Baroque follows the hectic beat of the rock DJs well. 'I have to calm down the listeners who've just had two hours of New Rock. (Oingo Boingo, yourself.) Rock musicians (?) look angry on the record jacket. My classical composers are serious, often sad, young, idealistic. Their pictures belie their music, which is pure joy.

Music puts emotions into me: happiness, longing, forgotten things. I am solemn, confronted with the responsibility of presenting these important things to the listeners. I never know what effect I might have.

One night I began with a Mahler symphony, and considered a Shostakovich string quartet, but the downward trend to despair frightened me.

Beethoven symphonies make fall afternoons more glorious. I only hope they don't make anyone drive off the road, if they're listening in their car.

"We welcome questions and comments from our listeners, or any requests you have tonight. Our number at the station ..." Telephone: "Could you please play Beethoven's 5th Symphony?"

or: Rhapsody in Blue?"
or: Pictures at an Exhibition?"

or: "It's one of those with a number in it. Like Something Number Three by Somebody. In G."

or: "Hey. Led Zeppelin. Now. Aren't you still playing rock?"

or: "I don't know what it's called, but it starts, 'ba ba baba bom,' then all these violins come in like, 'dee dee dum dum doodle

or "What are you playing now? My husband thinks it's Mozart, but I'm not sure."

or: "Please play something slow and sad. I feel very sad tonight."

The quiet in the student center roof is wonderful. I play music for myself and for the air. I imagine students reading, couples listening at the end of their workday, music lovers conducting in secret, people listening in bed before they fall asleep. I try not to talk too much. Classical announcers should never intrude in the experience of the music.

Friends visit me. They bring suggestions of pieces to play. Then I have to hide the copy of People, from which I get my arts news.

Sometimes off-campus people come up, strangers who have heard my shift: "Hi, I just wanted to meet you in person."or, "Oh, are you the announcer? The same announcer I was just listening to? You do not look how you sound." Yeah.

Now I know much more about classical music than I ever would by listening to the radio or to my own small collection. Though my technical appreciation has increased, I still know the music by the emotions it brings me, familiar ones, fresh, every time. Now I love small ensembles, intimate, close-miked. I have also met some new symphonies with wonderful melodies.

Being heard and not seen cures shyness gradually. There is power in this music for us, and hope. I don't need too many words up here. Music is enough.

Changing records, cleaning them, cueing them up, filing them away, filling out logs, taking readings. Comfortable routine. Final selections, midnight signoff. "At this time, WLYX, Memphis, Tennessee, ends its broadcasting day... This is Kathryn Murphy, wishing you a pleasant evening, and inviting you to join WLYX as it returns to the air with jazz tomorrow at 8 am. Classical music returns tomorrow afternoon at 3. Thank you for listening."

WLYX FM 89.3 is an important aspect of Rhodes' public image as well as a source of experience and entertainment for students on WLYX's volunter staff. On the air from 8 am to midnight, WLYX offers an eclectic blend of jazz, classical, and rock music and a small bit of reggae, Blues, Bluegrass, and British Isles Folk Music. The Beach, the Blue Brew, Folklore and the Shelby County Farm and Poultry Show are a few of the contributions by volunteer announcers from the Memphis community. Radio Rhodes' general manager Karen Luvaas has renewed the production studio, giving students the opportunity to produce shows like Faith County and Instrumentally Speaking in the past, and this year's feature, Vocal Chords.
