
### FOREWORD




### FOOT BALL.

One game ended in a scoreless deadlock. The whole season was featured by exceptional play, and the deadly handicap was the woeful lack of reserves.






In the first game of the season, Southwestern trimmed Memphis State 13-7, and followed quickly with another win over Jefferson Barracks to the tune of 25-0.
