SOUTHWESTERN 47—UNION 0

For the first game of the season the Lynx traveled up to Jackson to meet the Union Bulldog. In a game completely dominated by a much superior Southwestern team, Gaylon Smith ran wild, scoring four times.

The first quarter was all Smith's. He crossed the goal from the six yard line in the opening minutes of play and repeated soon after on a lateral from Will Rhea Winfrey. Ed French kicked both extra points.

In the second period, Orenstein proved his right to a varsity berth. Making a beautiful 35-yard run, he then passed to Nettles to put the ball on the one-yard line. Winfrey, on the next play, plunged over for his first touchdown. Bob Porter kicked the point to make the score 21-0 as the half ended.

Smith scored twice more in the third to end his scoring for the evening. Winfrey came through with another touchdown and Lockridge also contributed one. Charlie Perry's running in the second half was one of the high lights of the game.

SOUTHWESTERN 47—SEWANEE 0

Ten thousand fans in Crump Stadium saw Southwestern duplicate their score of the previous week in trouncing Sewanee. Getting off to an early start, the Lynx crushed their foe with two touchdowns in each quarter except the final, when they scored once.

The game had hardly gotten under way when Gaylon Smith sprinted off tackle through the entire Sewanee team for his first touchdown. Two minutes later he added another marker by returning a punt 57 yards. Ed French missed the first but converted the second extra point. Winfrey accounted for the next touchdown by plunging from Sewanee's two, and the fourth came when French scooped up a shovel pass from Smith. Orley Nettles kicked both extra points.

In the second half Southwestern continued to trample the mangled Tigers with touchdowns by Smith, Henry Bergfeld and Harold Jones.

SOUTHWESTERN 0—CENTENARY 6

After holding their more powerful foe on the one yard line for three downs, the Southwestern Lynx finally yielded on the fourth to give Centenary a 6-0 victory before 11,000 screaming spectators. It was the Lynx only defeat of the season and one of the most hotly contested games in the history of the school. The lone touchdown came as the climax to 56 minutes of dueling between two great backs, Gaylon Smith of the Lynx and Weenie Bynum of Centenary, and, although Bynum's team came out victorious, Smith, in spite of an early injury, took his share of honors with superb broken-field running and accurate punting and passing. Twice Southwestern had chances to score but failed; once when Smith dropped the ball on the three yard line, and once when the Lynx were penalized for clipping on a touchdown play.

Defeat might have been greater had it not been for the outstanding defensive play of the Lynx line. Time and again the Red and Black forward wall stopped and threw back the heavier Gentlemen.

SOUTHWESTERN 12—CHATTANOOGA 6

It was a battered and bruised Lynx team that journeyed to Chattanooga to meet the Moccasins, but it was an inspired Lynx team that gave blow for blow and surged to a 12-6 victory over their first Dixie Conference foe. Sparked by the accurate passing of Ickey Orenstein and the spectacular kicking of Rex Wilson, the faltering Lynx gained courage in the last half to overcome the 6-0 lead of Chattanooga.

Near the end of the third quarter, with the score 6-0 in favor of the Moccasins, a kicking duel between Rex Wilson and Hal Wade ensued in which Wilson definitely came out the better, putting Southwestern within striking distance of the Chattanooga goal. A quick pass from Orenstein to Capt. Orley Nettles gave the Lynx the touchdown they sorely needed, but the score remained 6-6 when Ed French failed to convert. At the beginning of the fourth period the Lynx went to work in earnest. By combining passes with end runs, Ickey Orenstein piloted the Lynx machine down the entire length of the field, with French scoring on a line plunge from the four.

SOUTHWESTERN 21—LOYOLA 0

Traveling down to New Orleans the next week-end, the Lynx, again spearheaded by Gaylon Smith, drove the Wolves from the door of victory. Twice in the second quarter of the 21-0 rout the great Southwestern star dashed 54 and 79 yards for the first two Lynx scores and then in the fourth he shot a beautifully timed pass into the hands of Captain Orley Nettles for the other marker. Ed French, Nettles and Rex Wilson added the extra points from placement, and there was the ball game.

It was this game that gave the Lynx their strangle hold on the Dixie Conference title, for it was Loyola that was the only other undefeated team in the conference. The Wolfpack got its only real chance in the first quarter when Joe Galliano fell on a punt dropped by Smith on Southwestern's 16-yard line, but a few plays later a Loyola back fumbled and Frank Morgan recovered. From this point on the game was dominated by the Red and Black machine of Ed Kubale.

SOUTHWESTERN 6—MURRAY 6

For the second time in two weeks the Lynx played on foreign soil. Outplayed consistently throughout the first half, the Southwestern team came back in the second to deal blow for blow and tie the game up at six all. Smith was checked in the first half and when you check Smith you usually check the Lynx. It was a new team, however, that took the field in the second. Smith was right, the sophomore Pete Baker began breaking through time after time to throw Murray backs for losses, and the whole team began to click. Gaylon and the Lynx took the ball right up the field from their own 15-yard line and the score was soon tied when Smith sprinted 20 yards for a touchdown. Southwestern threatened again when they moved the ball down to Murray's 15, but their chance faded with a fumble.

SOUTHWESTERN 46—BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN 7

It took a full quarter for the Southwestern Lynx to get inside the claws of the wary Panthers from Birmingham-Southern, but when they did the Lynx effectively ripped their opponents to ribbons by a 46-7 score. For a time the Southerners put up a stubborn fight, but the game ended in a complete rout of the boys from Birmingham.

Although both teams scored in the first quarter, Southwestern forged ahead in the second behind the powerful charging of Gaylon Smith. With the aid of good blocking by his teammates, Smith scored three times, two of them on runs of 23 and 54 yards.

In the second half the Lynx continued their scoring spree with touchdowns by Luke Dawson, Ickey Orenstein and Bernard Lockridge, and two extra points by Rex Wilson.

SOUTHWESTERN 42—MILLSAPS 0

Coach Ed Kubale used reserves for the most part in Southwestern's 42-0 victory over Millsaps. In the game that cinched the Dixie Conference title for the Lynx the mighty Gaylon Smith saw only 14 minutes of play, but in that short time he was able to run over three touchdowns and kick an extra point. Throughout the whole game the Southwestern team ran ramshot over the Majors gaining 564 yards from the line of scrimmage. Two of the Texas boys showed up especially well in this game. Fred Dress played a remarkable game on the defense from his guard position while Henry Peek's passing and running were the outstanding features of the game.

SOUTHWESTERN 7—MISS. STATE 3

Southwestern saw a dream come true in their 7-3 defeat of Mississippi State. In a game filled from beginning to end with thrills, the Lynx won on a State punt blocked by Bill Little. Midway in the second quarter the end from Texas broke through, smothered Sonny Bruce's punt, and fell on it over the goal line. Captain Orley Nettles then converted for the extra point. The Bulldogs had scored earlier in the afternoon when Bruce had kicked a field goal, but in their touchdown the Lynx gained a lead which they never yielded. Gaylon Smith rose from a sick bed to play one of the best games of his career. He didn't score a touchdown in his last game for Southwestern, but he played nearly 60 minutes of some of the best football that has ever been seen at Crump Stadium. Starting slow, Smith played a marvelous defensive game and climaxed his great season by his 62 yard run in the last quarter. With this 7-3 victory the Lynx ended their most successful season.



BASKETBALL

The Southwestern cage team, sparked by the sophomore George Blakemore, had a very successful season in its first year under Coach Bob Waddle. Reaching their climax in the final Ole Miss series, the Lynx defeated the Red and Blue Rebels in two of the hardest fought games of the season. Although failing to come up to expectations in the Dixie Conference tournament, Coach Waddle's quintet reached the quarter-finals and placed Blakemore on the All-Star conference team.

The Lynx won their first game of the season from a strong Arkansas College team, but dropped their next two cage tilts to Mississippi State by close scores.

In their initial home game, the Southwestern crew beat their city rivals, State Teachers College, by a 33-28 count to put themselves once more in the winning column. The same week the Lynx substantiated their ability to win by hanging a 37-29 defeat on the Sewanee Tigers. In this game Southwestern was aided very materially by the return of Captain Gaylon Smith, who had been out of most of the previous games with an injured knee. The Red and Black quintet made a poor showing on their trip to Ole Miss, however, and the Rebels took two disappointing games.

Returning to their home court the Cats took four games straight; two from Mercer and one each from Memphis Teachers and Arkansas College. Blakemore was outstanding in this set, piling up 69 points for the four games.

On their next trip into Mississippi the Southwestern team broke even by downing the highly touted Mississippi College five after losing to Millsaps 47-28 the previous night.

It was in the return game with Ole Miss that the Lynx played their best basketball of the season, downing the Rebels 48-33 and 49-38. With Blakemore leading a high-g geared offensive, Southwestern jumped into an early lead in both games and was able to stay ahead throughout the contests. The beautiful defensive work of Virgil Cox, Clois Neal, and Levon Self kept the Rebels continually off balance, and Ole Miss was never able to work plays effectively.

The records for the season reveal ten wins against seven losses in one of the toughest seasons in many years of varsity basketball at Southwestern. Although five key men will be lost by graduation, Coach Waddle laid the foundation for the coming two seasons by bringing out several good junior and sophomore players.

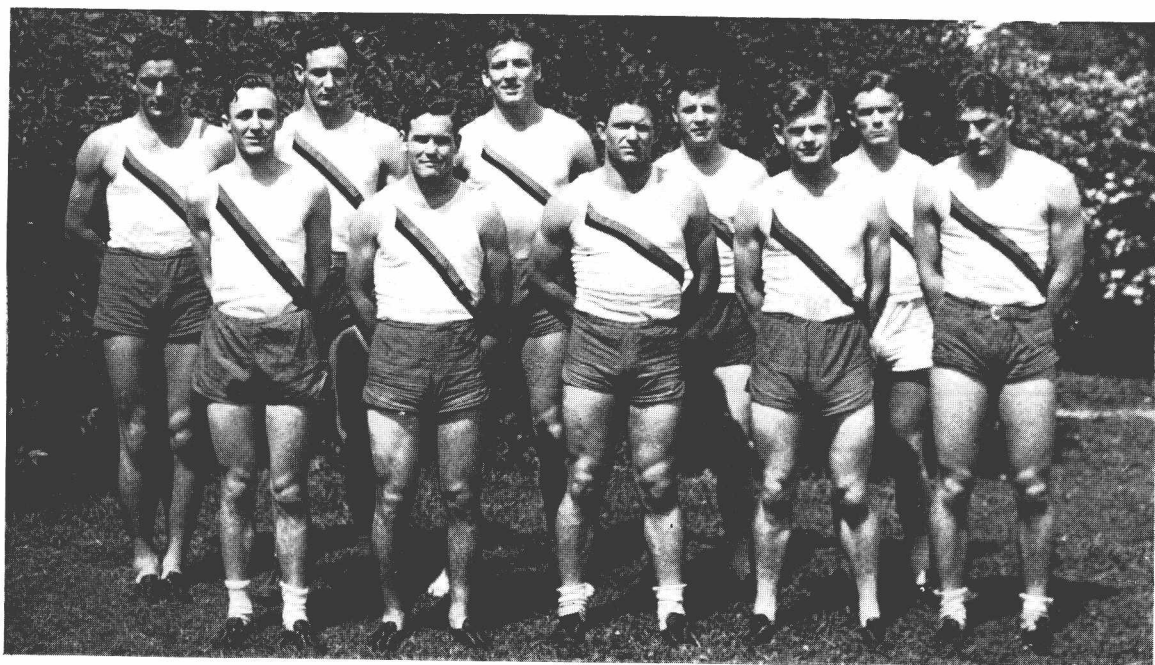

With only a few lettermen returning this season, the Lynx track squad was able to win only two out of their four meets. Reaching their peak in the Sewanee meet, two Southwestern stars were able to break old school records. Henry Peek, the Texas mite, led Gaylon Smith to the tape by a few feet in running Southwestern's first 9.9 hundred yard dash. Orley Nettles, by throwing the javelin 187 feet, also established a new mark. The Lynx were able to down Arkansas College and Sewanee while they took beatings from Ole Miss and then from Millsaps and Mississippi College in a triangle meet at Jackson, Mississippi.

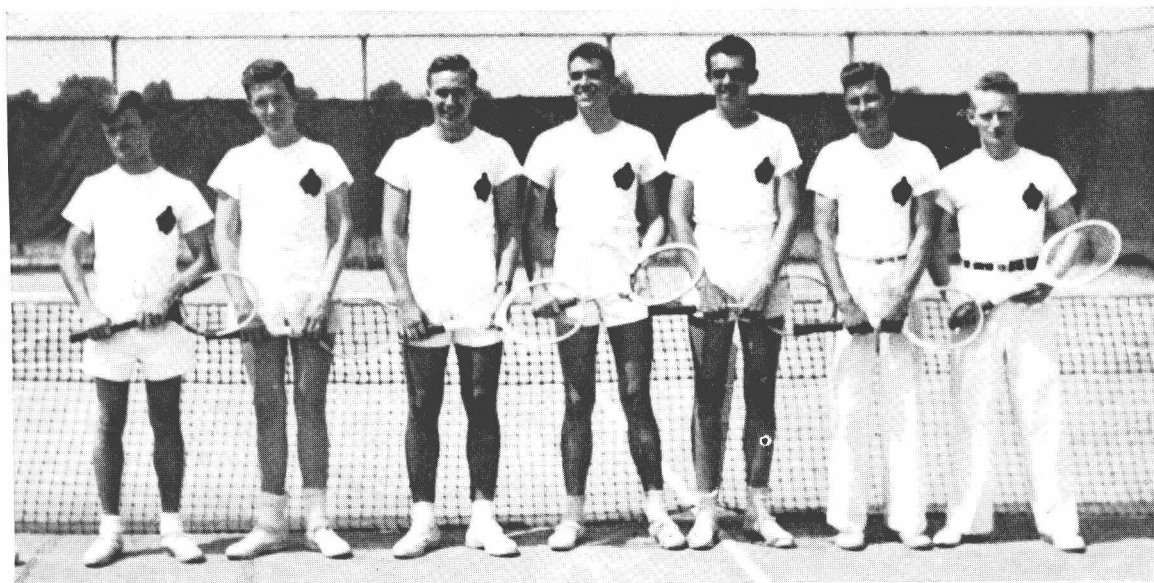
The Southwestern thinclads placed fourth in the Tennessee Intercollegiate Athletic Association meet at Cookeville, with Gaylon Smith hurling the discus 134 feet for a new state record. Other first places won by the Lynx were the shotput by Will Rhea Winfrey and the broad jump by Bob Foley.

TENNIS

So far as tennis was concerned the Lynx had only a mediocre season. In Bob Meacham, who finished the season as number one man, hopes for the return of Southwestern to higher ranks in the tennis world were regained. Although only a freshman this year, Meacham was the one bright spot in the Lynx season. Tom White, who started the season as number one, at times played unbeatable tennis, but at other times his play was very ragged. Rising to his greatest height in the second match of the season with Davidson, White defeated the highly touted Turner in a thrilling match. Waddy West, playing the entire season in the number three spot, played consistent tennis most of the time as did Henry Booth in the number four position. Shepherd Tate, John McGrady and Bill Murrah alternated at number five. In the doubles Dr. Rhodes used every possible combination with little success. From all indications Southwestern will have to wait another year or so before regaining her supremacy on the courts.



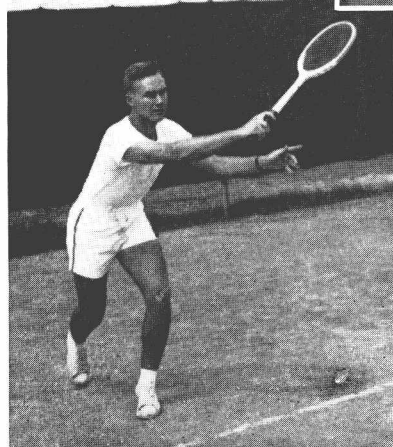
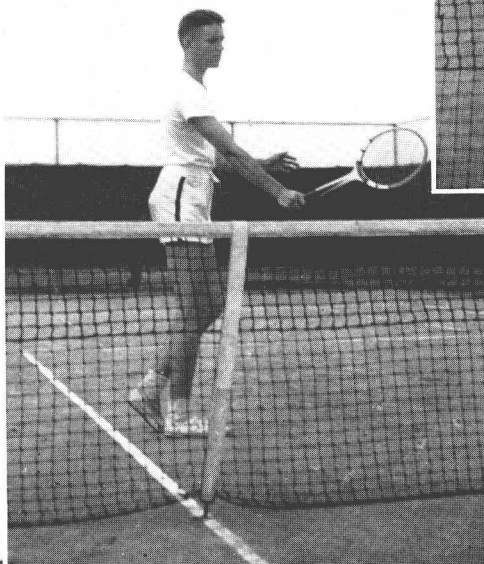
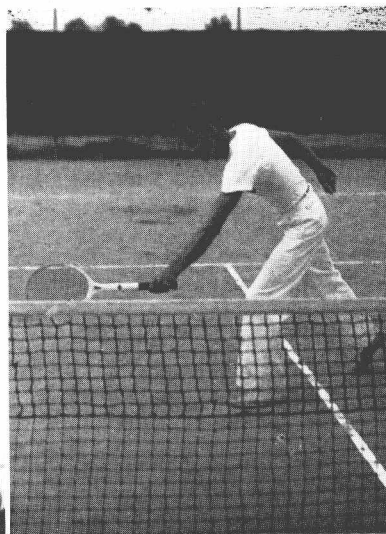

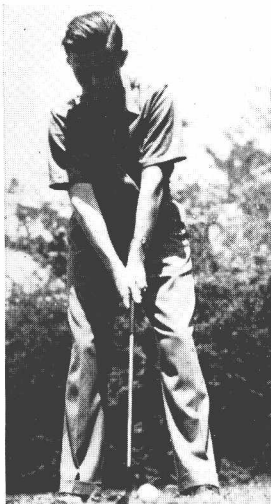


GOLF
