


IN MEMORIAM

Of the men I have known, Rick Mays had, I believe, the broadest and deepest love of people. Although he was a successful businessman, his chief interest was people, especially young people. Why did he devote so many hours beyond the call of duty to the young people of his church, to the Boy Scouts, to his football boys in high school and college? Because he loved them, because he had to, because he was Rick.

To him all people had much good in them, and he made it his business to discover that good and won his full confidence were those he could fully trust and respect as men.

To his boys he was a friend for life: their troubles and difficulties became his burdens, and their honors and successes his joy. So far as I know, everyone loved Rick, but there is no doubt that he gave others more affection than he could ever receive. And he was pleased to have it so.

It is not possible to say how much Southwestern, Memphis, and all who knew him have lost in Rick—



strengthen it, cultivate it, make it grow. He liked to get close to people: where he found a barren spot he cast a seed; and because he loved what was fair and good in them he was free with praise.

In recent years it has become fashionable to refer cynically to characer-building in sports. Rick often said that his principal aim was to win—and it was; but beyond victory there was a more important aim: to help his boys build fine and strong characters. That was the only approach to coaching that he knew or wanted to know; and the only players who not only those of us who owe so much to him in so many ways, but also the boys of tomorrow who would in the expected course of events come under his general influence.

To Rick life was basically an exciting adventure whether on the athletic field, on the campus, or in public or personal life. And he was the happiest of warriors. "My cup," he said, "is always running over." It is a pleasant thought for his friends that up until the last moment he felt that life was very, very good to him.
