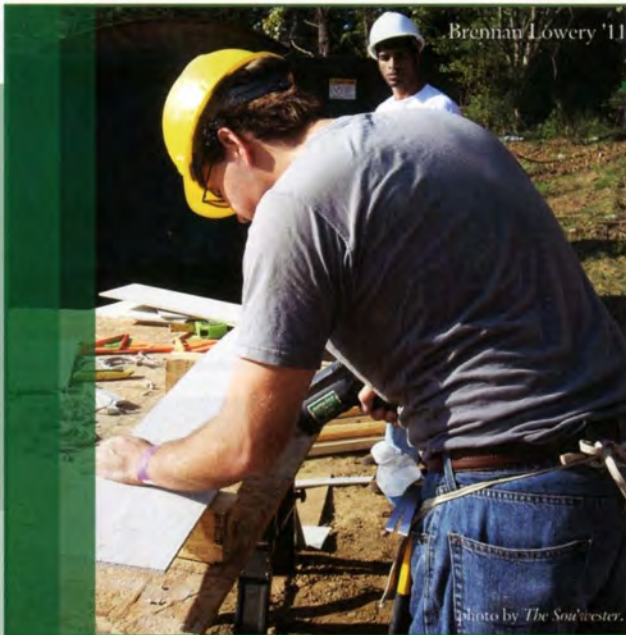

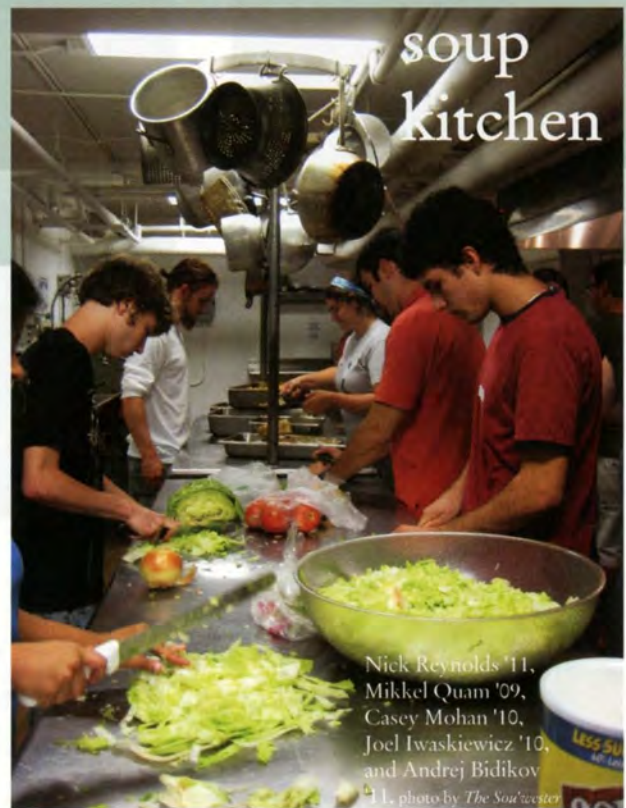

Grizzlies House is a living facility for children who are receiving treatment at St. Jude's Hospital. Playing with the kids helps take their minds off having to go back and forth to the hospital and gives the parents time to call relatives and to rest from their otherwise strenuous day. Bekka said that her "favorite part is being able to interact with these kids and provide myself and my time to play with them while they're going through this difficult time. The hardest part is it's a short term facility, and you get attached to a kid, and then you may never see them again and you don't know how it turned out for them."

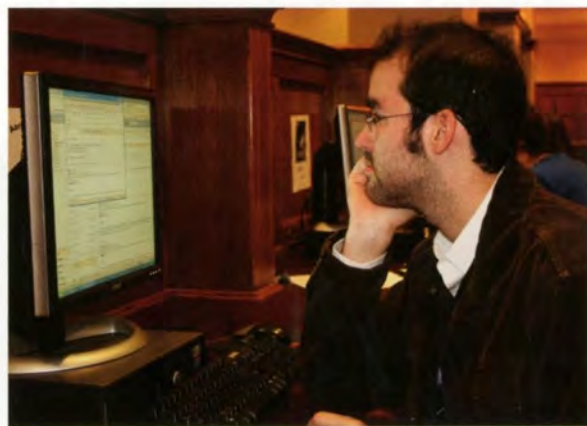

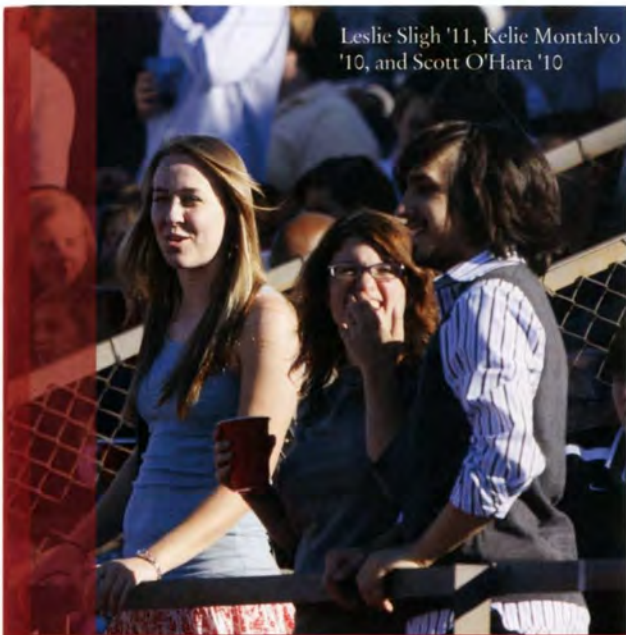
Warren Campbell '08, a political science major, took part in a program by the Heritage Foundation program in Washington, D.C. After working in the American Studies department during the day, where he worked with 35 students from many other small liberal arts schools across the country, Warren spent nights participating in a program called The Fund for American Studies on the campus of Georgetown University. The program included housing, which was located in a prime part of D.C., so Warren was able to experience the many exciting aspects of our nation's capital. When asked what this experience meant to him, Warren said, "For a political science major, going abroad was not an option, because I wanted to study American Government. D.C. was an 'abroad' experience in itself, because it took place in our nation's capital. One of the things that made the experience even more special was the influx of diverse people in D.C."

Haynes Kleimeyer '08 took advantage of the St. Jude Summer Plus Program.

This program spans two summers and the school year in between. Haynes spent this time doing research in the department of Infectious Diseases. "I developed DNA, live-attenuated and inactivated vaccines and tested their efficacy using various immune assays. Through my research, I worked toward the goal of improving our current influenza vaccines." At the end of her research, Haynes prepared and delivered an oral presentation at the Undergraduate Research and Creative Activity Symposium (URCAS) at Rhodes last May. She also gave this presentation at the Orthomyxovirus Research Conference held in Woods Hole, Massachusetts in September 2007. Her work should appear in a scientific journal by the end of this year. After following a number of doctors in the field, Haynes has decided to specialize in infectious diseases as a pediatrician.
