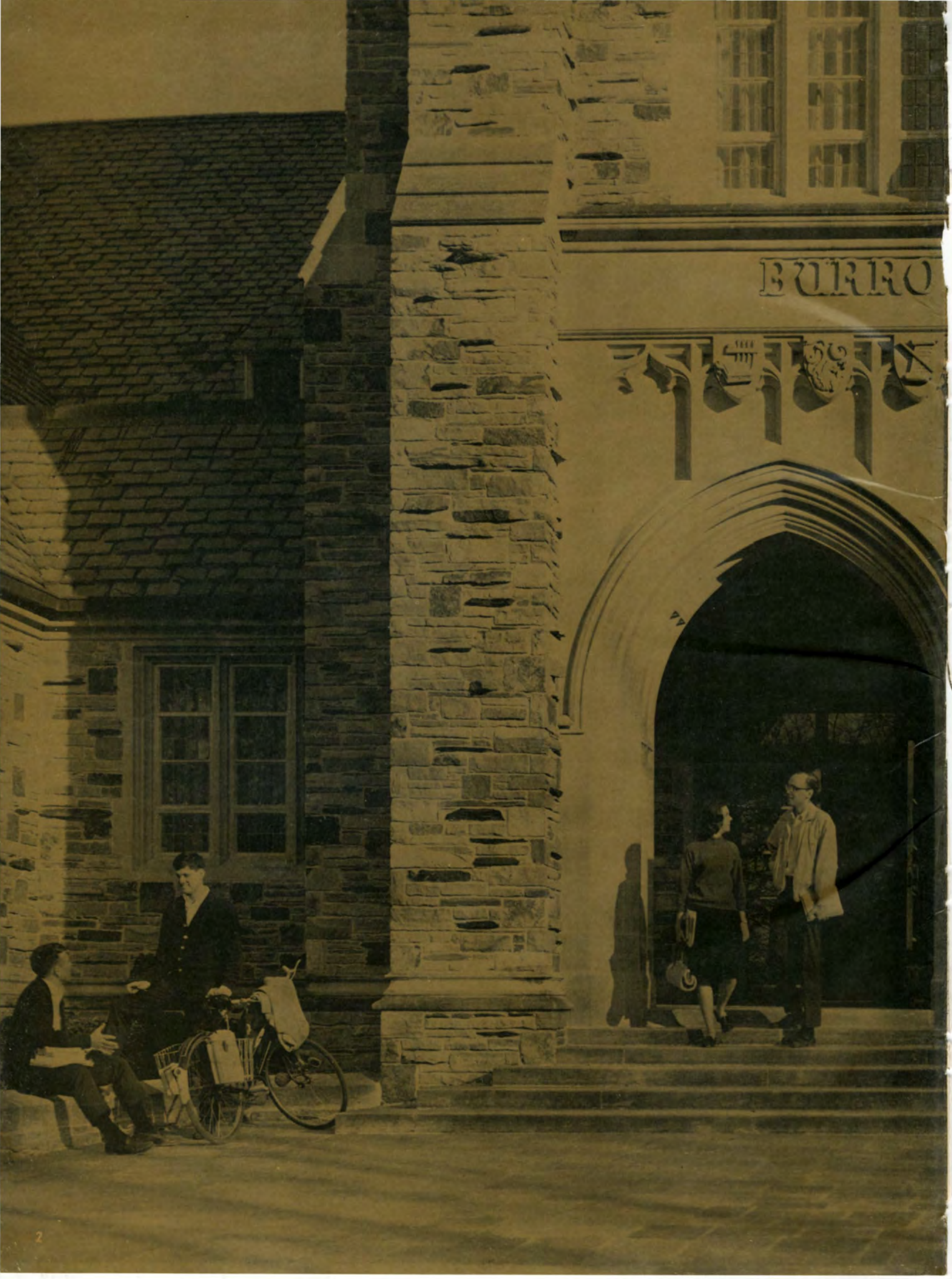

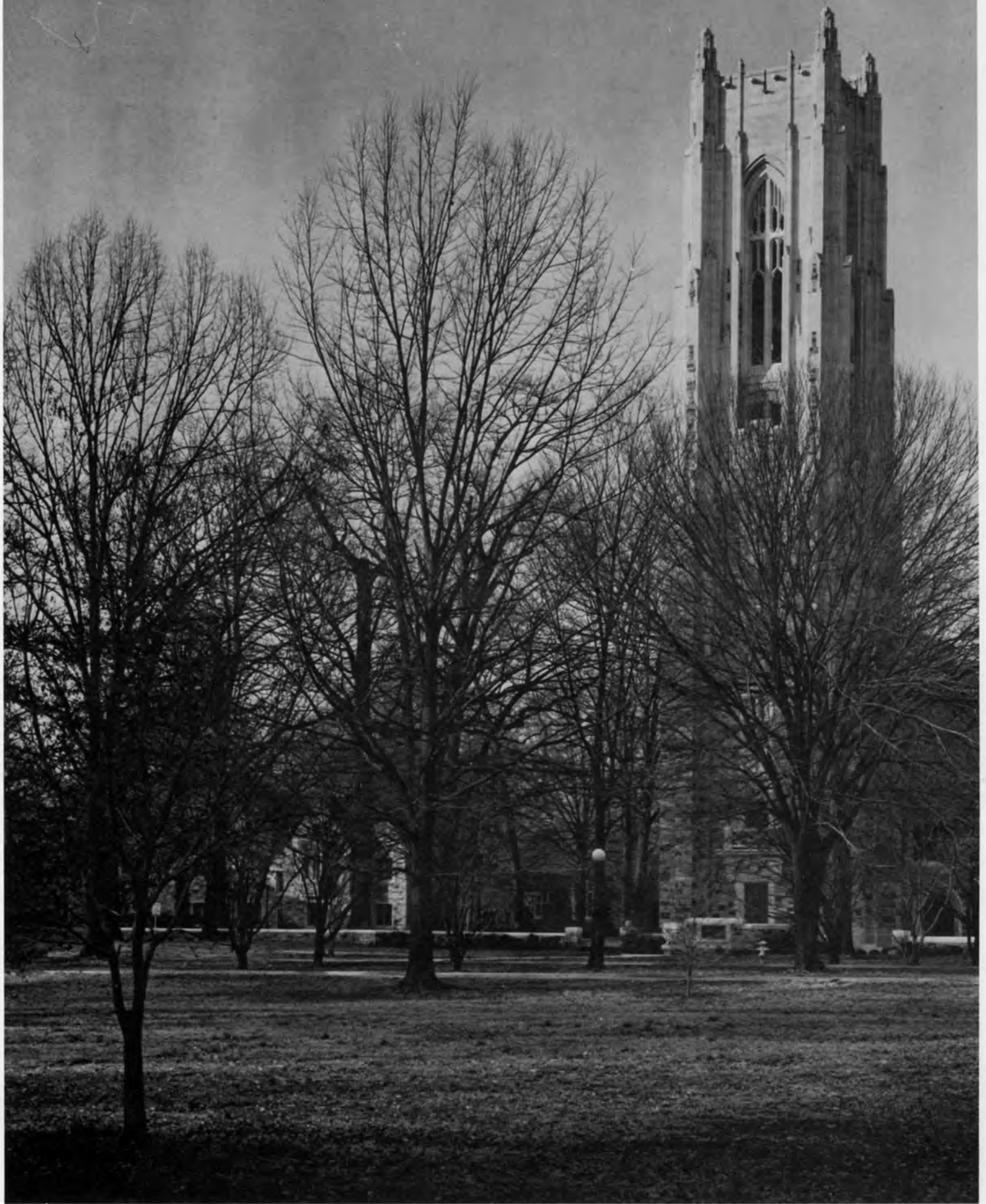

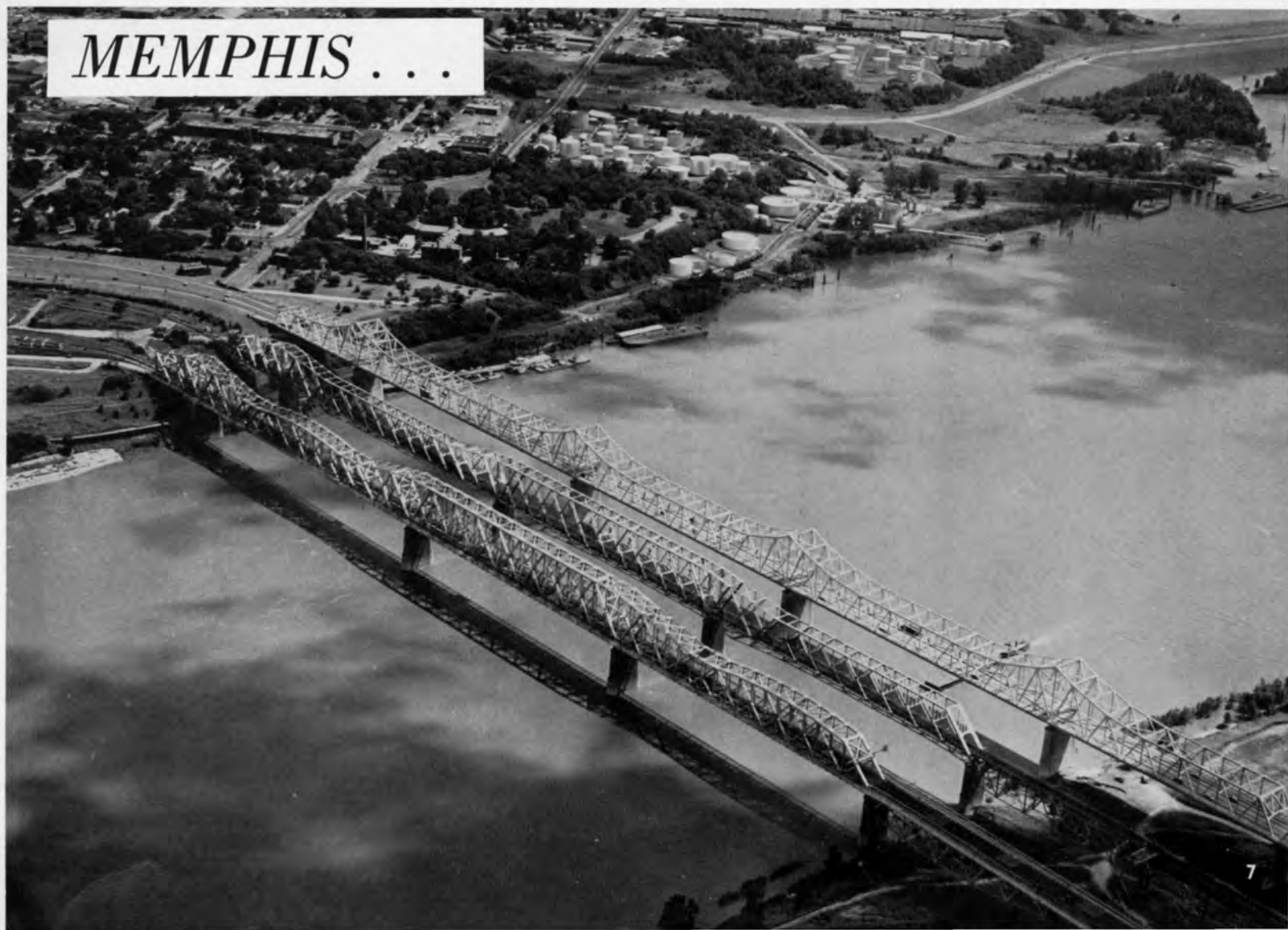
FOREWORD

He does this by encouragement, by kindness, by understanding guidance, but most of all, by example. Such an educator is Dr. Peyton Nalle Rhodes, President of Southwestern since 1949.

During Dr. Rhodes' administration campus facilities have nearly doubled, with the addition of three residence halls, the Mallory gymnasium, the Burrow Library, the Moore Infirmary, the Catherine Burrow Refectory, the Richard Halliburton Memorial Tower and tower building, Tuthill Hall, the president's home, and the proposed Thomas W. Briggs Student Center. One of the nation's outstanding programs of adult education has been developed at Southwestern, and because of his leadership in this field he has been named president of the University Council on Education for Public Responsibility. He is much in demand as a speaker, committeeman, chairman, ambassador, and official for numerous organizations.

The confidence which Dr. Rhodes places in the ability of each Southwestern student, and his concept that success is not the exception, but the rule may be cherished as prized possessions by those whose lives he has enriched as college President.

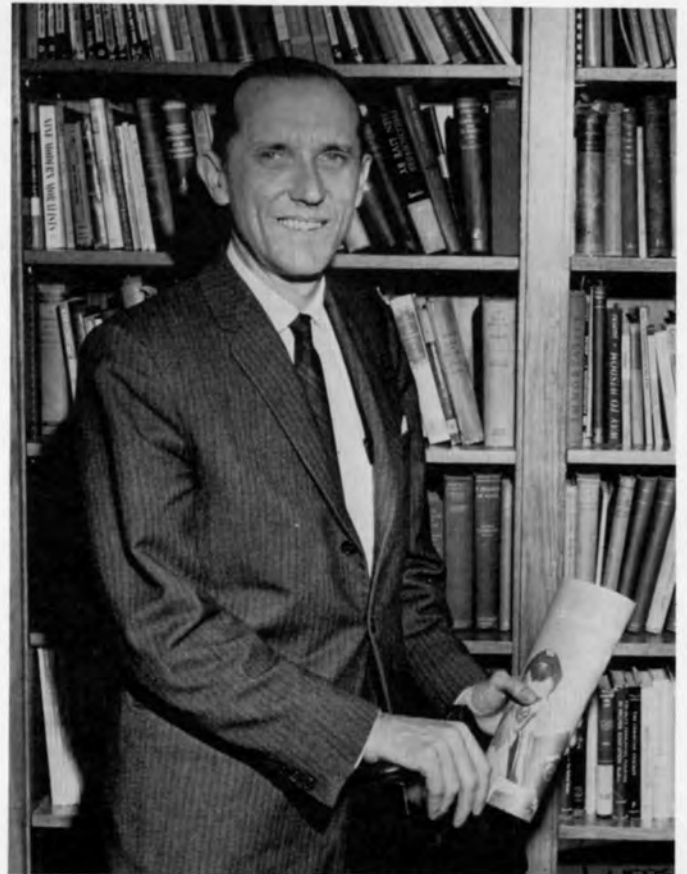

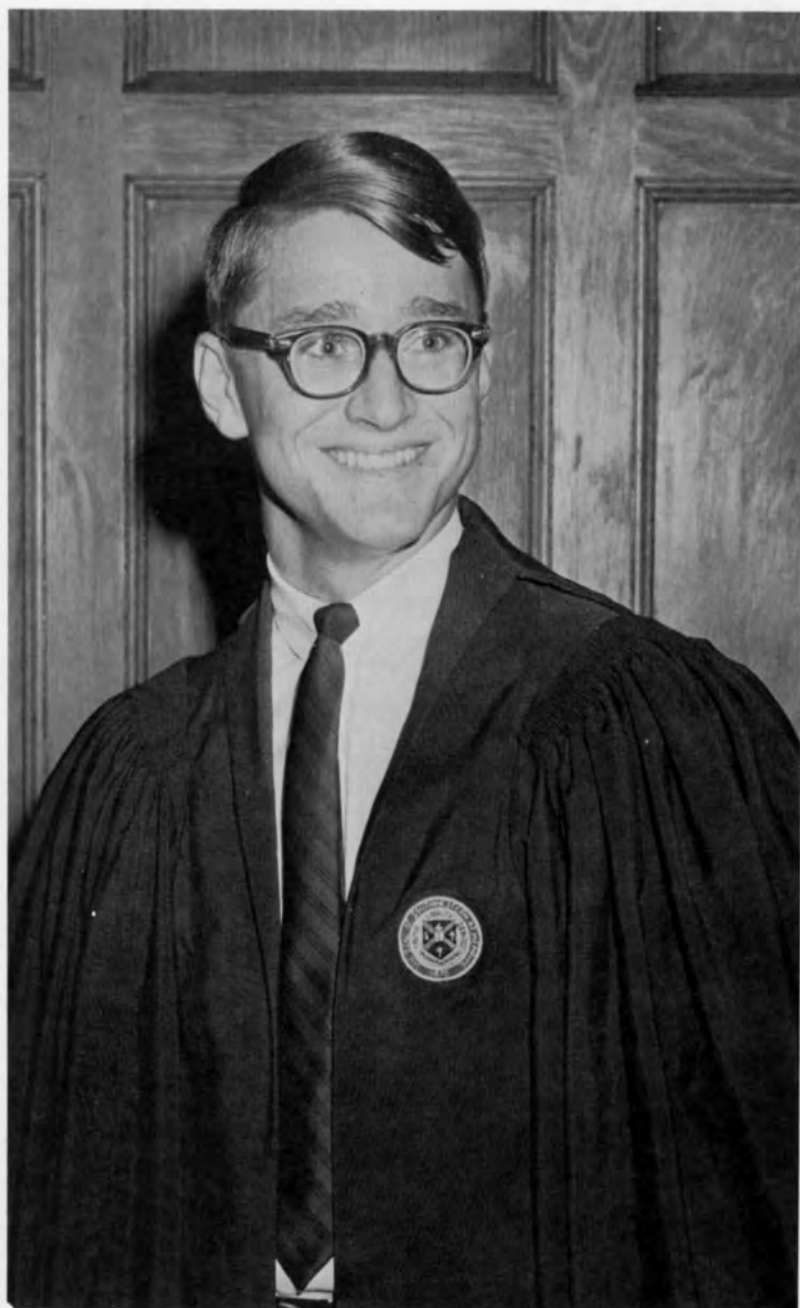
HONOR COUNCIL

ROUGH SEASON FOR LYNX

Although the 2-5-1 record compiled by the Lynx football team is not the most outstanding record ever produced by a Southwestern football squad, our team had some outstanding accomplishments worthy of note.

Jesse Johnson, former Arkansas State coach, became the head Southwestern football coach this year. Many changes were brought about by the Johnson brand of football, one of which, spring practice for the grid squad, has not been seen at Southwestern for some time.

There were numerous individual honors received by the Lynx. Bert Chafin wound up the season re-writing College Athletic Conference records. Chafin holds new records with 58 completions, 895 yards passing, and eight touchdown aerials for the year.

Quarterback Bert Chafin, guard Willie Edington, and tackle Challice McMillin were rewarded for their outstanding effort by being selected on the All-CAC team. Also receiving honorable mention on the team picked by the conference coaches were Lynxmen Ray Baker, end; John Treace, guard; Bill Sutton, center; and backs Bill Harwood and Scott Hallford.

The Lynx lost six senior lettermen from the squad at season's end. End Bob West, halfback Scott Hallford, center Bill Sutton, tackle Challice McMillin, fullback Randy Kyle, and Bill Harwood have finished their grid careers for the Lynx.

At the annual Southwestern football banquet, two sophomores, quarterback Bert Chafin and line-backer Butch Lightsey, received the most valuable back and lineman award respectively. Twenty-two members of the sophomore-laden Southwestern squad received letters, giving the Lynx hope for an experienced 1964 squad.

LYNX OPEN IN 13-13 DEADLOCK

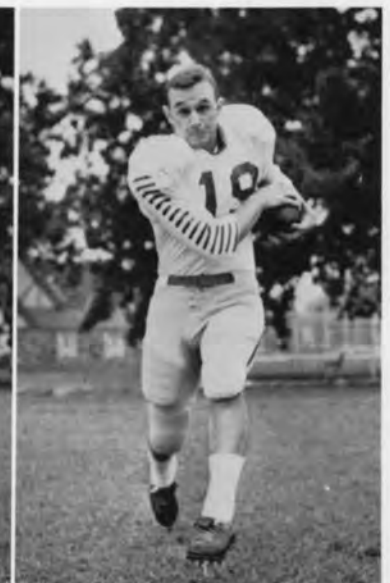

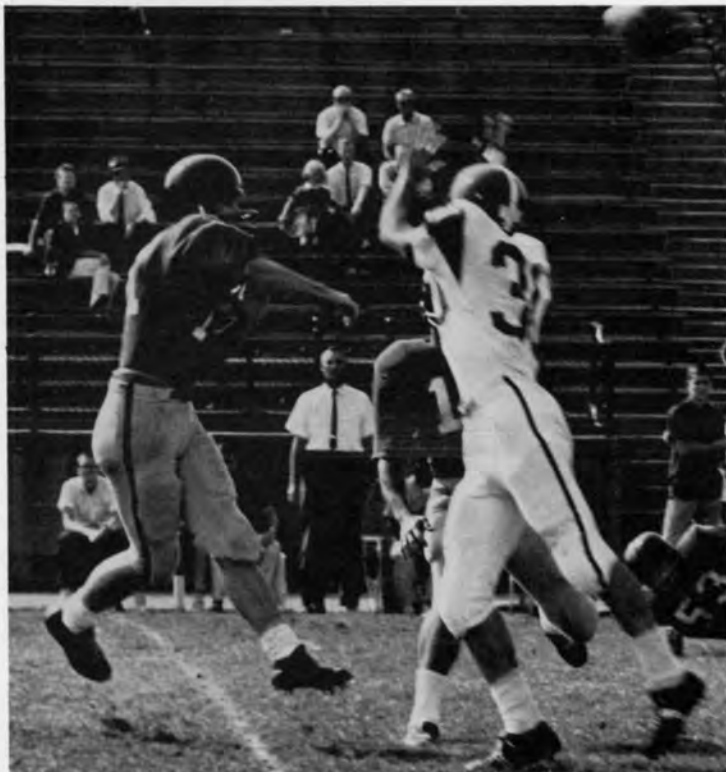

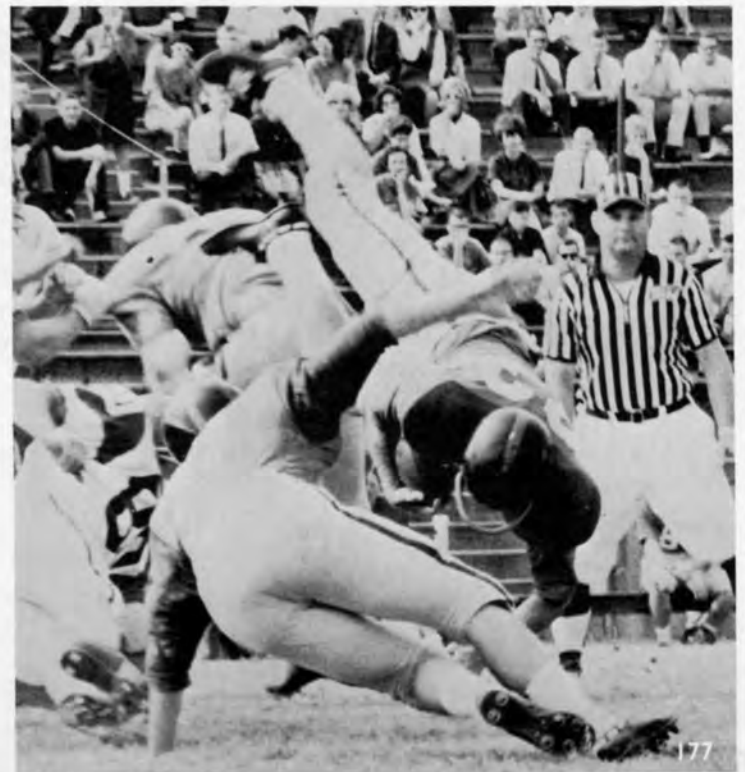
SOUTHWESTERN COASTS TO VICTORY 45-13

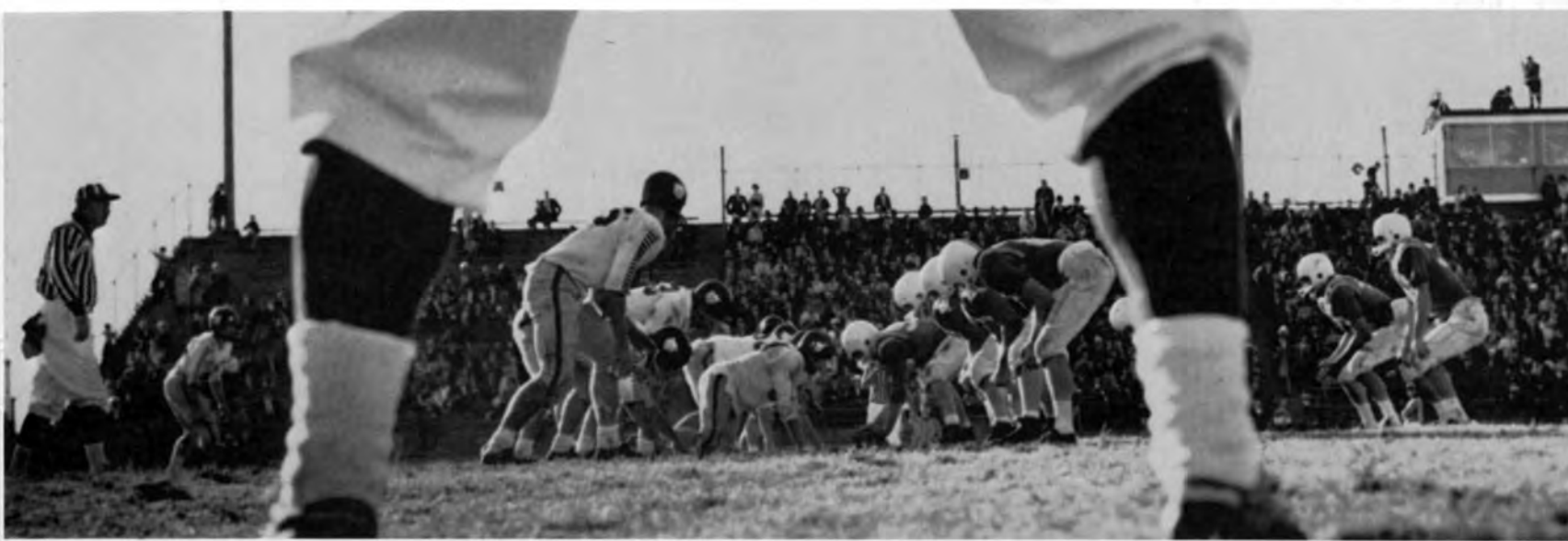

HAIL LYNX-CAC CHAMPS

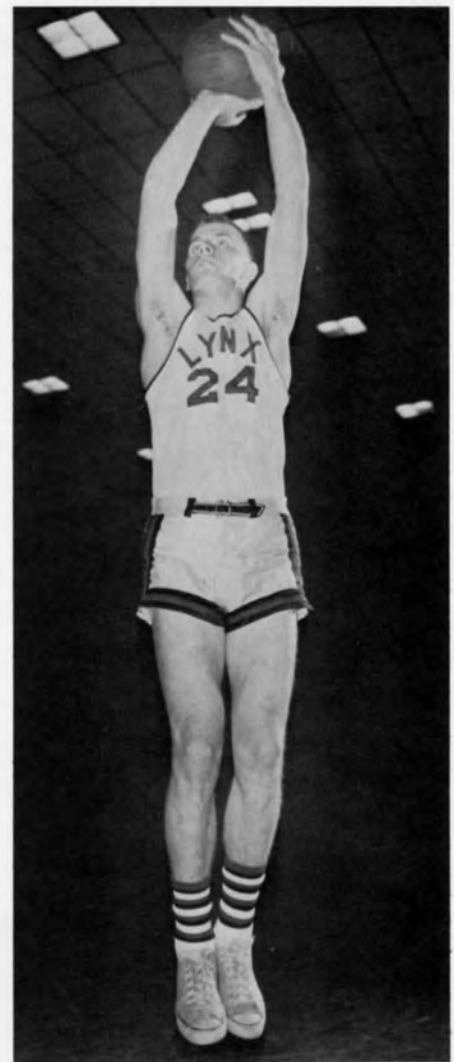
