

Rhodes at a Glance



Founded in 1848, Rhodes is a private, residential, coeducational college of liberal arts and sciences. Its 1,700 students choose among 32 majors leading to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. The college also awards a Master of Science degree in Accounting.

One of the few selective U.S. liberal arts colleges located in an urban setting, Rhodes occupies 100 wooded acres in midtown Memphis. The campus has been nationally recognized for its adherence to the standards of collegiate Gothic architecture and has been frequently cited as one of the most beautiful in the nation. The college has a strong tradition of service, with 80 percent of all students involved in community service activities. Widely recognized as a top-tier liberal arts college, Rhodes is governed by a student-administered honor code.

Hallmarks of a Rhodes education are the strong mentoring relationships between students and faculty and the emphasis on the synergistic relationship between classroom learning and experiential activities such as research, internships, service and study abroad.

- The College's 1,700 students are a diverse group, representing 43 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 foreign countries.
- The student/faculty ratio is 10.5:1, and the average class size is 13.
- 95% of faculty members have a doctoral degree or the highest degree in their discipline.
- There are 24 academic departments with 8 interdisciplinary majors. The most popular majors: Business Administration, Biology, Political Science, and English.
- 74% of students live on campus in one of the 15 residence halls.
- Active students: 83% participate in community service; 75% participate in academic internships at 100 local, national, and international employers; 65% participate in intramural and club sports (27% varsity).
- Rhodes and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital
 have formed a partnership to create a formal research
 program for students. This program, launched in the
 summer of 2003, provides stipends and mentoring
 for 12 Rhodes students who participate in cuttingedge research.
- Very successful graduates: twice national average acceptance rate to medical school (AMCAS data); over 95% admissions to business, divinity and law schools (Career Services surveys); top employers: Ernst & Young, Morgan Keegan, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Teach for America and Youth Villages.
- In 2006-2007 Rhodes Field Hockey players studied abroad in New Zealand, South Africa, and Italy.
 Other players had internships at St. Jude, Youth Villages and Hope House.

2007 Season Preview



Sophomore Laura Deines

The Lynx look to contend for a fourth straight regular season conference title as well as a third SCAC Championship in 2007. Rhodes will take to the road opening weekend to play at the Black Eyed Susan Tournament in Balitmore. The tournament field includes two preseason top 20 teams which gives the Lynx a chance to make a big impression right away. The Lynx will play their most challenging schedule yet, with 18 total games including 15 in region and 10 conference games. This year's team will rely on depth, returning 16 players from last year's squad including 7 starters and several other key contributors.

The offensive efforts will be led by senior forwards Jenny Mueller and Katie Slimp as well as sophomore Callie Borgman. The trio scored 16 goals and tallied 5 assists in 2006. This group of seniors will be supported by strong group of speedy and skilled newcomers on the front line including Erin Atmar, Lindsey Gurkovich, Kelly Kriegshauser, and Hillary Relyea.

The Lynx midfield returns three year starter Sara Haney in the midfield and expect key contributions from seniors Kacie Ross and Brittany Solar as well as junior Morgan Jane Mischer. Freshmen Charlie Wagner, Libby Feaster, Kelly Prak and Claire Mantovani are expected to make an immediate impact on the Lynx midfield this season as well.

On the defensive end the Lynx return senior three year starter O'Brien Wolff and sophomore Kristen Lee, both SCAC Newcomers of the Year and All Conference selections. Rhodes will look to junior Maria Cowley and senior Meredith Spencer as well as sophomores Laura Deines and Sarah Crowley to make strong contributions on the field this year. The returnees will be joined by a talented freshmen class of defenders that includes Rachel Webb, Grier Haney, Alyssa Nucaro and Megan Cleary. Three talented sophomore goalies, Julz Anderson, Meghan Cullen, and Valerie Clarke will return to the last line of defense for the Lynx in 2007.

After finishing ranked 2nd and 3rd in the Great Lakes Region the past four seasons the Lynx look to earn a spot at the top of the poll for the first time, defend their conference title, and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament in 2007.

Jane Wells Head Coach

Wells enters her third year at the helm for the Lynx after a 2006 season that included a SCAC Conference Championship and regional rankings as high as second. In the four seasons she has been with the program,



Rhodes amassed an overall record of 36-25 and captured two SCAC Championships (2004 and 2006) and three regular season titles (2004-2006). Wells' coaching resume also includes 3 years of directing the field hockey program at Camp All Star ('03-'05), a summer sports camp in Maine as well as two weeks coaching for Gateway Field Hockey Camps in 2007.

A native of Richmond, VA, Wells is a Rhodes Alumna, having received her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology with a minor in Sociology in 2003. Since graduation she has been employed at Rhodes serving first as the Assistant Coordinator of Recreational Services, working with the intramural and club sports programs as well as assisting with field hockey and softball and adding Head Field Hockey Coaching responsibilities in March of 2005.

As a student-athlete at Rhodes Wells competed in 3 seasons of field hockey and softball. While sidelined her junior year with a knee injury, she was able to serve as a student assistant coach for both sports. As a student assistant coach she helped guide the Lynx field hockey squad to their first conference championship, a KIT title in 2001. She captained both teams as a senior and served on the Student Athlete Advisory Committee. Wells was an All Conference Selection as well as an NFHCA Academic All American.

In addition to her coaching responsibilities Wells continues her role as the Assistant Coordinator of Recreational Services, working with intramural programming.

Brett Lee Assistant Coach

Originally from California, Brett's playing experience includes the US Under 21 National Team (1984) and participation in the US Sports Festival (USA North Team '85, '87, '91). Brett began playing field hockey at UC Berkley and continued on to play at



the London School of Economics, Tulse Hill Hockey Club, and the San Francisco Field Hockey Club. Brett has coached in the USFHA Futures Program and he has also worked with the UC Davis Field Hockey Club. To keep his hockey knowledge current Brett travels to Europe every summer to play in a tournament or two and also attends the NFHCA Coaches Convention. The Lynx are excited to have Brett back for his second year as an assistant and look to benefit from his experience with international play.

Ram Kubal Assistant Coach

A native of Bombay, India, Ram grew up playing hockey and continued his career through college at Bombay University where he was a two year captain. After completing his undergraduate education Ram moved on to graduate studies at Clemson



University. Ram is very excited to return to Rhodes Field Hockey for a third season and brings tremendous small skill knowledge to the staff.





2006 Season Review

The Lynx competed for the top spot in the conference and the region throughout the 2006 season, ranking as high as 2nd among teams in the Great Lakes Region. The Lynx finished regular season play as SCAC Champions with a 5-1 regular season conference record and went on to capture the SCAC Tournament title, highlighted by a championship game win on their home field, pushing their overall record to 11-7, including 11-4 in the Great Lakes Region and 7-1 in conference play. Rhodes out scored their opponents 36 to 27 on the season. The Lynx placed four players on the 2006 All Conference Team, including freshmen Kristen Lee, the 2006 SCAC Newcomer of the Year. Seniors Elizabeth Erny and Hilary Mast were First Team All Region honorees. Throughout the season the Lynx racked up 8 SCAC players of the week and Rhodes' Hilary Mast was selected to participate in the NFHCA North/South Senior All Star Game. Senior Elizabeth Erny was the first field hockey player to win the Rebecca Risch Gay Award which goes to the most outstanding senior athlete at Rhodes. Junior Brittany Solar was honored with

the SAAC Student Athlete of the Year award for her contributions to the Rhodes community in the classroom as well as on the field hockey field and basketball court. The Lynx selected junior defender O'Brien Wolff as their 2006 MVP. The team was also recognized with the NFHCA National Academic Team Award and earned a 3.16 GPA for the semester. Six players qualified for the NFHCA National Academic Squad and ten secured spots on the SCAC Honor Roll.



SCAC Profile

The Southern collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) was formed to provide an association through which the member institutions may encouragee organized competition in intercollegiate sports among teams representative of their respective student bodies. Members of the conference share a commitment to priority of the overall quality of academic standards and quality educational experiences.

The conference was founded and began operating on September 1, 1962, as the College Athletic Conference (CAC). Centre College, Southwestern at Memphis (now known as Rhodes College), The University of the South (Sewanee), and Washington and Lee University were the four charter members of the conference. Later in 1962, Washington University of St. Louis became the fifth member and the CAC remained unchanged until 1972.

Following membership changes throughout the 1970s and 1980s, the conference went through restructuring and renaming. With the addition of Millsaps College and Trinity University in 1988 and Hendrix College and Oglethorpe University in 1991, membership reached a then all-time high of eight. In 1991, the conference renamed itself the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference, its first full-time commissioner Steve Argo was hired, and a conference office was established in Atlanta, Georgia. The SCAC added Southwestern University in 1993 with participation beginning in the 1994-95 academic year. In 1997-98, the SCAC added DePauw University with participation beginning in 1998-99.

Austin College and Colorado College were confirmed as members of the league in 2005 with participation beginning in the 2006-07 academic year. Birmingham-Southern College has been approved as the 12th member of the SCAC with play in 2007-08, though as a provisional member of Division-III, its games will not count toward conference standings.

The conference and its member institutions are committed to maintaining high academic standards. The member institutions are committed to the principle that a quality college athletics program is beneficial to the well-being of an institution in that it benefits the entire campus community as well as the student-athletes.

With nine member institutions maintaining Phi Beta Kappa chapters on their campuses, the SCAC boasts some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the nation. SCAC schools are consistently ranked among the top 50 colleges and universities in the nation in such respected publications as Barron's, Peterson's, Princeton Review and National Review College Guide.

SCAC member institutions maintain consistent enrollments through very selective admissions standards and continuing quality education.
