You don't have to wait until October to get involved in your Reunion. You can:

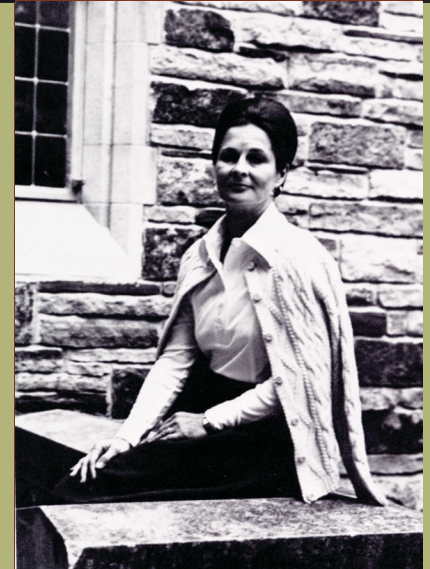
- Join your class's programming or fundraising committee, or share your ideas with your planning committee.
