## Baccalaureate Speaker Is William Morris Ford

Dr. William Morris Ford, Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Longview, Texas, will deliver the Baccalaureate sermon on June 5 in Evergreen Presbyterian Church.

He is a graduate of Southwestern, of the class of 1930, and will therefore be celebrating the twenty-fifth anniversary of his graduation.

After he received his A.B. degree from Southwestern he went to the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville where he was granted the degrees of Bachelor of Divinity, Master of Theology, and Doctor of Philosophy.

His earlier pastorates were at Speed, Indiana, Kansas City, Missouri, and Jackson, Tennessee.

He has served as trustee of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, the Southwest Baptist and East Texas Baptist Colleges and of Union University of Jackson, Tennessee. He is now a trustee of Baylor University and chairman of the committee on benevolence for the Baptist Convention of Texas.

While Dr. Ford was in Southwestern he was considered a good student and a well-rounded college man. His major subject was Greek, and he was very active in extra-curricular affairs, particularly in basketball and track. His record in the pole vault is an all-time high for Southwestern athletes.

For some years it has been customary for the Baccalaureate speaker to be selected from among the alumni who received their degrees twenty-five or fifty years ago.

## Many Reunions Planned For Alumni Day, June 4

Fritz Heidelberg, Chairman of the Class of 1930 Reunion Committee, and the members of his committee, Gladys Gibson Hall, Ellen Goodman Ewing, Bobby Lloyd, and Dick Holladay, are working hard on getting a large turnout of their class back on the campus for the reunion.

In addition to the luncheon at 12:30 p.m., and the supper at 6:00 p.m., a class meeting has been scheduled for 5:00 p.m. in the Sigma Nu Fraternity House. Members of the faculty who were teaching at Southwestern in 1930, and who are still at the College, have been invited to the meeting.

Also on the program will be the election of class officers to serve for the next five years. After the meeting class members will adjourn to the campus south of Palmer Hall, where tables will be reserved for them at the Alumni Supper.

Equally enthusiastic about its reunion is the Class of 1950, celebrating its fifth. The Reunion Committee, composed of Chairman Denby Brandon, Jr., Mary Ann Ramsey, and Bill Coley, is doing a fine job of getting in touch with their former classmates. Indications are that this class will be well represented at the luncheon and the supper.

The SAE Fraternity House has been chosen as the place for the class reunion meeting, which will begin at 5:00 p.m. The class plans to elect its new officers at the meeting.

Charlotte Stange Byrd, a member of the Class of 1935, is having an open house at her home for her former classmates on the evening of June 4. Members of the Class of 1935 will be celebrating their twentieth reunion.

Any of the other reunion classes desiring to hold some kind of special function in connection with their reunion will get the fullest cooperation from the Alumni Office.

## C. Scott Fletcher Will Speak at Commencement

C. Scott Fletcher of Pasadena, California, President of the Fund for Adult Education, which is an affiliate of the Ford Foundation, will deliver the Commencement address on Southwestern Campus next June 7.

Mr. Fletcher has had a brilliant and colorful career. He was born in Sydney, Australia, and was educated at Newington College and the University of Sydney.

Early in his business career he became affiliated with the offices of the Studebaker Corporation in Australia and proved so successful that in 1929 he was asked to come to the home office of Studebaker in Indiana. Two years later he was made managing director of the company for Australasia.

His business responsibilities took him as far north as China, Japan, the Philippines and Korea and carried him to such widely distant places as South Africa and the West Indies.

He later became general sales manager for the firm, with headquarters in South Bend, Indiana. He has served as chairman of the Board of Editors of *Encyclopedia Britannica*, as trustee for the Committee for Economic Development as head of New York campaigns for United China Relief.

According to plans, the one hundred and sixth commencement will be held under the towering oaks of the Fisher Memorial Garden.

In accordance with tradition, the academic procession will form at Palmer Hall and march to the Garden for the exercises, which will conclude with the conferring of degrees and honors.



## Golf and Tennis Squads Make Excellent Records

Southwestern's golf and tennis teams have made big headlines this spring. As the News goes to press on May 1, Coach Bill Maybry's golf team has just won the championship of the Tennessee Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in a meet held at Sewanee. And Coach Derrick Barton's tennis squad has bowled over seven opponents while losing to only two rivals. The baseball and track teams have also had their moments of glory, as will be shown in the next issue of the News.

The golf championship was won by means of a spectacular blazing finish against almost impossible odds. Trailing Sewanee by seventeen strokes after nine holes and apparently beaten, the Lynx surged back to win by eight strokes. The four-man team showed a total of 615 for the thirty-six holes.

The Southwesterners trimmed Sewanee's lead to twelve at the end of round two and played sensationally on the third round. Their cards showed an even par average of thirty-six.

As the final leg got under way, the deficit of seventeen had been cut to one. The boys continued spectacular play and concluded the match with a team total of 615 compared with Sewanee's 623. The other teams were left from forty to ninety-nine strokes in the rear.

Frank Cothran, sophomore from Selma, Alabama, took individual honors at the meet, shooting 146 against the par of 144.

The lowest individual scorer for eighteen holes was Billy McLean of Spring Hill, Alabama, who stroked a brilliant seventy, two under par. Billy's hot streak came on the third and fourth rounds and aided greatly in the Lynx surge.

The other members of the team, Lewis Bledsoe, of Fayetteville, Tennessee, and Russ Schoneberg, of Gulfport, Mississippi, played steadily and ended with totals of 155 and 159. Bledsoe and McLean tied for fourth

place in individual play.

Pat Abbott, widely known golf pro of the Memphis Country Club, coaches golf at Southwestern and aided materially in developing the team.

The record of the tennis team has been almost as brilliant as that of the golf squad. The Lynx have conquered seven opponents out of the nine encountered, including Wash, Emory University, Birmingham-Southern, Ole Miss, and Memphis State.

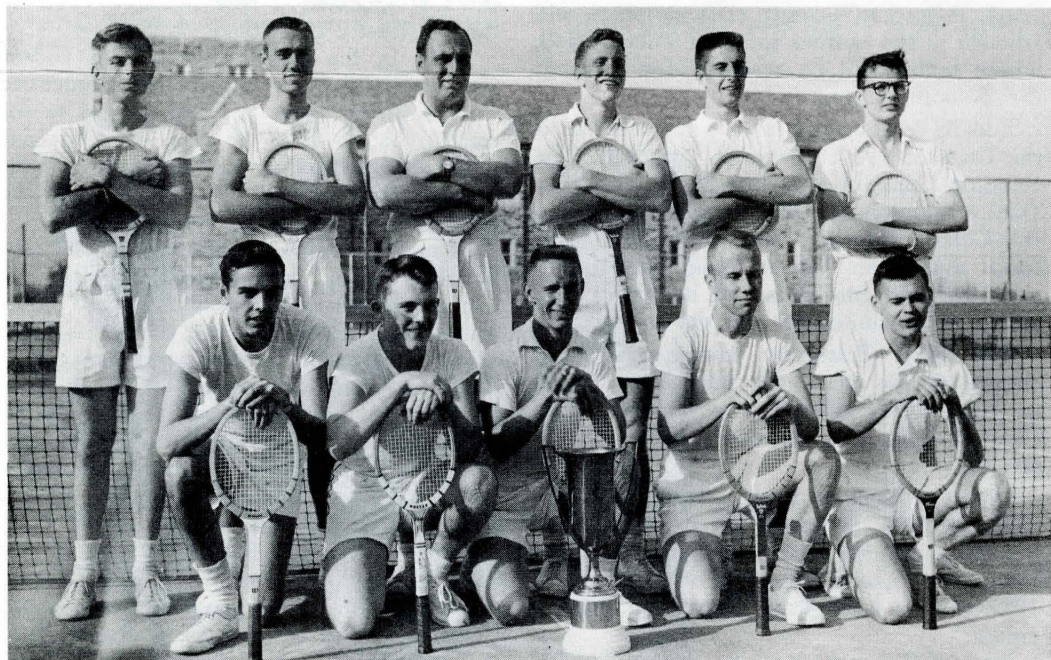

## Cotton Carnival Queens Are Excellent Students

Truth being sometimes stranger than fiction, three reigning ladies in the Cotton Carnival this May were all Southwestern students. Sherrye Patton, as everyone knows, was the Queen of the Carnival, dined and feted throughout the Mid-South. Margaret McKee was the one and only princess to Queen Sherrye, and Beth Etter was the lone princess to the king. All three are, of course, Memphis girls.

It would have been a matter for comment and congratulation if one of the princesses had been a student at Southwestern. It might have been a campus sensation if the two princesses had been students here. But for one college to claim two princesses and the queen—that is something which could hardly happen but did.

Strange as this occurrence is, there is something even more remarkable about these three girls who reigned over the Cotton Carnival with such success. Never before and perhaps never again will the Big Three be honor students in college.

Queen Sherrye, a junior, has a record of six A's for last semester, a mark equaled by only one Southwestern student in a hundred. She has chosen history as her major field. Princess Beth, a sophomore, had four A's, a B, and a C last semester. A chemistry major, she is carrying a rugged course in science. After graduation she expects to study medicine and eventually join her father, Dr. Barton Etter, in the practice of pediatrics. Princess Margaret graduated from Southwestern last spring, but is back in college this year taking two courses. Her record for the last semester of last year was all A's, five of them, a standard which she has also maintained during this year. She is an English major.

Add the grades just given and you get a total of fifteen A's out of a possible seven-

## Rare Volumes Given To Library

Southwestern has recently been given a handsome and rare two-volume set of the St. Dunstan edition of Shakespeare's sonnets. This edition was limited at publication to thirty sets, eighteen distributed in the United States and twelve in Britain.

The volumes are printed on vellum and are hand illuminated on every page by Nestori Leoni and Ross Turner. The green leather binding is excellently designed and tooled by Trautz-Bauzonnet, of Paris. The date of publication is 1901.

Mrs. John Palmer of Shreveport, Louisiana, is the donor of this rare set, which she acquired in England.

She is much interested in travel and particularly in the missionary work of the Presbyterian Church. At present she is on tour in the Near-East.

Her late husband, a doctor who served with the armed forces in World War II, was of the widely known Chicago family which gave its name to Palmer House, of that city.

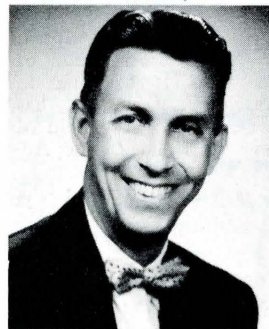

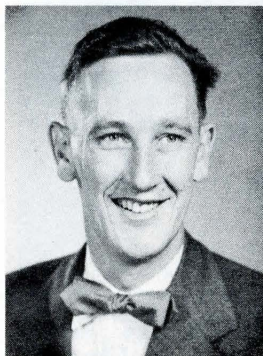
