Where we are:

Our location in Memphis, a vibrant urban center with a strong medical and research presence, provides a range of scholarships and internship opportunities so that our students learn through real-world experience as well as in the classroom. More than 150 internships with local businesses are available each semester; 75% of our students participate in an internship at internationally renowned places such as FedEx and St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital.

What makes Rhodes special

Rhodes College sits on a wooded campus of 100 acres (40.5 hectares). Surrounded by so much natural beauty, our students and faculty are inspired to work together to create a community unmatched in its dedication to learning and to a life of honor both on and off campus. In fact, for more than a century, Rhodes has placed its Honor System at the forefront of student life. Our Honor Code, Social Regulations Code and Commitment to Diversity make for a comfortable, safe and supportive campus environment.

TRANSITION TIP

Just need to talk? Take advantage of the Counseling Center, Faculty Advisors and your residence hall assistant—referred to as your RA. They are there for you.

Rhodes by the numbers

- 1,700 = student body size
- 10:1 = student to faculty ratio
- 13 = average class size
- 95% = number of our faculty with PhD or terminal degree
- 75% = students living on campus all four years
- 4% = percentage of international students in student body
- 99% = law school and business school acceptance rates
- 76% = acceptance to medical school
- 3.74 = average high school GPA*
- 53% = percentage of students ranked in the top 10% of their class*
- 1200 – 1350 = middle 50% range on SAT (Math and Critical Reading scores)
- US \$45,000 = estimated cost in U.S. dollars of tuition, fees, room and board, transportation and personal expenses

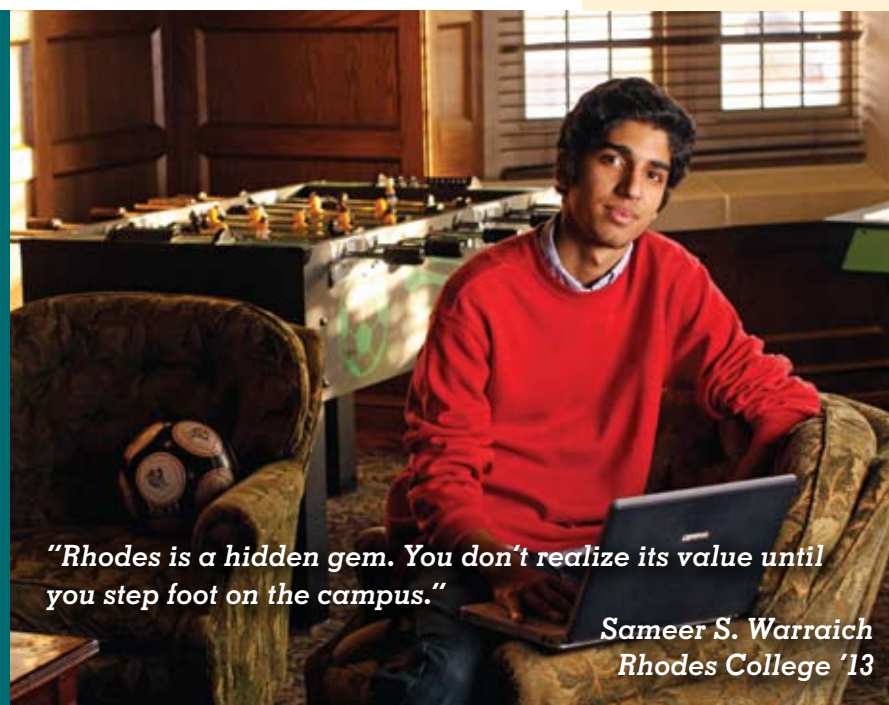

Admission requirements

- Common Application and Rhodes Supplement
- high school transcript
- official score reports from SAT or ACT
- official score reports from TOEFL (For students whose first language is not English, minimum TOEFL score must be 80.)
- letter of recommendation from teacher
- counselor report form
- International Certification of Finances (non US citizens only)
- International CSS Profile (non US citizens only)

Financial Aid/Scholarships

Need help financing your education? At Rhodes College, international students are eligible for financial aid and scholarships ranging from U.S. \$6,000 to U.S. \$34,000 annually. The average financial aid award offered to non-citizens is \$18,500 per year.
