Lord of all, to Thee we raise This our hymn of grate-ful praise.

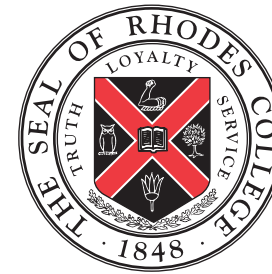
