Dear Sir:

I am authorized by the Executive Committee of the University Board of Directors to accept your proposal to lease the back campus for grazing purposes for three years in order to eradicate the broomsedge.

My understanding is as follows: You are to fence with smooth wire so as to keep the cattle within bounds the back campus except from the old college building to the trees back of it, and the space between and including the drives by the Waddel building and Calvin Hall to the athletic field, and the athletic field itself. You are to pay all expenses of building and maintaining this fence, and of removing it filling the post holes at the expiration of this contract. You are further to pay the University \$20 a year for three years. You are also to be allowed to graze animals in the open space between the drives above mentioned provided they are attended by some one to keep them in bounds. You are also to fence or otherwise keep the cattle off the tennis courts, and to repair any damage done by them. With this understanding I accept your offer to date from March 1<sup>st</sup>., 1910.
