The Friends receive periodic reports on books and the Library, invitations to special campus events, to meetings with special speakers, and to the Friends' annual dinner. The Friends are given borrowing privileges and all other services of the Library which do not conflict with the college program. Extended reference service can be provided only for the faculty and student body because of staff limitations.

There are no fixed dues. The only requirement for membership is a manifestation of interest in books and in the Burrow Library. As evidence of that interest a voluntary annual membership gift of \$2.00 or more is suggested. Contributions in any amount are, of course, welcome and are used to enrich and to extend the usefulness of the Burrow Library.

Through the Friends, the Library seeks information about books and other materials which will serve to augment its holdings and strengthen its services. Most of all, the Friends is a group of men and women deeply concerned with promoting a community interest in books.
