If you travel for pleasure, it will be much more rewarding if you are able to converse with citizens of your host country.

If you travel for business, it's obviously to your advantage to know what's being said around you and be able to communicate your ideas. (Your company will probably underwrite your effort, too.)

Whether you're learning from scratch or just brushing up on a long unused tongue, you can do it pleasantly - as rapidly or as slowly as you like - in a private booth equipped with especially adapted tape recording equipment. You listen, you speak, and then you play back the master voice and your own for comparison.

There is no charge for the course but a nominal service charge is made for the tapes (\$1.00 to \$1.50 each) which may be taken home if desired. Purchase of the text which accompanies the course is recommended but not required.

SOUTHWESTERN INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE CENTER

Study by tapes offered in the center will provide a useful speaking knowledge of the language at a basic level, but not mastery of the language.

For those who want a more intensive study, tutors and night courses (beginning September, 1958) are available.

SERVICES FOR LANGUAGE TEACHERS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Tapes will be prepared in the center for use in schools on specified language materials and texts, at the request of the teachers. These tapes will be recorded by native speakers who are conversational assistants at Southwestern on a cost basis. Average cost is \$2.50 to \$3.00 for a thirty minute tape.

A seminar in the teaching of Spanish (Spanish 132) is offered for teachers as a regular college course with three hours credit, meeting twice weekly at a late afternoon hour to be arranged for the convenience of participants. Teachers get a special rate of \$35 for the semester. The course will be taught by Professor Southard. A similar seminar will be offered in French when there is a sufficient number of teachers interested.
