## State Ready For Surveying Of More Expressway Links

CAT31-57 By JAMES GUNTER City Engineer William B. Fowler notified the City and County Commissions yesterday that the State Highway Department is ready to go ahead with surveys for two more legs of the proposed Memphis expressway system.

The Highway Department recommended that the next links planned be that part of the north-south expressway running from the Mississippi State Line to an intersection with the east-west route (in the vicinity of North Parkway) and the part of the eastwest route which runs from

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
