## Syllabus

### Texts and materials:

Bretz, Dvorak & Kirschner. *Pasajes: Lengua, Cuaderno de práctica.*, Fourth Edition, Boston: McGraw-Hill, 1998. (Students must have access to Pasajes audio cassettes, either by purchasing or at Language Center).  
Mullen and Garganigo. *El cuento hispánico*, Fifth Edition, Boston: McGraw-Hill, 1999  
Blank 60 minute audio cassette (for Journal on tape).

### Objectives.

During this course of Intermediate Spanish, students will review and acquire a deeper understanding of the grammar structures learned in Elementary Spanish. In addition, students will refine skills in reading and listening comprehension, and in verbal and written expression. Students' cultural knowledge of the Spanish-speaking world will be expanded through introduction to a general panorama of cultural expression, including literary pieces appropriate to the level. After completing the course, students will be prepared to enter Advanced Spanish and deal with the more difficult aspects of the language, as well as begin to study and analyze literature and other cultural manifestations.

### Requirements.

*Attendance.* A total of five absences from class or conversation hour is allowed, for any and all reasons, including illness, emergency, participation in extracurricular events (sports, mock trial, etc.). Students who exceed this limit will be penalized by 3.5 points off their final grade (i.e. if your final grade is 70%, it will be reduced to 66.5 for the 6th absence, and so on). It is the student's responsibility to keep track of absences and speak with the professor regarding excessive absences.

*Participation and homework.* Active participation in all class activities is expected and will be a significant part of the grade. In addition to reading and written assignments, students are required to read and prepare the textbook pages prior to each class. As part of the homework grade, students will be graded on their preparation for class activities. Written assignments --including the Workbook/Lab Manual-- must be prepared on time in order for students to effectively participate in class. For this reason, no late work will be accepted. Work is considered late when it is not handed in by 5:00 p.m. on the date it is due.

*Journals on tape.* Students will be required to keep a recorded journal. Three times per

week, students should record one minute or so of commentary on any subject(s). This activity is graded exclusively on completion of the activity three separate times per week, therefore students should not be concerned about correct grammar or pronunciation. Blank audio tapes can be purchased at the Bookstore or acquired in any other fashion. Tapes will be stored at the Language Center for periodic review by the professor, though students can record their entries at the Language Center or a site of their choice. Please write your name in a visible place on the cassette and its case.

*Interactive CD-ROM help.* Several CD-ROM programs are available for practice at the Language Center. These programs can aid in comprehension, culture, grammar and composition skills. Interested students should contact the professor.

*Oral presentations.* Near the end of the semester, each student will give a brief (5 minutes) oral presentation in Spanish. Topics should be related to the culture or history of Spain, Latin America, or the Hispanic population of the U.S.

*Compositions.* Two compositions will be assigned during the semester. Compositions should be two pages in length, typed, double-spaced (500 words). Compositions are graded on content and grammar and make up a significant percentage of the final grade. You should begin work on a composition well in advance of the due date and consult with me for help. NO OUTSIDE HELP IS PERMITTED ON COMPOSITIONS!!

There will be four quizzes, a mid-term exam and a final exam. The information contained in this syllabus is a possible item on quizzes. Though different in length, quizzes and exams will typically share the same general format, with possible sections on Listening Comprehension, Reading Comprehension, Verbal Expression, Written Expression, Grammar Practice and Literature Review. No make-up test will be given without a written document of authentic emergency circumstances.

Students are strongly encouraged to meet with me during office hours or by appointment to work on conversation skills, discuss compositions and oral presentations, or discuss any other matters important to them.
