Since Gov. Orval Faubus of Arkansas attracted world attention to them last September by ordering out the Arkansas National Guard to keep them from entering Central High, these teenagers have become the symbol of the struggle for equal educational opportunity in the South.

Segregationists in and out of Central High have literally and figuratively spat their hate at them. On the other hand, by the raw courage they have shown and by their conduct under the most trying situations they have been admired the world over.
