Wednesday, May 12, 2010 - (Meditation: Luke 9:23-25) God, I want to rest in You, but I pray like I'm in a hurry. I want a strong faith, but I want a religion that costs me very little. I want intimacy with You, but I spend little time with You. I want to be obedient to You, but I keep some areas of my life to handle myself. God, forgive me for wanting to be a Christian on the cheap. Help me to understand that anything worth having is worth sacrificing for. I pray in the name of Jesus, Who gave His all for me. Amen.

Thursday, May 13, 2010 - (Meditation: Galatians 3:22) God, the view that people are essentially good is tempting to believe because I'm an optimist. Believing that people are essentially good makes for good speeches, but Your Word teaches that people, though created in Your image, are sinners, in need of forgiveness, in need of a Savior, in need of salvation. God, may my optimism rest in You, not in wishful thinking.

Friday, May 14, 2010 - (Meditation: Psalm 46:10-11) God, I feel so drained. My boss wants more, my customers want more, my competitors want more, the government wants more. I feel tugged at, leaned on, and used up. I feel like there's nothing left -- no time to give, no caring to give, no self to give. I feel alone, and lonely, and tired.
