MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SOUTHWESTERN PRESBYTERIAN UNIVERSITY HELD AT THE CHISCA HOTEL, MEMPHIS TENNESSEE. FEBRUARY 8, 1922.

The board of Directors of Southwestern Presbyterian University met at the Chisca Hotel, Memphis, at 8:30 A.M. on February 8th, 1922, The following members were present:

Devotional exercises were conducted by President Chas. E. Diehl.

Two members of the Board were absent -- W. T. Hardie, Louisiana, J. T. Fuller, Alabama, and upon motion their excuses were sustained.

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Minutes

Upon motion of Dr. Rennie, the following officers of the corporation were re-elected for the ensuing year:

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Chas. E. Diehl, President B. A. Patch, Secretary C. W. Bailey, Treasurer.

The President read his annual report and the recommendations were referred to the proper committees. The report of the Registrar and the report of the Treasurer were read, both of which were referred to the Finance Committee.

The President announced the death on January 3, 1922, of Major G. W. Macrae, who since 1878 had been a member of this Board. The following resolution, prepared by Mr. W. E. Holt, was presented, and, upon motion of Dr. Alexander, was adopted by a rising vote, and ordered spread upon our Minutes. The President was directed to send to the family a copy of this resolution:

#### IN MEMORIAM.

George Wythe Macrae was a member of the Board of Directors of the Southwestern Presbyterian University at Clarksville, Tennessee, from 1878 until the time of his death. Throughout all these years, he was a most faithful and interested worker.

To those who knew him best he seemed to have been fashioned for an exceptionally useful and honored life. The value of his influence and services on this <sup>B</sup>oard cannot be portrayed in mere words. His attractive personality, his kind words, his unswerving integrity abide with us as a precious memory.

He was one of God's noblemen. He stood four square with all the world, and did what he believed to be right. He was a bulwark of strength for the things which make for good in religious, business and social circles. He was one of the few men whom one would like to see live on forever. But his life work is finished, and on January 3d, 1922, he passed to his eternal reward, his Heavenly Home.

#### Be it Resolved:

That we, the members of the Board of Directors of the Southwestern Presbyterian University, with saddened hearts, adopt and spread this tribute upon our Minutes, and that a copy of this paper be sent to the bereaved family.

Upon motion of Dr. Vance, the Board took recess from 10:30 till 11:45, in order that the Committees might meet and formulate their reports.

#### Minutes #3

The Board re-assembled at 11:45.

The report of the Committee on Honorary Degrees was presented and adopted, and is as follows:

Your Committee recommends/the following honorary degrees be conferred by the Board at the Commencement exercises in June, 1922:

#### Doctor of Divinity

The Rev. Albert Sidney Allen, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, Nashville, Tenn. The Rev. H. M. Moffett, pastor of the Vine Street Presbyterian Church, Birmingham, Ala.

Doctor of Laws The Rev. John Madison Wells, D. D., President of Columbia Theological Seminary, Columbia, South Carolina.

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is as follows:

We have considered the matters referred to us and recommend-

The report of the House Committee was presented and adopted, and

1. That the Board approve the matters recommended by the Faculty which are as follows:

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  - (a) That no fees be remitted to graduate students.
  - (b) That the present Modern Language requirements for the Master's degree be changed to the following- "A reading knowledge of at least one language in addition to English is required, and any department of study may make a specific requirement of French, German, Spanish, or Latin."
  - (c) That the following resolution be adopted with regard to the combined degree of B.S. and M.D.-"That the degree of B.S. be granted to those who have pursued the first three years of the regular Bachelor of Science course at Southwestern Presbyterian University or Memphis College, and who have successfully completed at least ninety-four (94) semester hours of work, and who have then attended a standard medical school and completed the requirements of the first two years of its medical course. The Bachelor of Science degree shall in no case be awarded until formal notification has been received from the medical school that the full requirements of the first two years work have been completed".

2. That the Board rules that the functions of the Dean of the University, with the approval of the President, including the following specific items.

- (a) To pass on the credits of all students seeking to enter the University.
- (b) To exercise disciplinary control of the students, especially in the matter of the violation of University rules.

(c) To have in charge the matter of transferring students to other institutions.

#### Minutes #4

3. That an association of alumni be formed in each Synod, and that said association be asked to meet regularly at the stated meetings of Synod. That one alumnus in each Synod be appointed by the President to constitute this association until it shall elect its own President.

4. That the Board asks the co-operation of the faculty, of the student body, and of the alumni in securing a large number of first-class men for the fresh-man class next year.

5. That the Board put on record its gratification at the excellent work done by the President and Faculty of the University, and of the high moral and religious tone of the student body -- only seven of the students being without church connection. The Board is gratified that the President succeeded in getting the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools of the Southern States to list Southwestern again among its accredited colleges.

6. That Dr. James I. Vance and Dr. R. H. McCaslin be appointed to attend the Presbyterian Educational Association at Montreat in July.

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#### The Finance Committee submits the following-

To your Finance Committee there was referred the report of the Registrar and the report of the Treasurer. These independent reports are in adcordenee. Your Committee acknowledges their receipt, and submits the **Mas** part of the report of the Finance Committee. These reports reveal the fact that the work of the University was so conducted that it was not necessary to borrow from the endowment funds quite as much as the Board had made provision for. Your Committee would make the following recommendations:

lst. That exemption for tuition made to the children of ministers and to the candidates for the ministry shall not be confined to representatives of the Presbyterian Church.

2d. That separate checks on account be sent to our attorneys in accordance with the judgment of the Executive Committee.

3d. That the Treasurer be directed to dispose of investments or securities from time as money is needed up to the amount of the requirements of the adopted budget, so as to leave a reasonable working balance on hand at all times in order that any overcheck may be avoided.

4th. That the Board deems it proper and necessary as speedily as possible to get the University on the budget of the churches of each Synod, that to this end it appoint as chairman for each Synod who shall plan for and prosecute this appeal before his Synod for the definite percentage asked by the Board from his Synod.

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Alabama - George Lang, Chairman, 5% of the 40% apportioned for Synodical causes, or 2% of the total benevolences.

Louisiana - W. McF. Alexander, Chairman, 10% of the 40% apportioned for Synodical causes, or 4% of the total benevolences.

Mississippi - A. A. Little, Chairman, 5% of the 40% apportioned for Synodical causes, or 2% of the total benevolences.

Tennessee - James I. Vance, <sup>Chairman</sup>, 30% of the 40% apportioned for Synodical causes, or 12% of the total benevolences.

5th. That the following budget be adopted for 1922.
