MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF SOUTHWESTERN PRESBYTERIAN UNIVERSITY HELD AT THE CHISCA HOTEL MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE, JANUARY 30th, 1923.

The Board of Directors of Southwestern Presbyterian University met in regular session at the Chisca Hotel, Memphis, at four P.M., January 30th, 1923. The following members were present:

The meeting was opened with prayer by President Chas. E. Diehl. Four members of the Board were absent -- W. E. Holt, Tennessee, and all three members from Alabama -- W. R. Dobyns, Joseph Dunglinson, and J. T. Fuller. The reasons for their absences were presented, and upon motion, their excuses were sustained.

The changes in the personnel of the Board were noted: For Louisiana-John Glassell in place of H. M. McLain, and D. M. Pipes, alternate to W. T. Hardie.

For Alabama-W. R. Dobyns in place of George Lang, and Joseph Dunglinson in place of Robert H. McCaslin.

The President read his annual report and the recommendations were referred to the proper Committees. The Report of the Registrar and the Report of the Treasurer were read, both of which were referred to the Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Dr. Little, the Board took recess in order that the Committees might meet and formulate their reports.

The Board re-assembled at 5:30. The report of the Committee on Honorary Degrees was presented and adopted, and is as follows:

Your Committee recommends that the following honorary degrees be conferred by the Board at the Commencement Exercises in June, 1923:

DOCTOR OF LAWS
Charles Patrick Joseph Mooney, Editor
of the Commercial Appeal, Memphis, Tenn.
Henry Hayes Sweets, Executive Secretary
of Christian Education, Louisville, Kentucky.

DOCTOR OF DIVINITY
The Reverend William Munro Clark, Chunju, Korea.
The Reverend Samuel G. Craig, St. Davids, Pennsylvania.
The Reverend S. W. McGill, Louisville, Kentucky.

The report of the House Committee was presented and adopted, and is as follows:

We have considered the matters referred to us and recommend the adoption of the following resolutions:

- (1) That Professor Arrowood be granted a leave of absence for one year, that \$400 be advanced to him on the salary of the next year, and that the President be authorized to secure some one to discharge the duties of his professorship in his absence.
- (2) That, if it appeared desirable to them, Professors C. L. Townsend and M. H. Townsend be granted a leave of absence for one year, and that any resulting faculty adjustments, or any other faculty changes deemed necessary, be left to the Executive Committee with power to act.
- (3) That it is the sense of the Board that the office of Dean requires full time service.
- (4) That the Secretary of the Board be directed to write a letter to Professor R. C. Beale, thanking him in behalf of the Board for his service in getting out the General Catalogue and Alumni Directory.

- (5) That it is the hope of the Board of Directors that as many members of the Board as can do so will attend the meetings of their Synods in the interests of the University.
- (6) That the President be requested to keep in touch with Woman's Auxiliaries, Young People's Societies and Sunday Schools in an endeavor to enlist their hearty co-operation in the work of the University.
- (7) That the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors be held on the last Tuesday of January.
- (8) That the arrangements for celebrating the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of Southwestern Presbyterian University be left in the hands of the Executive Committee with power to act.
- (9) That in regard to the transfer of the registered bond of \$1000 given by Professor T. H. Somerville, the President and Secretary of this Board are authorized to fill out blank No.2406 as directed by the United States Government.

The Finance Committee through its C hairman submitted the following report, which was adopted:

Your Committee would make the following recommendations concerning the items referred to us from the President's report:

- (1) That we do not recommend additional expenditures at this time for the care and beautifying of the grounds.
- (2) That we recommend an appropriation of \$2800 for athletics in the budget for 1923.
- (3) That we recommend that separate accounts for travel be kept, that items for travel pertaining to Southwestern be chargeable to that fund, and that items of travel pertaining to Southwestern Presbyterian University be paid out of the apportionment made in this budget.
- (4) That the President of the University be directed to send a check for \$500 on account to each of our attorneys.
- (5) That the following budget be adopted for 1923:
