The Southwestern Singers is the concert choir of Southwestern At Memphis, a liberal arts college. The choir took its first tour in 1938 and has presented its tour programs in churches, schools and during the war years in military training camps. It has made appearances with the Memphis Symphony as well as the St. Louis Symphony, and participated this year in the Southeastern Choral Conductors Conference, singing the Mozart **Grand Mass**, K. 427, and Stravinsky's **Canticum Sacrum**. The Singers are engaged twice annually for television programs and present a Christmas program, as well as a spring vesper service. They performed Geoffrey Bush's **Christmas Cantata** on December 14, 1967, and will perform **Cantata Misericordium** by Benjamin Britten on April 28, 1968. The Christmas program for 1968, set for December 12, will be J. S. Bach's **Magnificat**.

Mr. Tony Lee Garner, in his first year as conductor of the Singers, was graduated from Southwestern. He received his choral training from Dr. Isaac Van Grove, composer and former conductor of the Chicago and American Opera Companies. Mr. Garner has been Chorus Master and has sung leading roles at Inspiration Point Fine Arts Colony, Eureka Springs, Arkansas for three concert seasons, and has been engaged as Chorus Master and Conductor for the 1968 season.

Mr. David Ramsey, the choir's accompanist, was also graduated from Southwestern and the School of Sacred Music, Union Theological Seminary, New York. He serves as campus organist, teaches the church music courses at Southwestern, and is organist and choir-master at the Church of the Holy Communion in Memphis.
