The Rhodes Singers tonight share holiday music and the warmth of the season in the annual campus Christmas concert. Last night they presented the ninth annual 'Christmas at St. Mary's concert at St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral, in a festival including the Music Academy Children's Chorus, bell choirs, a recorder choir, brass and organ. The December 3 presentation of Ralph Vaughan Williams's 'Hodie' at Evergreen Presbyterian Church was the fourth consecutive year for this music, as the Singers, augmented by alumni, members of the Rhodes Mastersingers Chorale, and area high school honors choir members, joined forces with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra and the Music Academy Children's Chorus.

Professor Tony Lee Garner became conductor of the Singers in 1967. In addition to holding the conducting post, he is Chair of the Music and Theatre departments, Artistic Director of the McCoy Theatre, Conductor of the Rhodes Mastersingers Chorale, and Director of Music at Evergreen Presbyterian Church.

Professor David Ramsey is the associate conductor and accompanist. He is Organist-in-Residence on campus, in wide demand as a concert artist and accompanist, and Director of Music and Organist at St. John's United Methodist Church.

Two campus instrumental ensembles join the Singers in tonight's concert. Ruth Ann McClain is Adjunct Instructor of Flute. She received both undergraduate and graduate degrees in music from the University of Memphis, where she also taught before coming to Rhodes. Many of her students have earned outstanding honors and awards, including winners in the Tennessee Governor's School for the Arts Concerto Competition and the Memphis Youth Symphony Concerto Competition.

Sara Chiego is Adjunct Instructor of Double Bass, having obtained her Masters degree in music from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. She is currently the Assistant Principal Bassist for the Memphis Symphony Orchestra and the Opera Memphis Orchestra.
