## Course Description

This course is the third and final section that teaches the fundamentals of the Latin language. Although the primary goal of the elementary sequence of courses (Latin 101-201) is to prepare students to use Latin documents in a wide variety of academic contexts, students in this course will develop all four language skills: reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

## Course Objectives

- To gain knowledge of the essential forms, grammar, syntax, and basic vocabulary of the Latin language.
- To gain the ability to read, speak, understand, and translate both adapted and un-adapted passages in Latin.
- To become acquainted with daily life and culture of the ancient Romans and to recognize and understand the values and social attitudes of the ancient Romans which are embedded in their language.

**Students are expected to complete all assignments on time, and to spend quality time every day in reading and reviewing grammar, syntax, and vocabulary.**
