Thursday, June 11, 2009 -- (Meditation: I Corinthians 15:55-57) O God, when I meditate on the cross, help me to see the Creator of the universe hanging there, rejected and despised. Help me to see the blood on His brow from sharp thorns, the blood on His side from a sharp sword, and the blood on His hands and feet from sharp nails. My need to be right, to defend myself, and to be in control erode careful hearing, new understanding, and spontaneous intuition. God, still my need to control, to justify, to dominate.
