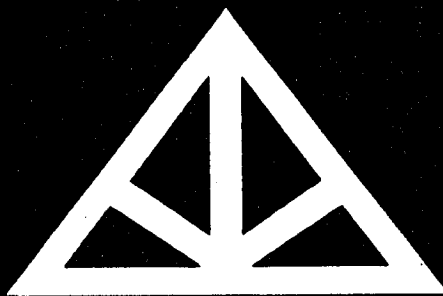

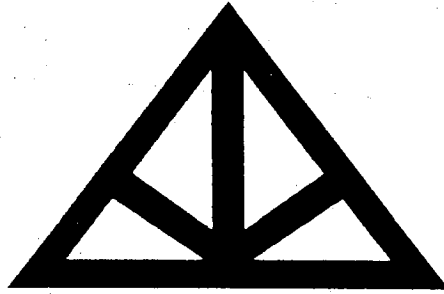

Who's Who

The McCoy Theatre is deeply grateful to the artists who have contributed so generously of their time and talents to this concert.

Kemper Durand (percussion) has set the beat for several McCoy productions, including *Cowardy Custard* and six previous Benefit Concerts. If you ever need a lawyer with a great sense of rhythm, Kemper is your man.

Kent Fleshman returns to the McCoy after last spring's Cole Porter Revue and last fall's production of *Company*. He has been seen on other Memphis stages in *I Do, I Do*, *Kiss Me Kate*, *My Fair Lady*, *Assassins*, and *She Loves Me*.

Bryan Ford, stage manager for the Benefit Concert, is no stranger to the McCoy. As a student, he appeared in *Nicholas Nickleby*, *Cowardy Custard*, *On the Razzle* and *The Miss Firecracker Contest*. He appeared later in *Company* and on other stages in *Godspell* and *She Loves Me*.

Barry Fuller has appeared in several of the Benefits and has directed many of the McCoy's most memorable shows: *Company*, *Candide* (twice), *Sweeney Todd*, *Nicholas Nickleby*, *The Gondoliers*, *Little Mary Sunshine*, *The Robber Bridegroom*, and *Merrily We Roll Along*.

Tony Lee Garner is Artistic Director of the McCoy Theatre, Chairman of Rhodes' departments of theatre and music and conductor of the Rhodes College Singers. His on-stage contributions at the McCoy range from performer in *Little Mary Sunshine*, *Sweeney Todd*, *Nicholas Nickleby*, *The School for Scandal* and all Benefit Concerts to musical director for *Carnival*, *Cowardy Custard*, *Beyond Therapy*, *On the Razzle*, *Anyone Can Whistle*, *Cabaret* and *Company*.

Frankie Grace (bass) has played "in the pit" of a host of musicals in the city. She has played in all seven of the previous Benefit Concerts at the McCoy as well as in our production of *Cabaret*.

Jude Knight is well-known as a leading lady in Theatre Memphis musicals: *Kismet*, *My Fair Lady*, *Oh Coward!*, *Camelot*, *A Little Night Music*, *The Sound of Music*, *Brigadoon* and *She Loves Me*. At the McCoy, she has appeared in six previous Benefit Concerts and *The Mound Builders*.

Kym Nelson (piano) has been musical director for *The Fantasticks* and keyboardist for *Cabaret* and *Company*. Kym is the Coordinator of Programming at WMC-TV5.

Ann Sharp has been seen in all Benefit Concerts at the McCoy as well as in *Sweeney Todd*, *The Gondoliers*, *Anyone Can Whistle*, *On the Razzle*, *Candide II* and *Company*. She performs frequently at Theatre Memphis, most recently in the musicals *Into The Woods* and *I Do, I Do*.

Bennett Wood is known to Memphis theatre audiences as both actor and director. At the McCoy, he has directed *The Tempest*, *The Mound Builders*, and seven Benefit Concerts. On our stage he has appeared in *The Gondoliers*, *Nicholas Nickleby*, *The Robber Bridegroom*, and *The School for Scandal*. Whether he is performing or directing, his love of theatre is matched by his pursuit of excellence in all undertakings.
